OF FALLAHILL & PHILIPHAUGH

ARCHIBALD DE MORAVIA, of whom little of any certainty is known other than that he was father of :

ROGER DE MORAVIA, to whom Sir James Douglas granted a charter for the lands of Fala on 1 September 1321.¹ From him apparently descended :

JOHN MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, was witness to a charter by William, Earl of Douglas, granting certain lands to Thomas de Cranston of that Ilk, dated 16 May 1446,² and was a member of the inquest at the retour of Archibald Douglas, as heir to his father George Douglas Earl of Angus, in lands near Selkirk on 13 May 1463.³ He *d.* by 1476 and was father of :

1. Patrick Murray of Fallahill, (*see below*).
2. Mr. Alexander Murray, was in holy orders and also held a number of appointments in the Royal household including, a auditor ; clerk of chancery and director of chancery.⁴ He was appointed Rector of Hawick and then Rector of Forres and a Canon of Moray, and *dsp* prior to 1 March 1486, when his brother Patrick is styled as his heir.⁵
3. Andrew Murray, is styled in 1485 as brother to the deceased Mr. Alexander Murray when entered in his lands of Easthead and Warnwood, in the ward of Etterick.
4. William Murray, was also entered in his deceased brother Mr. Alexander Murray's lands of Warnwood and Easthead, in 1485, for the space of three years.⁶

5. Peter Murray, who was joint tenant with his brother Patrick in the middle part of the crown lands of Catermach and Bowhill in 1486.¹ He *m.* a woman by the name of Janet to whom a liferent of the lands of Bowhill was reserved in 1510, *d.* by 1510 and was father of :

5a) James Murray, who was entered tenant in the crown lands of Bowhill as heir to his deceased father in 1510.²

6. Charles Murray, was a Burgess of Edinburgh and *dsp* prior to 20 October 1502, when his brother Peter, as his heir, disposed them to Mr. John Murray.³

PATRICK MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, who, in 1476, was entered as heir to John Murray, his father, in various lands including Bowhill and Harehead,⁴ and in those of Hangandshaw and Lewinshope in 1477.⁵ He *d.* by September of 1502 and was father of :

1. John Murray of Fallahill, (*see below*).

2. Margaret Murray, styled as daughter of Patrick Murray of Fallahill in a charter in her favour by James Stewart, Earl of Buchan, for the liferent of the barony of Traquair, dated 16 February 1479.⁶

JOHN MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, is named with his father as tenants of the crown lands of Lewinshope, Hangandshaw in 1479,⁷ and is styled as eldest son and apparent heir to Patrick Murray of Fallhill in a charter in his favour for the lands of Greviston, in the sheriffdom of Peebles, dated 9 February 1490.⁸ He had succeeded his father by 17 September 1502, and was killed after 5 May 1509, when had and his son John, had a Tack of the forest of Hangandshaw,⁹ and by 30 November following, by Andrew Ker of Gateschaw, James Ker of Quhitrig, Lancelot Ker, son of Andrew Ker, Thomas Scot, brother of Philip Scot of Aidschaw, William Scott in Hawick, George Scot in Goldelands,

and David Scot in Quhithauch who were afterwards pursued.¹ He *m.* Janet, daughter of Duncan Forrester of Torwood, (she was widow of John Schaw, 1st of Knockhill, by whom she had issue), and was father of :

1. John Murray of Fallahill, (*see below*).
2. Patrick Murray, had a charter for the lands of Braidmeadows, in the forest of Etterick, in 1510, in which he is styled as son of the deceased John Murray of Fallahill.²

JOHN MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, who, as heir to his father and a personal servant to the King, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Battis, Haddirle and others in the burgh of Selkrik, dated 17 September 1503.³ He had succeeded his father by 30 November 1509, when he had a charter from the King, in recognition of his good service, for the lands of Pelehill, and *m.* Margaret Hepburn with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Cranston-riddell on 27 March 1511.⁴ He had *d.* by 26 August 1512, and was father of :

1. A son, who *d.* without apparent issue after 1510 and prior to August 1512.
2. James Murray of Fallahill, (*see below*).

JAMES MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, is styled as second son when he was entered as tenant of the crown lands of Winterburgh in 1510,⁵ with his ward afterwards being gifted by the King to his mother, Margaret Hepburn, on 26 August 1512.⁶ He succeeded his father and is named with numerous others in a respite dated 16 August 1526, for aiding and resetting Englishmen,⁷ *d.* by May of 1530, and was father of :

PATRICK MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, succeeded his father and was served his heir in the lands of Peilhill and the office of sheriff of Selkirk, on 7 May 1530.¹ He *d.* in 1578 and was father of :

JAMES MURRAY, FIAR OF FALLAHILL, *d. vita patris* by 14 April 1566. He *m.* Margaret, sister of James Stewart of Traquair, by whom he was father of :

PATRICK MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, styled as heir of Patrick Murray of Fallahill when witness to a charter by John Somerville of Cambusnethan granting the lands of Cambusnethan to John Somerville, his son and heir, and Katheirne Murray, his spouse, dated 25 June 1560.² He had succeeded by 20 May 1578, when he had Sasine for the lands of Peilhill which had lapsed and been in the hands of Crown for the space of about one year.³ He *d.* in 1601 having *m.* firstly, to Agnes, daughter of Andrew Murray of Blackbarony, (*c/m* 9 April & 6-8 May 1580⁴), and secondly, to Mariote, daughter of Sir Lewis Bellenden of Auchenoullie, with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal on 1 June 1598.⁵ He was father of :

1. John Murray of Fallahill, (*see below*).

2. James Murray, styled as brother to John Murray of Fallahill in a Bond dated 20 November 1601.⁶ He became a merchant in Edinburgh, obtained the lands of Skirling and had issue, (*see Murray of Deuchar*)

SIR JOHN MURRAY OF FALLAHILL AND PHILIPHAUGH, had a charter under the Great Seal for the Wester-Mains of Selkirk which had been forfeited from Archibald, Earl of Angus, dated 23 August 1584,⁷ and in which he is styled as eldest son and heir of Patrick Murray of Fallahill. He had succeeded his father to whom he was served heir in the lands

of Philiphaugh on 19 May 1601,¹ also in the kirklands of Traquair called Kirkhouse on the same day,² and on 20 March 1604, he had a charter under the Great Seal for the kirklands of Traquair.³ He *m.* firstly, to Janet, daughter of Mr. William Scott of Elie, (*c/m* 15 March 1605⁴), by whom he had issue ; and secondly, to Isabel, daughter of Sir James Pringle of Gallasheills, (*c/m* 20 November 1620⁵), and was father of :

1. Sir James Murray, (*see below*).
2. Walter Murray, apprenticed to William Pryer, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 9 August 1648.⁶
3. Elizabeth Murray, *m.* Mr. Robert Knox, Minister at Kelso.⁷

SIR JAMES MURRAY, FIAR OF PHILIPHAUGH, the eldest son, who had various charters including one under the Great Seal for the lands of Quhyteburn, dated 31 July 1633. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 2 August 1625, to Anne, daughter of Sir Lewis Craig of Riccarton,⁸ and *d. vita patris* prior to 27 July 1646, being father of :

1. John Murray of Fallahill and Philiphaugh, (*see below*).
2. James Murray, served as Lieutenant-Colonel in H.M. Foot Guards,⁹ and *m.* at Edinburgh on 17 March 1664, to Elizabeth, daughter and coheirress of Patrick Murray, Cup Bear to the King, and youngers on of Patrick Murray of Woodend,¹⁰ (she was widow of Thomas Menzies of Tiggernach).
3. Janet Murray, *m.* James Scott of Gallosheills, (*c/m* 27 July 1646¹¹).
4. Jean Murray, *m.* Captain James Cranston of Glen.
5. Isabel Murray, *m.* John Nasmyth, brother of Sir Michael Nasmyth of Posso, and had issue which succeeded to the lands of Posso as heirs male.

SIR JOHN MURRAY OF FALLAHILL, succeeded his father and was served his heir in the lands of Hainingshaw, Philiphaugh and others, on 10 February 1648.¹ He *d.* in 1676 having *m.* firstly, to Anne, daughter of Sir Archibald Douglas of Cavers, by whom he was father of :

1. Sir James Murray of Philiphaugh, (*see below*).
2. John Murray, 1st of Bowhill, became an Advocate and was appointed a Lord of Session in June 1707 under the title of Lord Bowhill, and a Lord of Justiciary. He *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 27 April 1694, to Jean Scott,² (she was buried in the Greyfriars, Edinburgh, on 5 May 1698³), secondly, at Edinburgh on 20 February 1699, to Jean, daughter of Sir John Scott of Ancrum,⁴ and thirdly, at Edinburgh on 20 August 1704, to Jean Moncrieff,⁵ (she was widow of John MakGill of Rumgally, by whom she had issue ; and of David Scrimgeour of Cartmore who had *dsp* in 1700 by whom she had no issue). He *d.* on 24 March 1714, and was father of :
 - 2a) John Murray, 2nd of Bowhill, *b.* at Edinburgh on 15 April 1695, and succeeded his father on his death in 1714 and *dsp* in August of 1718, with his cousin John Murray of Philiphaugh being served his heir in the lands of South and North Bowhills on 20 January 1719.
 - 2a) Elizabeth Murray, *b.* at Edinburgh on 8 February 1700, and *m.* James Menzies, 3rd of Culdares, (*c/m* 6 and 18 December 1727.⁶ He *d.* at Inveresk on 10 December 1775).
3. William Murray, served as a Colonel in the army and had issue :
 - 3a) Jean Murray, *m.* William Robertson of Inches, (he *d.* in February of 1752), and had issue.
4. Archibald Murray,
5. Thomas Murray,
6. Lewis Murray,
7. Anne Murray, *m.* firstly, to Alexander Pringle of Whytebank, (*c/m* 1682. He was widow of Ann, daughter of James Pringle of Torwoodlee, whom he had *m.* by *c/m* November 1646. He *dsp* on 25 April 1689), and secondly at Edinburgh on 18 August 1692, to Robert Rutherford of Bowlands, by whom she had issue.

He *m.* secondly, to Margaret, daughter of Sir John Scott, 1st of Scottstarvet, (she was widow of John Trotter of Charterhall, and was buried in the King's Chapel at Holyrood on 15 November 1694¹), by whom he had further issue :

11. Jean Murray, *c.* at Edinburgh on 18 April 1672.

SIR JAMES MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH, succeeded and was served heir to his father in the lands of Philiphaugh and others, on 8 November 1677.² He was appointed Lord Clerk Register in May 1703, and a Senator of the College of Justice under the title of Lord Philiphaugh, and *d.* on 1 July 1708, having *m.* firstly, on 24 April 1678, to Anne, daughter of Mr. Thomas Hepburn Parson of Oldhamstocks,³ (she was on 18 June 1688⁴), by whom he had no apparent issue. He *m.* secondly, to Margaret, daughter of Sir Alexander Don of Newton, and was father of :

1. John Murray of Philiphaugh, (*see below*).
2. James Murray, *c.* at 1 September 1695.
3. Alexander Murray, *b.* on 21 January 1698.
4. Anna Murray, *c.* on 5 November 1691, *m.* Pringle of Haining.
5. Elizabeth Murray, *c.* on 2 December 1692.
6. Jean Murray, *c.* on 7 February 1694.
7. Margaret Murray, *c.* on 1 September 1695, and *d.* at Edinburgh on 16 January 1769.⁵

JOHN MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH, succeeded his father on his death and was served his heir general on 4 September 1712. He was served heir male to his cousin John Murray of Bowhill in the lands of South and North Bowhill on 20 January 1719. He *m.* at Edinburgh

on 31 December 1711, to Eleanor, daughter of Basil Hamilton, son of William, Lord Hamilton,¹ (she *d.* on 27 December 1783), *d.* at Burlington, in Yorkshire, on his way home from London, on Monday 2 July 1753,² and was father of :

1. Basil Murray, who *dsp* in January of 1747, with his brother John being served his heir in the office of Sheriff of Selkirk on 28 March 1747.

2. John Murray of Philiphaugh, (*see below*).

3. David Murray, who settled in America and *d.* at his house in Savannah, Georgia, on 29 April 1771, of a "bilious fever."³

4. Charles Murray, was appointed H.M. Consul for Madeira in September 1771, and *m.* Eliza, sister of Robert Scott of Danesfield. He *d.* at Lisbon in March 1808, aged 74 years,⁴ and was father of :

4a) Charles Scott Murray, of Danesfield, *m.* on 17 May 1815, to Augusta Eliza, daughter of John Nixon, (she was widow of John Buller, M.P. for East Loos), *d.* at Cavendish Square, London, on 24 April 1837, in his 58th year,⁵ and was father of :

4b) Charles Robert Scott Murray of Danesfield, *b.* on 28 December 1818, and *m.* in the Catholic Chapel, Spanish Place, Manchester Square, London, on Thursday 17 September 1846, to Amelia Charlotte, eldest daughter of Thomas Alexander Fraser, 12th Lord Lovat,⁶ (she *d.* at Bournemouth on Saturday 17 August 1912⁷). He *d.* at Bournemouth on 27 August, 1882,⁸ and was father of :

4c) Charles Aloysius Scott Murray, *b.* at Danesfield on 4 November 1847, and succeeded his father on his death in 1882. He sold Danesfield and Medenham to Robert William Hudson in 1896, and settled at the manor house of Hambleden. He *m.* at St. Mary's Cadogan Place, London, on 2 May 1872, to

Emily, second daughter of Matthew James Higgins.¹ He *d.* at the manor house of Hambledon on Monday 4 October 1909,² and was father of :

4d} Archibald John Scott Murray, *b.* at Eaton Square, London, on 12 June 1874, and *d.* at Danesfield on 16 September 1874.³

4d} Francis Joseph Scott Murray, *b.* at Eaton Place, London, on 31 July 1875, and *m.* at Brompton Oratory, London, on Thursday 11 April 1907, to Jane Seymour Mary, daughter of Augustus Henry De Trafford.⁴ He *d.* in a London nursing home on Friday 13 February 1925, following an operation.⁵

4d} Austin Edward Scott Murray, *b.* in 1881.

4d} Ronald Charles Scott Murray, *m.* at St. James's Church, Spanish Place, London, on 11 October 1905, to Magdalene Mary Josephine, second daughter of William Martin Edmunds of Worseborough Hall.⁶

4d} Blanche Mary Scott Murray, *m.* in 1896, to Lieutenant Humphrey Smith, R.N.

4d} Eva Mary Scott Murray, became a nun in the Ursuline Convent, Wimbledon.

4c} Augustin John Alphonso Scott Murray, *b.* on 11 November 1848, and *d.* in February of 1871.⁷

4c} Basil Henry Scott Murray, *b.* on 5 August 1858, and served as Major in the Royal Guards Reserve Regiment.

5. Margaret Murray, *d.* at George Square, Edinburgh, on 20 December 1809.²
6. Mary Murray, *m.* on 18 August 1750, to Sir Alexander Don of Newton,³ and had issue.

JOHN MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH, succeeded his father and was served his heir on 2 October 1761, and to his brother Basil in the lands of Philiphaugh on 6 October 1764, and again to his his father in the lands of Elinburn, in the parish of Yarrow, on 18 March 1771. He *d.* at Jamaica, circa July of 1800,⁴ having *m.* Miss Thomson by whom he was father of :

1. **JOHN MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH**, succeeded his father and was served his heir general on 23 January 1815. He *d.* unmarried on 28 May 1830.⁵
2. Charles Murray,
3. James Murray of Philiphaugh, (*see below*).
4. Janet Murray, *m.* Dennis, Jamaica.
4. Eleanora Murray, *m.* at Saint Cuthberts, Edinburgh, on 23 April 1785, Sir James Nasmyth, 3rd Baronet of Posso, (he *d.* on 4 December 1828), and *d.* at York Place, Edinburgh, on 25 March 1807.⁶
5. Mary Murray, *m.* John MacQueen.
6. Margaret Muray, *m.* at Edinburgh on 20 January 1786, to Lieutenant John Baugh, 58th Regiment of Foot.⁷

JAMES MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH, *b.* in 1769 and succeeded his brother John on his death in 1830, to whom he was served heir in the lands of Philiphaugh and others on 24 September 1836. He *m.* at St. George, Madras, on 23 September 1809, to Mary Dale, daughter of Henry Hughes, *d.* at Beechwood Villa, near Selkirk, on 15 July 1854,⁸ and was father of :

1. John Nesbitt-Murray of Philiphaugh, (*see below*).
2. James Murray, *d.* at Bonnygate, Cupar, on 7 November 1892, aged 74 years.¹
3. Basil Hamilton Murray, *b.* in 1823, served as Lieutenant in the 43rd Bengal Light Infantry and *d.* at Edinburgh on 1 April 1849.²
4. Jessey Susan Murray, *d.* unmarried on Monday 15 October 1900.³

SIR JOHN NESBITT MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH, *b.* on 14 April 1817, succeeded his father on his death in 1854, and was served his heir on 4 October 1854. He successfully claimed the Melgund Baronetcy in 1863. He *d.* at Philiphaugh on 5 December 1882,⁴ having *m.* firstly, at Marylebone church, London, on 23 May 1840, to Rose Mary, daughter and heiress of William Andrew Nesbitt,⁵ (she *d.* at Eu, Seine Inferieure, France, on Friday 2 June 1876⁶), by whom he was father of :

1. John Forbes Nesbitt-Murray of Philiphaugh, (*see below*).
2. James Murray, *b.* at Philiphaugh on 3 February 1845, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 5 October 1870, to Mary Somerville, second daughter of Alexander Russell,⁷ Editor and joint proprietor of The Scotsman newspaper, (*c/m* 4 & 5 October 1870). He *d.* on at Violet Bank, Moffat, on 19 June 1897,⁸ and was father of :
 - 2a) John Charles Murray, *b.* on 21 April 1872.
 - 2a) **SIR JAMES ALEXANDER RUSSEL MURRAY, BARONET**, *b.* in 1875, and succeeded his cousin in the Melgund Baronetcy.
 - 2a) Jessey Rose Mary Murray, *b.* at Brugge, Belgium, on 2 September 1873, and *d.* at Guernsey on 18 August 1902.⁹

3. Jessey Rose Mary Murray, *b.* on 5 February 1843, and *m.* at St. George's Church, Hanover Square, London, on 14 July 1868, to Sir William Lewis Salusbury Trelawny, only son of Sir John Trelawny, of Trelawne, Baronet.¹

He *m.* secondly, at Kensington parish church on 15 August 1877, to Charlotte, daughter of Rev. Richard Burgess, Prebendary of St. Paul's and Rector of Ickworth-cum-Horringer, Suffolk.²

JOHN FORBES PRINGLE NESBITT MURRAY OF PHILIPHAUGH, *b.* at Philiphaugh on 6 January 1842, and succeeded his father but sold the Philiphaugh in 1894 and never assumed the Baronetcy. He *m.* at the British Embassy, Paris, on 29 January 1870, to Mary Elizabeth Frances, only child of C. Robertson, St. Leonard's-on-Sea, Sussex,³ (she *d.* at Hunchow, near Kendal on 19 August 1883, aged 32 years⁴), *d.* at Cernere, Pyrenees, Orientales, on 23 February 1897,⁵ and was father of :

1. Archibald Charles Philip Murray, (*see below*).
2. Eleanor Rose Mary Murray, *b.* on 3 August 1873.
