OF BALVAIRD & SCONE

SIR ANDREW MORAY, 1ST OF ARNGASK AND BALVAIRD, *m.* prior to 3 February 1499, to Margaret, daughter and heiress of James Barclay of Balvaird and Kippo, with whom he obtained these lands and had a charter for the Crown lands of Lettirbannochy in 1502. He was father of :

1. Sir David Murray, 2nd of Arngask, (*see below*).
2. Margaret Murray, *m.* in around 1526, William Moncrieff of that Ilk, (he *d.* on 15 December, 1579), and had issue.

SIR DAVID MURRAY, 2ND OF ARNGASK, in whose favour his mother resigned her lands of Arngask, Kippo, Arncork, Pittilloche, Condland, Gosperty, Heicham, Laithame, Forgy, Binn, Catoichill, Balvaird, with the Manor and Mill thereof, the quarter-part lands of Mureton of Tentsmure, the Halery, Wilkinstoun, Carlhurly, Lochtoun and the Mill of Kippo, which were erected into a Barony by King James IV. on 21 January, 1508.¹ He *m.* Janet, daughter of John Lindsay, eldest son and heir of Patrick, 4th Lord Lindsay of the Byres, *d.* in 1549/50² and was father of :

1. **SIR ANDREW MURRAY, 3RD OF ARNGASK**, succeeded his father and had Sasine for the lands of Letterbannochy on 9 December 1553, which had then been in the King's hands for the space of three years.³ He *m.* firstly, Margaret, daughter of John Ross, 5th of Craigie, from whom he was divorced by decree dated 24 April 1547⁴ ; and secondly, in 1542, Janet, daughter of William Graham, 2nd Earl of Montrose. *d.* prior to July of 1573, and was father of :

1a) **SIR ANDREW MURRAY OF BALVAIRD**, succeeded his father and was appointed a Gentleman of the Bedchamber of King James VI. He *m.* Margaret, daughter of John Crichton of Strathurd, (*c/m* at Ruthven 23 July, 1573.¹ She *m.* secondly, Mungo Murray of Denork, by whom she had issue), *d.* on 13 November, 1590,² and had issue :

1b) **SIR ANDREW MURRAY OF BALVAIRD**, succeeded his father and granted an annualrent of 600 merks from the lands of Kippo in favour of Margaret Crichton, his mother, Sir Mungo Murray of Claremont, her spouse, and William Murray, their eldest son on 19 October, 1611. He *m.* Katherine, daughter of Sir William Menteith of Kerse, (*c/m* at Edinburgh 19 April, 1600³), and *dsp* on 14 December, 1624.

1b) Agnes Murray, *m.* Mungo Murray, 1st of Denork and Claremont, son of John Moray, 1st Earl of Tullibardine (he *m.* secondly in 1639 to Anne, daughter of John, 1st Earl of Wemyss, and *dsp* in March of 1642), and *dsp* on 13 May, 1639.

1b) Margaret Murray, *m.* on 17 October, 1598, to William Morton of Cambo, *d.* in August of 1620,⁴ and had issue.

1a) Sir David Murray, of Gospertie, 1st Lord Scone & Viscount Stormont, appointed Master of the King's Stable and Comptroller to King James VI. and was retoured heir to his brother Sir Patrick Murray in the lands of Drumcairn and Binn on 5 June, 1606. He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of James Bethune, 6th of Creich (*c/m* 4, 6 and 10 February, 1604.⁵ She *d.* on 21 January, 1658), and *dsp* on 27 August, 1631.

1a) Sir Patrick Murray of Genies, appointed Lieutenant of the King's Guard and had a charter for the lands of Binn from Thomas Hamilton of Drumcairn, Advocate to King James VI., which, for good and faithful service rendered to the King, were erected into a Barony on 9 June, 1602. He was knighted by this Monarch, had a charter for the lands of Ferne, in Ross Shire, on 28 February, 1601, and *m.* on 1 July, 1598, Isabel, daughter of John Brown of Fordell, (she *m.* secondly by *c/m* 25 October and 13 November, 1605,⁶ Sir George Erskine of Innerteil, and had issue ; and *d.* in October of 1639⁷). He *d.* at Binn on 28 June, 1603,¹ and had issue,

1b) Catherine Murray, *d.* young.

1b) Margaret Murray, a natural daughter who *m.* William Spense, Servant to Lord Scone.

1a) Robert Murray, granted the benefice of Dunkeld by King James VI. and is styled as brother to Andrew Murray of Arngask when he was witness to a charter by Alexander Hay of Ardeth granting to the said Andrew Murray the lands of Ardeth on 31 October, 1578. He was granted the vacant Archdeanery of Aberdeen by King James VI. on 23 October 1584,² *d.* prior to 2 April, 1617, and had issue,

1b) David Murray of Middleton of Balbegie, a natural son.

1a) Elizabeth Murray, *m.* David Balfour of Balledmont (*c/m* 1 September 1572³).

2. William Murray, 1st of Lettirbannochy, (*see below*).

3. David Murray, 1st of Ardeth, granted a renunciation of the lands of Inchgall the fee of which had pertained to himself and the liferent to Janet Lindsay, relict of Sir David Murray of Arngask, his mother, to Andrew Wardlaw of Torrie on 20 June, 1598, and served as Parish Clerk of Abernethy. He was one of the executors of his father, *m.* Margaret Kirkcaldy, and was father of,

3a) William Murray, 2nd of Ardeth, appointed Minister of Craill in 1597 and *m.* firstly, Janet, daughter of David Moncrieff, of Tibbermalloch, (she was widow of Andrew Moncrieff, Minister of Craill, and *d.* in August of 1623). He *m.* secondly, Helen Wood and was father of,

3b) Janet Murray, *dsp* prior to 1625.

3b) Margaret Murray, *m.* William Myreton of Pitollie.

3a) Janet Murray, *m.* John Stretton, Minister of Foulis, (*c/m* 19 and 20 July, 1602,).

3a) Helen Murray, *m.* John Christison, Burgess of Dysart.

4. Robert Murray,

WILLIAM MURRAY, 1ST OF LETTIRBANNOCHY, had a charter from his elder brother Sir Andrew Murray, in recognition of his good and faithful counsel and services rendered and to be rendered, for the lands of Lettirbannochy on 14 January, 1553.⁴ He was a personal servant to Queen Mary and from whom, for his good service, he and his wife had a charter for the quarter-part Crown lands of Drumphingalle previously held by John Henry, son of the deceased David Henry, and resigned in favour of William, on 4 March,

1565. He had a charter from William, 2nd Lord Ruthven, for the lands of South-Kinkell previously occupied by Henry Black, on 1 November, 1573, *m.* Barbara, daughter of David Pitcairn of Pitcairn, (Papal Dispensation dated 5 February, 1557¹), and *d.* on 6 March, 1589.² He was father of :

1. David Murray, 2nd of Lettirbannochy, Kippo and Balgony, (*see below*).
2. Andrew Murray, witness to a charter in 1579.
3. Elizabeth Murray, *m.* Alexander Tosheoch, younger of Monzievaird, (*c/m* 29 November 1576³).
4. Bethia Murray, *m.* by 26 October, 1582, William Murray, 6th of Ochertyre, and had issue
5. Margaret Murray, *m.* Alexander Balcancoul, younger of that Ilk, son and heir of Andrew Balcancoul of that Ilk, by whom she was infert in a liferent of the lands of Balcancoul in implementation of a contract of marriage on 4 November, 1581.⁴
6. Christian Murray, *m.* Henry Kinross, portioner of Camuschinnie, son of Malcolm Kinross, (*c/m* at Falkland on 6 July 1591), and had issue.

DAVID MURRAY, 2ND OF LETTIRBANNOCHY, KIPPO AND BALGONY, succeeded his father and resigned the lands of South Kinkell in favour of John Murray in Balgowre in 1594. He granted his share of the lands of Drumphingalle to Patrick Graham of Inchbraikie in 1598, and *m.* Agnes, daughter of William Moncrieff, younger of that Ilk. He resigned his lands of Lettirbannochy to his cousin Andrew Murray of Balvaird on 19 November, 1599, *d.* in 1627 and was father of :

1. Gilbert Murray, of Binn, styled as eldest son and apparent heir of his father in a charter by himself and his father for the lands of Techindad, in the Barony of Moncrieff, in favour of Andrew Scott, Merchant Burgess of Edinburgh, on 31 August and 21 October, 1612. He was served heir provisional to his kinsman Sir Mungo Murray of Drumcairn in the lands and Lordship of Balquhidder on 26 January, 1619, and *dsp.*
2. Sir Andrew Murray, 1st Lord Balvaird, (*see below*).
3. David Murray, served heir provisional to his brother Gilbert Murray in the Barony of Binn on 3 November, 1625.¹

4. William Murray of Drumcairn, served heir provisional to his brother Gilbert Murray in the Barony of Binn on 3 November, 1625, and had a charter from this brother for the lands of Bin comprising the lands of Balbin and Drumcairn on 19 December, 1635.² He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Michael Balfour of Denmiln, (*c/m* 18 June, 1636³), *d.* by August of 1663 and had issue,
- 4a) Andrew Murray of Binn, retoured heir to his father in the lands of Bin on 25 August, 1663, and *dsp* prior to 11 May, 1677.
 - 4a) Jean Murray, *m.* on 29 December, 1657, John Rigg, Minister of Strathmiglo, and *d.* in July of 1711.
 - 4a) Katherine Murray, *m.* firstly, Alexander Watson of Dumbrae, and secondly at Edinburgh on 1 January, 1673, her cousin Sir John Murray, of Drumcairn, (he *d.* in around 1704), and had issue.
 - 4a) Marjory Murray, all of whom were served heir portioners of their brother Andrew Murray of Binn on 11 May, 1677.
5. Christian Murray, *m.* in September of 1635, John Brown of Fordell, (he *m.* secondly by *c/m* 11 February, 1648, Maria, daughter of Sir John Scott of Rossie, and had issue). Her brothers Sir Andrew Murray, Gilbert and William raised an action against this John for the surrender of 8,000 merks granted to him as Tocher on 20 November, 1636.⁴ She *dsp* in April of 1636.⁵
6. Katherine Murray, *m.* John Arnot of Friarton.

SIR ANDREW MURRAY, 1ST LORD BALVAIRD, served heir provisional to the lands and Lordship of Balquhiddier by his kinsman Sir Mungo Murray of Drumcairn on 26 January, 1619, and whom he eventually succeeded in these lands. He was created Lord Balvaird by King Charles I. on 14 November, 1641, and *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of David Carnegie, 1st Earl of Southesk, (*c/m* 30 April, 1628). He *d.* on 24 September, 1644,⁶ and was father of :

1. David Murray, 2nd Lord Balvaird, (*see below*).

2. Andrew Murray, 1st of Pitlochrie & Murrayshall, obtained the lands of Pitlochrie from his elder brother David Murray in 1645 as part of a provision made by his father and acquired those of Murrayshall, near Scone, (*see Murray of Murrayshall*).
3. James Murray, qualified as a Doctor of Medicine in which capacity he was employed in Perth and *m.* Helen Stewart. He *d.* in 1682 and had issue,
 - 3a) Jean Murray, *m.* Dr. Robert Carmichael of Balmblae, (*c/m* 30 September, 1697. He *d.* on 5 March 1722), and *d.* on 8 November 1708. They had issue.
4. Sir John Murray of Drumcairn, succeeded to these lands and was created a Lord of Session on 1 November, 1681, in which office he continued until the Revolution of 1688/89. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 1 January, 1673, his cousin Katherine, daughter of William Murray of Drumcairn, (she was widow of Alexander Watson of Dumbrae,), and *d.* in around 1704. He was father of,
 - 4a) John Murray of Drumcairn, infeft in his father's lands in 1704 and *dsp* in February of 1739 following which Lord Stormont was served his heir.
 - 4a) Elizabeth Murray, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 19 December, 1676, and *m.* Francis Stewart, Earl of Moray, (he *m.* secondly, Jean, second daughter of John Elphinstone, 4th Lord Balmerino, and *d.* at Donibristle on 11 December, 1739). They had no surviving issue.
 - 4a) Catherine Murray, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 22 April, 1679.
5. William Murray, styled as brother to "*my Lord Viscount Stormont*" when he was one of the Godfathers to William, son of David Murray, Bailie of Perth and Sarah Murray, on 1 October, 1667. He was admitted a Member of the Faculty of Advocates on 31 January, 1665, and was buried in Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 8 February, 1685.
6. Catherine Murray, *d.* unmarried.
7. Barbara Murray, *m.* at Kinnoul on 25 January, 1664, Patrick, 9th Lord Gray, (he *d.* in January of 1711), and had issue.
8. Marjory Murray, *m.* on 10 June, 1651, Sir Alexander Gibson of Durie, (he *d.* at Durie on 6 August, 1661) and *d.* at Perth on 6 August, 1667. They had issue.

DAVID MURRAY, 2ND LORD BALVAIRD, served heir to his father on 28 February, 1654, and succeeded to the honours of Stormont upon the death of James Murray, Earl of Annandale, in 1658. He had his lands erected into the Viscounty of Stormonth on 22 August, 1666, and *m.* at Kinnaird on 9 August, 1659, Elizabeth, eldest daughter of James Carnegie, 2nd Earl of Southesk, (she was widow of James Murray, 2nd Earl of Annandale). He *d.* on 24 July, 1668, and was father of,

1. David Murray, 5th Viscount Stormont, (see below).

2. Catherine Murray, *m.* William Keith, 2nd Earl of Kintore, (*c/m* at Holyroodhouse on 8 August, 1687. He *d.* on 5 December, 1718), and had issue.
3. Amelia Murray, *d.* unmarried.

DAVID MURRAY, 5TH VISCOUNT STORMONT, served heir male to his father on 7 October, 1668. He *m.* Marjory, only child of David Scott of Scottstarvet, by his first wife Nicholas, only daughter and heiress of Sir Robert Greirson of Lagg by his wife Margaret, daughter and coheiress of Sir James Murray of Cockpool, (*c/m* 31 January, 1668. She *d.* at Scone on 8 April, 1746), with whom he obtained the lands of Comlongon, in Dumfriesshire. He *d.* on 19 November, 1731, and had issue :

1. David Murray, 6th Viscount Stormont, (*see below*).
2. James Murray, *c.* at Kilrennie on 13 February, 1691, and was admitted an Advocet on 14 February, 1710. He was an active Jacobite and on the outbreak of the uprising of 1715 he was ordered to surrender himself although he ignored this and served in the army of the exiled King James VIII. He afterwards settled in France, was created Earl of Dunbar, Viscount of Drumcairn and Lord Hadykes in the Jacobite Peerage on 2 February, 1721, and was invested as a Knight of the Thistle on 31 December, 1725. He *dsp* at Avignon in August of 1770.
3. John Murray, who *d.* young.
4. William Murray, 1st Earl of Mansfield, *b.* at Scone Palace on 2 March, 1705, and was admitted an Advocate in 1730. He held the office of Speaker of the House of Lords and was created Earl of Mansfield on 31 October, 1776, to himself and his heirs-male, whom failing, to Louisa, wife of his nephew and heir, David, Viscount Stormont, and the lawful heirs-male of her body by this husband. He *m.* at Raby Castle, Durham, on 20 September, 1738, Elizabeth, daughter of Daniel Finch, Earl of Winchelsea and Nottingham, (she *d.* on 10 April 1784), and *dsp* at Caen Wood, Middlesex, on 20 March 1793.
5. Charles Murray, who *dsp*.
6. Robert Murray, who *dsp*.
7. Catherine Murray, *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 25 November 1754.
8. Elizabeth Murray, *d.* unmarried.
9. Marjory Murray, *m.* Colonel John Hay of Cromlix.
10. Amelia Murray, *m.* Sir Alexander Lindsay of Evelick, (*c/m* 22 & 28 April 1720), *d.* on 18 February 1774, and had issue.
11. Margaret Murray, *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on Monday 18 April 1785.
12. Jean Murray, *d.* unmarried on 10 August 1758.

13. Nicolas Helen, *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 7 November 1777.

14. Mary Murray, *d.* unmarried.

DAVID MURRAY, 6TH VISCOUNT STORMONT, *c.* at Kilrennie on 29 October, 1689, and was one of those suspected of Jacobite sympathies for which he was sentenced and imprisoned for involvement in the uprising of 1715. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 20 January 1726, Anne, daughter of John Stewart of Innernytie, (she *d.* at Comlongon on 10 July, 1735,) and *d.* at Janefield, near Dalkeith, on 23 July 1748. He was father of :

1. David Murray, 7th Viscount Stormont, (*see below*).
2. James Murray, *d.* unmarried.
3. Anne Murray, *d.* unmarried on 9 July 1818.
4. Marjory Murray, *d.* unmarried on 19 April 1799.

DAVID MURRAY, 7TH VISCOUNT STORMONT & EARL OF MANSFIELD, *b.* at Edinburgh on 9 October 1727, and succeeded his father on his death in 1748. He succeeded his uncle William as Earl of Mansfield on his death without issue in 1793, and held a number of senior appointments including President of the Privy Council ; joint Chief Clerk of the Court of King's Bench and Ambassador to Vienna. He *d.* at Brighton on 1 September 1796,¹ having *m.* first, at Warsaw on 16 August 1759, Henrietta Frederica, daughter of Henry, Count Bunau, (she *d.* on 16 March 1766), and by her he was father of :

1. Elizabeth Mary Murray, *b.* at Warsaw on 18 May 1760, and *m.* at Caen House on 14 December 1785, to George Finch Hatton, Portman Square. She *d.* on 1 Jun 1825, having had issue.
2. Henrietta Anne Murray, *b.* at Dresden on 16 October 1763, and *d.* in infancy.

He *m.* secondly, on 5 May 1776, to Louisa, daughter of Charles, 9th Lord Cathcart, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, on 19 October 1797, to Robert Fulke Greville, brother to the Earl of Warwick, by whom she had further issue), and was father of :

3. William Murray, 3rd Earl of Mansfield, (*see below*).

4. George Murray, *b.* on 8 May 1780, and was appointed principal auditor of H.M. Treasury in Scotland, in 1795. He afterwards entered the army and was raised to Lieutenant-General, and *dsp* at Portman Square, London, on Saturday 12 October 1848.¹
5. Charles Murray, *b.* 22 August 1781, and entered the army as a Coronet in the 2nd Regiment Dragoon Guards, and was raised to Captain before being reduced in 1803. He *m.* at Lymington on 21 September 1802, to Elizabeth, daughter of Rev. Robert Lawe,² *d.* at Paris on 17 September 1859,³ and was father of :
- 5a) Charles Murray, *dsp* in 1872.
 - 5a) William Murray, *m.* on 12 October 1879, to Josephine, daughter of Joseph Drapier, and *dsp* in 1891.
 - 5a) Louisa Murray, *d.* unmarried on 13 May 1872.
6. Sir Henry Murray, *b.* at London on 6 August 1784,⁴ and entered the army, serving first in the Dragoons then the 26th Regiment of Foot. He fought during the Peninsula war and at Waterloo, in 1815, and *m.* at Manchester Square, London, on 28 June 1810, to Emily, daughter of Gerard De Visme, (she *d.* on 23 November 1873). He *d.* at his residence in Wimbledon on 29 July 1860,⁵ and was father of :
- 6a) Henry Stormont Murray, *b.* on 24 March 1812, and *dsp* at Wimbledon on 12 August 1863.⁶
 - 6a) Frederick Stormont Murray, *b.* on 23 March 1813, and entered the Royal Navy, serving as an officer. He *d.* unmarried on 23 March 1903.
 - 6a) Arthur Stormont Murray, entered the army and served as a Captain in the Rifle Brigade. He *m.* Elizabeth Mary, eldest daughter of Captain James Polkinghorne, R.N. (she survived him and *m* secondly, on 9 February 1851, to John Charles Hawker, of Rock⁷), and *d.* in August of 1848, during an attack against the Kaffirs.
 - 6a) Susan Emily Murray, *b.* on 17 March 1811, and *d.* unmarried on 9 February 1874.
 - 6a) Gertrude Louisa Murray, *c.* at Brighton on 10 January 1815, and *d.* unmarried on 26 March 1904.

7. Caroline Murray, *b* on 14 December 1789, and *d.* unmarried at Richmond on 21 January 1867.¹

WILLIAM MURRAY, 3RD EARL OF MANSFIELD, *b.* at Paris on 7 March 1777, and succeeded his father on his death in 1796. He *m.* on 16 September 1797, to Frederica, daughter of Grace William Markham, Archbishop of York, *d.* at the Imperial Hotel, Leamington, on Tuesday 18 February 1840,² and was father of :

1. William David Murray, 4th Earl of Mansfield, (*see below*).

2. Charles John Murray of Taymount, *b.* at London on 25 January 1810, and *m.* at Colwich, Staffordshire, on 12 September 1835, to Frances Elizabeth Anson, sister of the Earl of Litchfield, (she *m.* secondly, to Mr. Ambrose Isted of Ecton Hall, and *d.* on 25 December 1899). He *d.* at Rutland-gate, Knightsbridge, on Friday 1 August 1851,³ and was father of :

2a) Charles Archibald Murray of Taymount, *b.* on 10 October 1836, and *m.* first, at Westminster Abbey on 27 April 1865, to Adelaide Emily, fourth daughter of William Basil Percy, 7th Earl of Denbigh,⁴ (she was *b.* on 24 November 1836, and *d.* at Taymount on 24 May 1870⁵), by whom he had issue ; and secondly, at Perth on 11 June 1878, to Blanche, daughter of Sir Thomas Moncrieff, Baronet,⁶ (she *d.* at Taymount on 4 July 1926), by whom he had further issue. He *d.* at Taymount on Saturday 23 August 1924,⁷ and was father of :

2b) Ronald William Murray, *b.* on 10 May 1866, and *m.* on 16 February 1904, to Constance Mary Jane, daughter of Genral Sir Richard Hayes Taylor. He *d.* on 2 January 1917.

2b) Archibald John Percy Murray of Taymount, *b.* on 16 July 1867, and *m.* at St. Apul's Church, Knightsbridge, on 9 April 1907, Ducibella, daughter of Collingwood Lindsay Wood of Freeland. He *d.* on 8 April 1943,⁸ and was father of :
