

# MACINROY

## OF LUDE

**JAMES MACINROY OF LUDE**, was a successful Merchant in Demerara and Glasgow and purchased the lands of Lude in 1821. He *m.* at Glasgow on 25 December 1797, to Elizabeth, daughter of William Moore, St Eustatia,<sup>1</sup> *d.* at Lude on 12 July 1825,<sup>2</sup> and was father of :

1. James Patrick MacInroy of Lude, (*see below*).
2. William MacInroy of The Burn, *b.* at Glasgow on 28 August 1804, served in the army for a time attaining the rank of Major in the 91<sup>st</sup> Regiment. He purchased the lands of Burn, in the Mearns, in 1836, *m.* on 29 January 1839, to Harriet Barbara, daughter of Elias Isaacs, Banker, (she *d.* on 2 July 1890). He *dsp* at The Burn on Wednesday on 29 April 1896,<sup>3</sup> having left his estate to his nephew Charles MacInroy, son of his brother James Patrick MacInroy.
3. Charles Hagart MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 21 June 1810, and *d.* in 1819.
4. Adriana MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 26 January 1803, and *m.* at Lude on 10 September 1826, to Sir John MacDonald, 5<sup>th</sup> of Dalchosnie,<sup>4</sup> (*c/m* 8 December 1826. He *d.* on 24 June 1866), and had issue.
6. Elizabeth MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 10 January 1801, and *d.* young.
7. Elizabeth MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 20 May 1808, and *m.* at Lude on 5 January 1830, to Major William Fraser, 91<sup>st</sup> Regiment.<sup>5</sup>

**JAMES PATRICK MACINROY OF LUDE**, *b.* at Glasgow on 17 October 1799, became a Merchant and was served heir to his father in the baronies of Ashintullie and Pitcairns, both in Perthshire, on 24 November 1826. He *m.* at Glasgow on 9 April 1822, to

Margaret Seton, daughter of David Lillie, Merchant in Glasgow,<sup>1</sup> (she *d.* at Stirling on 28 April 1879<sup>2</sup>), *d.* at Lude on 11 October 1878,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

1. James MacInroy, *m.* at Edinburgh on 10 August 1858, to Madeline, eldest daughter of Rev. A. Campbell, of Croy,<sup>4</sup> (she *d.* at Stirling on 30 May 1907<sup>5</sup>). He *d.* at Bridge of Allan on 17 April 1909,<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

1a) Charlotte Gertrude Campbell MacInroy, *b.* on 2 June 1859, and *d.* unmarried at Bridge of Allan on 15 April 1913.<sup>7</sup>

1a) Jemima Patrick MacInroy, *b.* on 13 October 1860.

1a) Madeline MacInroy, *b.* on 9 June 1862.

2. William MacIntory of Lude, (*see below*).

3. David MacInroy, *b.* at Lude on 27 July 1831, and *d.* at San Jorge, Banda Oriental, on 23 March 1868.

4. Charles MacInroy of The Burn, *b.* at Lude on 3 March 1838, and served in the Civil Service at Madras. He succeeded his uncle William MacInroy in his estate of The Burn, on his death in 1896, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 2 July 1862, to Emelia Katherine, daughter of Alexander Hamilton, W.S. He *d.* on 4 February 1919,<sup>8</sup> and was father of :

4a) Alastair Hamilton MacInroy, *b.* at Secunderabad, India, on 13 July 1863.

4a) Charles Alan MacInroy, *b.* at Bangalore, India, on 21 July 1867.

4a) Maud Kathleen MacInroy, *b.* at Edinburgh on 19 September 1869.

4a) Mabel Edith MacInroy, *b.* in 1872 and *d.* at Ootacdamund, India, on 13 September 1874.

5. Henry MacInroy, *b.* at Lude on 1 December 1841, and *d.* at Colorado on 12 June 1902.

6. Patrick MacInroy, *b.* at Lude on 16 July 1845, and *m.* at Oaklands Hill, Douglas County, Colorado, on 23 December 1872, to Amelia Anne, youngest daughter of H. H. Curtis.<sup>9</sup> He *d.* at Pueblo, Colorado, on 12 November 1882.

7. Margaret MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 28 March 1824, and *m.* on 25 October 1858, to Archibald Hepburn Mitchelson, Old Faskally.<sup>1</sup>
8. Elizabeth MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 22 August 1826, and *m.* at Lude on 29 April 1849, to John Hay, second son of James Hay of Seggieden.<sup>2</sup>
9. Henrietta Caroline MacInroy, *b.* at Glasgow on 13 June 1828, and *d.* unmarried at Sonamore, Pitlochry, on 15 January 1898.<sup>3</sup>
10. Jemima Ross MacInroy, *b.* at Lude on 24 September 1833, and *m.* at Lude on 25 July 1861, to John Holman Hay, of the Admiralty.<sup>4</sup>

**WILLIAM MACINROY OF LUDE**, *b.* in 1830, *m.* at Southport on 6 August 1856, to Debonnaire Fleetwood, third daughter of Rev. Charles Hesketh, Rector of North Meols.<sup>5</sup> He *d.* on 10 February 1916, in his 87<sup>th</sup> year<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

1. James Patrick Hesketh MacInroy, younger of Lude, *c.* at North Meols, Lancashire, on 6 August 1857, and *d.* on 31<sup>st</sup> January 1900, from drowning when out walking at Ben-y-Gloe.<sup>7</sup>
2. Charles Hesketh MacInroy, *b.* on 6 November 1861, and *d.* at Spokane, USA, on 8 November 1910.
3. Georgiana Adeladie MacInroy, *c.* at North Meols on 30 March 1859, and *d.* unmarried at Lude on 10 December 1918.<sup>8</sup>
4. Debonnaire Fleetwood MacInroy, *b.* in 1863, and *d.* unmarried at Kinnaird House in 1946.
5. Nora Esme MacInroy, *c.* at North Meols on 5 May 1864, and *d.* unmarried at Lude on 10 November 1924.<sup>9</sup>
6. Lilian Alice MacInroy, *b.* in 1870.
7. Rose Evelyn MacInroy, *c.* at North Meols on 18 July 1865, and *m.* at Kilmaveonaig on 6 July 1905, to Aubrey Keith Alston Stewart of Urrard, (he *d.* at Lude House on 1 May 1925).
