OF LINTROSE

MUNGO MURRAY, 1ST OF LINTROSE, was a younger son of Sir William Murray, 8th of Ochertyre, and was *b.* in 1662. He was appointed Collector of Customs for Perthshire and had a Letter of Tack from Peter Hay of Leys for the lands of Mains of Leys on 5 April, 1694, in which he is styled as brother german to Sir Patrick Murray of Ochertyre.¹ He acquired the lands of Lintrose and Kilspindie for which he had a charter under the Great seal on 28 November 1700, and *d.* in 1719, having *m.* firstly, in around 1680, Janet, daughter of William Arnot, 1st of Mugdrum, by whom he was father of :

1. William Murray of Pitkeathly, *bap.* at Fowlis Easter on 8 June 1688, was appointed Deputy Collector of Customs, and obtained the lands of Pitkeathly. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 18 April, 1731, Margaret, daughter of Sir Alexander Lindsay of Evelick, (she was widow of Patrick Oliphant, of Bachilton, by whom she had no issue), *d.* in August of 1746, and was father of,
 - 1a) William Murray, to whom his sister Margaret Murray was retoured heir on 2 July, 1762.
 - 1a) Margaret Murray, *c.* at Edinburgh on 13 July, 1732, and had a Decree of Adjudication against John Oliphant of Carpow for the non-payment of certain sum due to her from the lands of Carpow, Pitkeathly, Nether Ardargie and Corstoun on 14 June, 1751, in which she is styled as heir to her father. She granted a Discharge in favour of John Oliphant of Carpow for these outstanding sums on 24 January, 1753, and was retoured heir to her brother William Murray on 2 July, 1762. She *m.* at Edinburgh on 3 April, 1762, William Mercer, of Aldie, second son of Robert Murray, *alias* Nairne, by his wife Jean, daughter and heiress of Sir Lawrence Mercer of Aldie, (William *d.* on 19 January 1790), and had issue.
2. Margaret Murray, *bap.* at Fowlis Easter on 30 October, 1690.
3. Jean Murray, *m.* at Madderty on 5 October, 1707, Patrick Bain of Findal.
4. Catherine Murray, *bap.* at Errol on 19 March, 1695, *m.* firstly on 12 September, 1737, to William Chalmer, Minister of Kinloch, (he *d.* on 30 December, 1742), and secondly, Mr. Hugh Maxwell, Minister of Strathmartine, (*c/m* 19 December, 1745²).
5. George Murray, *bap.* at Perth on 24 November, 1698, and *d.* young.

He *m.* secondly at Perth on 2 April 1702, to Martha, daughter of Andrew Forrester, Bailie of Dundee, (*c/m* at Dundee on 30 March 1702.¹ She was widow of Thomas Allan, Surgeon in Dundee, whom she had *m.* on 6 March 1695), and was father of :

6. Patrick Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 27 September 1704, and *d.* young.

7. John Murray, 2nd of Lintrose, (*see below*).

8. Alexander Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 13 July, 1708, and *m.* at Dundee on 4 June 1742, to Lillias, daughter of James Stewart of Alanton. He was father of,

8a) Mungo Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 11 October, 1744.

8a) Martha Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 28 October, 1747.

8a) Æmelia Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 7 June, 1749, and *m.* at Dundee on 26 October, 1767, James Guthrie of Craigie, (he was *b.* on 15 May, 1740). She *d.* on 7 November, 1824, and had issue.

9. Marjory Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 4 August, 1703.

JOHN MURRAY, 2ND OF LINTROSE, *c.* at Dundee on 3 August 1706, and succeeded his father in these lands. He, with his mother Martha Forrester, had an Instrument of Intimation from Andrew Blair, Writer in Dundee, as procurator for George Hay of Lyes that he is to enclose the lands of Manniesroom which march with their lands of Watterybutts to which he required their concurrence in terms of an Act of Parliament dated at Dundee on 12 December, 1729. He *m.* at Monzievaird on 29 October 1731, his cousin Æmelia, daughter of Sir William Murray, 10th of Ochtertyre, (*c/m* 28 & 30 October 1731²), and had issue :

1. Mungo Murray, 3rd of Lintrose, (*see below*).

2. William Murray, *bap.* at Dundee on 19 November, 1737, and was appointed Captain in the one of seven companies of the Black Watch raised in October of 1758. He *d.* without apparent issue in 1778

MUNGO MURRAY, 3RD OF LINTROSE, *bap.* at Dundee on 8 September 1735, and *m.* at Dundee on 19 November 1762, Cecilia, daughter of John Lyon of Brigton. He *d.* at Edinburgh on 11 June 1805,¹ and was father of :

1. John Murray, 4th of Lintrose, (*see below*).
2. William Murray, *bap.* at Kettins on 8 August, 1765, and attained the rank of Captain in the Navy being appointed Lieutenant-Commader of an Excise Yacht. He *m.* on 5 October 1798, to Jessie, daughter of Captain Niel MacArthur, (she was widow of John Nisbett, 6th of Cairnhill, who had *d.* in May of 1796 and by whom she had issue, and *d.* on 16 March, 1808) and *dsp* on 26 December, 1809. He was buried with his wife in St. Cuthberts Churchyard, Edinburgh.
3. Alexander Murray, *bap.* at Kettins on 14 November, 1767.
4. Mungo Murray, *bap.* at Kettins on 30 June, 1772.
5. Euphemia Amelia Murray, *bap.* at Kettins on 27 February 1769, *m.* on 2 August, 1794, David Smythe, 4th of Methven, (he was widow of Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Robert Murray of Hillhead, who had *d.* on 30 June 1785. He *d.* on 30 January 1806), and had issue.
6. Æmelia Murray, *bap.* at Kettins on 14 August 1770.

JOHN MURRAY, 4TH OF LINTROSE, *b.* on 11 July 1763, and had a charter of confirmation for the lands of Lintrose on 3 February 1784, in which he is styled eldest son to Mungo Murray of Lintrose. He *m.* on 12 February 1802, Anne, second daughter of John Gray of Baledgarno (*c/m* 11 February 1802. She *d.* on 3 November 1846), *d.* on 31 October 1831, and had issue :

1. Mungo Murray, 5th of Lintrose, (*see below*).
2. John Gray Murray, a twin with Mungo who *dsp* at Woodside Villa on 9 March 1866.²
3. William Murray, *bap.* at Kettins on 8 November, 1805, and *d.* at Edinburgh on 23 April, 1810. He was buried next to his uncle Captain William Murray in St. Cuthberts Churchyard, Edinburgh.
4. David Smythe Murray, *b.* on 30th April and *c.* at Kettins on 11 May, 1807, and *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of John Davis, West Australia. He *d.* at Pinjarah, Swan River, Australia, on 3 February 1864,³ and was father of :

- 4a) John Gray Murray, *b.* in June of 1840 and *dsp* during his voyage between Australia and London on 1 July 1884.¹
- 4a) **DAVID SMYTHE MURRAY, 6TH OF LINTROSE**, *b.* in 1850 and succeeded his uncle Mungo Murray of Lintrose, in the lands of Lintrose, and came over from Australia to take possession on 25 May 1899.² He *dsp* in 1901.³
- 4a) George William Murray, *b.* in 1852 and *dsp* in 1901, and shortly before his brother David.
- 4a) Anne Murray, *b.* in 1837 and *d.* unmarried in 1912.
- 4a) Elizabeth Murray, *b.* in 1842 and *d.* unmarried in 1928.
- 4a) Cecilia Murray, *b.* at Mandurah, Australia, in 1848 and *d.* unmarried at Lintrose on 13 October 1907.⁴
11. Effie Murray,
12. MacKenzie Murray, *b.* at Lintrose on 8th February and *c.* at Kettins on 12 March, 1810. He *m.* on 13 January, 1870, Elizabeth Margaret, daughter of Edward James Jackson, (by his wife Elizabeth, daughter of George Seton, and sister of Margaret Seton, wife of John Buchanan of Leny), and *d.* at Woodside House, near Coupar Angus, on Monday 14 February 1876.⁵ He had issue :
- 12a) Edward MacKenzie Murray Buchanan, of Leny, *b.* and *c.* at Cargill on 3 June, 1874, and in 1919 he assumed the name of Buchanan on succeeding to the estate of Leny by right of his cousin John Hamilton Buchanan. He *m.* on 9 October, 1913, Jean Isabella Shaw, daughter of James Carmichael, of Arthurstane, (she *d.* on 9 December 1952), and *d.* on 22 December, 1956. He was father of :
- 12b) Frances Malcolm Murray, *b.* on 22 June, 1942.
- 12b) Euphemia Murray, *b.* in 1915, *m.* firstly on 24 April, 1940, Francis Clerk of Ulva, (he was *k.* in action in Italy in 1944), and secondly on 7 May, 1956, Lieutenant-Colonel John Hay-Young, (he *d.* in 1979). She had issue.
- 12b) Margaret Murray, *m.* on 16 June, 1946, Albert Fairfield of Acklam.
- 12b) Phoebe Murray, *b.* in 1922 and *m.*, 25 July, 1952, Lieutenant-Colonel John Charles Inglis, Writer to the Signet. They had issue.

MUNGO MURRAY, 5TH OF LINTROSE, *b.* on 4th and *c.* at Kettins on 17 December, 1802, and *m.* at St. Andrews on 23 October 1831, Anne, second daughter of Thomas Mayne Willing, Philadelphia, (she *d.* on 11 July 1898). He and his brother John spent some years exploring in Africa and spent time there in the company of David Livingston. He *d.* without surviving issue at Lintrose House on 14 December, 1890.¹
