SIR WALTER DE OGILVY OF CARCARY, LINTRATHEN AND AIRLIE, had a charter for the barony of Carcary from Sir John de Erskine of dun, dated 18 May 1400,¹ and over the course of his life he acquired a considerable number of other lands including those of Easter Fingask from both Henry Duncanson by charter dated 13 December 1403² and Robert Muschet of Tolgarth on 8 November 1404³ ; Tullochcurran, in the barony of Strathardle, with the castle, and those of Eassie by charter by Isobel de Douglas, Countess of Mar and the Garioch, by charter dated 1 December 1404⁴ ; Easter Keilour resigned in his favour by James Barclay, of Kippo, and confirmed under the Great Seal on 26 November, 1404⁵ ; the lands and barony of Lintrathen from Archibald, Earl of Douglas, for which he had a Charter of Confirmation under the Seal of Robert, Duke of Albany, on 15 June, 1414,⁶ and the lands and barony of Formale on 7 October 1423.⁷ He was appointed Lord High Treasurer to King James I. and Master of the King's Household and founded a chaplainry for two chaplains in the parish church of St. Mary's of Auchterhouse for the salvation of the King and his predecessors, for Sir Walter himself and for those who fell at the battle of Harlaw on 3 February, 1427.⁸ He had a licence from the King to erected the tower on his lands of Airlie as a castle dated 1 May 1431,⁹ *m.* Isabel, daughter and coheirress of Sir John Glen of Inchmartin and Balmutto, *d.* by 17 October 1440, when he had been succeeded in his estate by his eldest son John, and was father of :

1. Sir John de Ogilvy of Lintrathen, (*see below*).
2. James de Ogilvy, acted as Bailie to Margaret, Countess of Moray, and wife of his brother Sir John Ogilvy, in a charter in favour of the said Margaret for a house at Lintrathen which belonged to the bell of St. Medam on 18 July, 1448.¹ He was a member of an inquest held at Brechin on 21 May 1450, to determine the rights of the townfolk of Brechin to hold a weekly market and have the liberty of the waters of Eask and Tay.² He appeared before the sheriff court of Forfar on 28 April 1483, requesting that his brother Sir John be free from service.³
3. Sir Walter de Ogilvy of Deskford and Findlater, had a charter from Margaret of Glen, his grandmother, for the lands of Wardroperston which would fall to him after the death of Isabel, his mother and daughter of the said Margaret, and Walter de Ogilvy of Lintrathen, his father and spouse of the said Isabel, on 6 November, 1419.⁴ He obtained the lands and baronies of Deskford and Findlater upon his marriage to Margaret, daughter and heiress of sir John Sinclair, of Deskford and Findlater, and in contemplation of which they had a Charter under the Great Seal for these lands on 11 August, 1440. He had issue, (*see Ogilvy of Deskford & Findlater*).
4. David de Ogilvy,
5. Alexander de Ogilvy,
6. Patrick de Ogilvy, who, with his brothers David, Alexander, Patrick and George, were called as provisional heirs to their brother Walter in the lands of Wardroperston by their maternal grandmother Margaret de Glen on 6 November, 1419. He was witness to Instruments taken by his brother Sir John Ogilvy and Patrick, Lord Graham, relating to the settling of their disputes over the rights to fish on River Esk, dated 13 April 1462.⁵
7. George de Ogilvy,
8. Giles Ogilvy, *m.* to Robert Arbuthnott, of that ilk.

SIR JOHN DE OGILVY OF LINTRATHEN, succeeded his father and had charters under the Great Seal for the lands and castle of Airlie on 3 March 1459,⁶ and for the ½ of the lands of Wardroperston dated the following day. He had a new charter under the Great Seal confirming to him the lands of Lintrathen, Airlie, Garlot, Essie, Formal, Fornochny and

Keilour, all in the sheriffdom of Forfar, and those of Wardroperston, with the fishing rights there, in the shire of Kincardine, and those of Callentuy and Fingask, in the sheriffdom of Perth, dated 28 January 1483.¹ He *m.* firstly, Marion, daughter of Sir William Seaton of that Ilk, secondly, by 27 June 1447, to Margaret, (she was widow of Thomas Dunbar, Earl of Moray, and *d.* in about 1471), when he resigned the custody of the bell of St. Medam to her² and *d.* after 28 January 1483, and by 31 July 1489, when his eldest son Sir James, was retoured his heir. He was father of :

1. Sir James Ogilvy, 1st Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. David Ogilvy, infeft in an annualrent of 20 merks Scots from the ½ lands of Wardroperston by his father on 27 January, 1466.³
3. John Ogilvy, acted as a baillie to a Sasine dated 7 October 1462, and is then styled as son to Sir John Ogilvy of Lintrathen,⁴ and on 25 September 1504, he took Instrument stating that all persons intromitting with his rights to the lands of Fornochtie were invalid in which he is styled as brother of the deceased James, Lord Ogilvy.⁵
4. Thomas Ogilvy, appointed Abbot of Coupar Angus.
5. Christian Ogilvy, *m.* Sir Alexander Forbes of Pitsligo.
6. Elizabeth Ogilvy, *m.* Sir Patrick Keith of Innerugie.
7. Marjory Ogilvy, *m.* Henry Stewart of Rosyth, and had issue.
8. Margaret Ogilvy, *m.* Sir Gilbert Ramsay, younger of Bamff, (*c/m* 10 April, 1482.⁶ He *d. vitae patris*) and had issue.

SIR JAMES OGILVY, 1ST LORD OGILVY OF AIRLIE, styled as eldest son and heir of Sir John de Ogilvy of Lintrathen in a charter of confirmation in favour of John Stewart of Fortingall for the lands of Tulloch Curran, and others, in the Lordship of Strathardill on 7 October, 1470, and was retoured heir to his father in the lands and barony of Lintrathen on 31 July, 1489.⁷ He was created a Lord of Parliament by King James IV. on 28 April,

1491, *m.* firstly, Elizabeth Kennedy, secondly prior to May of 1478 to Helen, daughter of William Douglas, 2nd Earl of Angus, (she was widow of William, 2nd Lord Graham), and thirdly, Janet Lyle. He *d.* by September of 1504 and was father of :

1. John, 2nd Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. Sir Thomas Ogilvy, styled as brother to John, Lord Ogilvy, when they had Letters of Attorney on behalf of Robert Mercer on 10 March, 1505, and was father of,
 - 2a) Margaret Ogilvy,
 - 2a) Janet Ogilvy,
 - 2a) Marion Ogilvy,
 - 2a) Elizabeth Ogilvy, who, with her sisters, had a payment of 400 merks from John Stewart, Earl of Buchan, in satisfaction of a debt due to their father Sir Thomas Ogilvy by Alexander Stewart, Earl of Buchan, father of the said John, on 10 December, 1552.¹
3. Alexander Ogilvy, witness with his brother Sir John Ogilvy to a charter by Andrew Dun of Rate, on 31 January, 1493.²
4. Walter Ogilvy of Balfour, obtained these lands and had issue. (*see Ogilvy of Balfour*).
5. Archibald Ogilvy, had a Remission for the murder of James Lindsay, son of David Lindsay, and James Minneman on 9 February, 1496.³
6. Malcolm Ogilvy, included in Letters of Premonition by his father to warn David Lyon, uncle and Tutor to George Lyon, Lord Glamis, to appear at the church door of Dundee on 28 May, 1501, to receive 700 merks in redemption of the wadset of the lands of Purgay.⁴
7. Isobel Ogilvy, *m.* Alexander Stewart, Earl of Buchan, (Dispensation dated 10 January, 1491.⁵ He *m.* secondly, Margaret, daughter of William, 1st Lord Ruthven, and had issue ; and *d.* in 1505).
8. Marion Ogilvy, a mistress to David Beaton, Archbishop of St. Andrews by whom she had issue.

He was also father of a natural son :

9. John Ogilvy, a natural son in whose favour a Precept for Letters of Legitimation passed the Privy Seal on 24 March, 1492.⁶ He was included in Letters of Premonition by his father to David Lyon Tutor of Glamis, on 28 May, 1501, and had *m.* by 10 October, 1506, to Helen

Cossor when they granted Letters of Reversion to his father for the lands of Fornocho and is then styled as “in the Craig.”¹

JOHN, 2ND LORD OGILVY OF AIRLIE, had a charter for the lands and Barony of Fingask resigned in his favour by his grandfather Sir John Ogilvy of Lintrathen on 14 October, 1472, and by which dated he had *m.* Marion, daughter of William, 2nd Lord Graham.² He was infeft in the Barony of Lintrathen as heir to his deceased father on 4 November, 1504,³ and to whom he was retoured heir on 13 October, 1505.⁴ He was father of :

1. James, 3rd Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. Anthony Ogilvy, consecrated Abbot of Glenluce.
3. Margaret Ogilvy, *m.* William Wood of Bonnyton, (he *m.* secondly, to Katherine, daughter of Sir William Scott of Balweary, and widow of James Sandilands of Cruvy).
4. Marjory Ogilvy, *m.* Walter Lichton of Ullishaven, (Dispensation dated 7 March 1501⁵).

JAMES, 3RD LORD OGILVY OF AIRLIE, succeeded his father and *m.* Margaret, daughter of David Lindsay, 8th Earl of Crawford. He *d.* by November of 1524 and was father of :

1. James, 4th Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. John Ogilvy,
3. Archibald Ogilvy,
4. Mary Ogilvy, *m.* David Lyon of Cossins.
5. Isabel Ogilvy, *m.* David Strachan of Carnyllie.
6. Elizabeth Ogilvy, *m.* by 14 June, 1514, David Garden of Leys, when Jean Collace, his mother, granted a Discharge for Tocher to James, Lord Ogilvy, her father.⁶

JAMES, 4TH LORD OGILVY OF AIRLIE, retoured heir to his father in the Barony of Lintrathen on 29 November, 1524,¹ and was appointed one of the Extraordinary Lords of

Session on 5 March, 1542. He *m.* by 4 October, 1528, Helen, daughter of Henry, 3rd Lord Sinclair, when they were infeft in the lands of Wester Craig of Glenisla, *d.* in November of 1547,² and was father of :

1. James, Master of Ogilvy, (*see below*).
2. Thomas Ogilvy of Wester Craig, served as Tutor to his young nephew James, Lord Ogilvy, during his minority and had a charter for the lands of Craigs of Glenisla, on his parents resignation, on 4 August, 1542.³ He *m.* firstly by 6 December, 1544, Janet, daughter of Thomas Fraser, 3rd Lord Lovat, (she was widow of James Crichton, 4th of Ruthven, by whom she had issue), when they were infeft in the lands of Drumflognye by David Ogilvy of Auchteralyth and from whom he separated but did not divorce.⁴ He *m.* secondly, Beatrix, daughter of Sir James Chisholm, 2nd of Cromlix, and had issue ; although this marriage was annulled in 1574 due to his not having been divorced from his first wife. He was father of,
 - 2a) Archibald Ogilvy, had a charter from his father for the lands of Wester Craig on 3 January, 1554.⁵ He *dsp* prior to March of 1578.
 - 2a) Janet Ogilvy, a child by her father's first marriage and became his heir upon his death. She was retoured heir to her father in the lands of Incheok and Easter Bogside on 29 October, 1604, and *m.* by 28 March, 1578, James Anderson, Burgess of Perth.
 - 2a) Thomas Ogilvy, a son by his father's second marriage and to whom his mother transferred her liferent rights from the lands of Wester Craigs on 16 March, 1574.⁶ He had a Wadset of the lands of Little Kennie from James, Master of Ogilvy, on 16 August, 1588.
 - 2a) Helen Ogilvy,
 - 2a) Beatrice Ogilvy, who, with her sister Helen, were constituted heirs to their mother Beatrix Chisholm's belongings on 16 March, 1574.
 - 2a) John Ogilvy of Wester Craigs, a natural son who was a provisional heir to his father in the lands of Craigs on 15 May, 1558, and was infeft as heir of tailzie and provision to his brother Archibald Ogilvy in the lands of Wester Craig to be held of Janet Ogilvy, his half-sister as legitimate heir to their father Thomas Ogilvy of Craig on 28 March, 1578. He dispensed the lands of Wester Craig to Sir John Ogilvy, second son of James, Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, on 15 November, 1603.

3. John Ogilvy of Littlekenny and Inverkeilour, who was father of,

3a) John Ogilvy of Balgray, *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of David Bethune of Melgund, (*c/m* 6 November 1574. She *m.* secondly, George Campbell of Crunan), and *d.* prior to September of 1602. He was father of,

3b) John Ogilvy of Peill, infest in the lands of Drumslognay as heir to Thomas Ogilvy of Wester Craigs, brother of his grandfather John Ogilvy in 1652 and which lands he disposed to Gilbert Ogilvy of Craigs on 21 May, 1652. He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Robert Aysoun, 3rd of Arthurstane, and was father of,

3c) John Ogilvy, younger of Peill, who, with his parents, obtained the lands of Formall Ruthven from James Crichton of Ruthven on 13 November, 1643. He was father of,

3d) John Ogilvy of Peill, styled as son of John Ogilvy, younger of Peill, when he subscribed a Certificate with Major James Murray that they were in the company of James, Lord Ogilvy, and passed to England by 11 February, 1659. He had issue,

3e) Alexander Ogilvy of Peill, succeeded to these lands and apprised the lands of Newton from James Ogilvy of Newton, in 1691.

3d) Elspeth Ogilvy, *m.* Mr John Malcolm, Minister of Airlie, (*c/m* 26 April, 1658).

3b) Elizabeth Ogilvy, *m.* Robert Guthrie of Kinblathmont.

3b) Jean Ogilvy, *m.* Alexander Campbell, eldest son and heir of George Campbell of Crunan, (*c/m* 6 September, 1602).

3a) James Ogilvy, one of the consenting parties to the marriage of his niece Jean, daughter of his deceased brother John Ogilvy of Balgray, and Alexander Campbell, fiar of Crunan, on 6 September, 1602.

3a) Alexander Ogilvy, who, with his father, granted a renunciation of an annualrent from the lands of Ballischen to James, Lord Ogilvy, on 1 March, 1577. He obtained the lands of Aucheroch and was father of,

2h) William Ogilvy of Schannallie, infest in the lands of Schannallie on 11 June, 1630, which he afterwards disposed to James Ogilvy on 12 April, 1632.

4. Archibald Ogilvy, living in May 1558.

5. Alexander Ogilvy, who, with his brothers, Archibald and John, were provisional heirs to their brother Thomas Ogilvy in the lands of Craigs on 15 May, 1558.

6. Helen Ogilvy, *m.* James Stewart, 5th Lord Innermeath, and had issue.

7. Marion Ogilvy, *m.* Patrick, 4th Lord Gray, (*c/m* 21 September 1537), and had issue.

8. Agnes Ogilvy, *m.* Thomas Erskine, son and heir of Sir Thomas Erskine of Brechin, (*c/m* at Edinburgh on 14 December 1540¹).
9. Margaret Ogilvy, *m.* by 18 May, 1549, Sir David Graham of Fintry, (he *m.* secondly, Margaret Hunter), when he granted a Discharge for Tocher.²

JAMES, MASTER OF OGILVY, the eldest son, *m.* by 1 October, 1539, Katherine, daughter of Sir John Campbell, 1st of Cawdor, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to David Lindsay, Earl of Crawford, by whom she had issue), when they had a charter from his father for the lands of Campsy, and was *k.* at the battle of Pinkie in September of 1547. He had issue :

1. James, 5th Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Ogilvy,
3. Alexander Ogilvy,
4. Helen Ogilvy, *m.* John Ogilvy, 8th of Inverquarity, (*c/m* at Brechin on 6 January 1559³), and had issue.
5. Agnes Ogilvy, *m.* John Erskine, 7th of Dun, (*c/m* 13 April 1565.⁴ He *d.* on 17 June 1591), and had issue.

JAMES, 5TH LORD OGILVY OF AIRLIE, who was underage at the time of his father and grandfather's deaths and was placed under the care of his paternal uncle Thomas Ogilvy, of Craigs. He was infeft in the lands of Airlie as heir to his deceased grandfather on 5 June, 1548, to whom he was retoured heir in the Barony of Lintrathen on 2 October, 1563,⁵ and for which he had Sasine on the 28th following.⁶ He *m.* Jean, daughter of William, 7th Lord Forbes, *d.* in 1606 and had issue :

1. James, 6th Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, (*see below*).

2. Sir John Ogilvy of Craigs, obtained these lands from his natural cousin John Ogilvy of Wester Craigs on 15 November, 1603, and is then styled as second son of James, Lord Ogilvy of Airlie.¹ He *m.* firstly, Elizabeth, daughter of John Crichton of Strathurd, (she was widow of Andrew Mercer of Meikleour, whom she had *m.* in 1576 and by whom she had issue), and had issue ; and secondly, to Elizabeth, daughter of John Brown, fiar of Fordell, (*c/m* 15 January 1617²), by whom he had further issue. He *d.* prior to 23 March, 1644, and had issue, (*see Ogilvy of Craigs*).
3. David Ogilvy of Pitmowes, *m.* firstly, Martha, daughter of Patrick MacCalzeane of Cliftonhall, (*c/m* in 1588/9³), and secondly, Nicholas, daughter of Patrick Guthrie of Pitmowes, (*c/m* 12 August, 1599), with whom he had a charter for the lands of Easter and Wester Pitmowes from his father-in-law on 14 August, 1599.⁴ He had issue, (*see Ogilvy of Pitmowes*).
4. William Ogilvy,
5. Archibald Ogilvy,
6. Frances Ogilvy, 1st of Newgrange, obtained these lands and *m.* firstly, Helen, daughter of David Gardyne of that Ilk, (*c/m* 14 May, 1591). He *m.* secondly, after December 1596, to Elizabeth, daughter of William Adamson of Craigmuir, (she was widow of John Brown, fiar of Fordell, who had *d.* in December of 1596, and by whom she had issue), and had issue, (*see Ogilvy of Newgrange*).
7. George Ogilvy of Friock, mentioned in a discharge by David Gardyne of that Ilk to James, Lord Ogilvy, and Jean Forbes, his parents in 1592. He *m.* to Elspeth Montgomery and had issue,
7a) James Ogilvy of Fornochtie, retoured heir to his father in the lands of Friock on 23 February, 1669.
8. Patrick Ogilvy of Muirton, obtained the lands of Muirton and is styled as brother german of Francis Ogilvy, son of James, Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, in a charter the lands of Smyddiehill in favour of Sir Walter Rollo of Garden on 19 September, 1601. He had a charter for the lands of Nether Muirton from John Donald, portioner of Grange of Aberbothry, on 19 December, 1621, in which he is styled as youngest lawful son of his father, *m.* Isabella, daughter of James Murray, fiar of Smiddiehill, (*c/m* 22 & 26 May 1599), and had issue. (*see Ogilvy of Muirton and Cluny*).
9. Margaret Ogilvy, *m.* firstly, George Keith, 5th Earl Marischal, (he *d.* on 2 April, 1623), and secondly, Alexander Strachan of Thornton.

JAMES, 6TH LORD OGILVY OF AIRLIE, succeeded his father and *d.* in about 1617. He *m.* firstly, Jean, daughter of William Ruthven, 1st Earl of Gowrie, by whom he was father of,

1. James Ogilvy, 1st Earl of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. Mr. John Ogilvy of Newbigging and Invergowrie, *m.* Agnes, daughter of Sir Archibald Napier of Merchiston, (she was widow of Henry Balfour of Logie, and of Sir Patrick Gray of Invergowrie), and *d.* at Glenisla on 22 November, 1625.¹ He had issue,
 - 2a) Isobel Ogilvy,
 - 2a) Agnes Ogilvy,
 - 2a) Margaret Ogilvy, *m.* firstly, William Duncan, eldest son of Mr. John Duncan, Minister of Liff, and with her three sisters, she was retoured heir to their father on 9 June, 1635. She *m.* secondly, John Hunter of Baldovie.
 - 2a) Anna Ogilvy, *m.* David Livingston of Balrownie, and had issue.
3. William Ogilvy, had a charter from his father for the lands of Makriche, and others, in which he is styled as his third son and which he afterwards assigned to George Fowlis, Master of the Cunziehouse, on 22 January, 1627.²
4. Archibald Ogilvy, included in Letters of Premonition by his father that he, with his sisters Margaret and Elizabeth, should appear at the church of Kinnell and receive the sum of £6 Scots as redemption of annualrents from certain of his lands on 23 July, 1613, in which he is styled as his fourth son.³
5. Elizabeth Ogilvy, *m.* George Gordon, younger of Gight, eldest son and heir of Sir George Gordon of Gight, (*c/m* 1 November 1620⁴).
6. Jean Ogilvy,
7. Margaret Ogilvy, included in Letters of Premonition by her father to redeem certain annualrents on 23 July, 1613.

He *m.* secondly to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Archibald Napier, 6th of Merchiston, (*c/m* 30 June, 1613.⁵ She *m.* secondly by 21 March, 1627, Alexander Auchmouthie), and was father of :

8. James Ogilvy, is styled as only child of his father's second marriage to Elizabeth Napier in a decree obtained against his half-brother James, Lord Ogilvy, for payment of certain sums contained in his parents marriage contract dated 30 June 1613, on 31 July, 1634.¹

JAMES OGILVY, 1ST EARL OF AIRLIE, succeeded his father and was created Earl of Airlie, Lord Ogilvy of Alyth and Lintrathen by Patent dated at York on 2 April 1639, with remainder to himself and his heirs male. He *m.* Isabel, daughter of Thomas Hamilton, 1st Lord Haddington, (*c/m* 22 November 1610²), *d.* in 1664, and was father of :

1. James Ogilvy, 2nd Earl of Airlie, (*see below*).
2. Sir Thomas Ogilvy, *m.* Christian, daughter of Patrick Ruthven, Earl of Forth, (*c/m* 24 March-28 October 1641³), and was *k.* at the battle of Inverlochy on 2 February, 1645. He was father of,
 - 2a) Christina Ogilvy, *m.* Sir James Ramsay, 2nd Baronet of Bamff, (*c/m* 17 October 1666⁴), and had issue.
 - 2a) Clara Ogilvy, *m.* Robert Fletcher, 2nd of Ballinshoe, (*c/m* 22 August 1664.⁵ He was widow of Marion Graham, by whom he had issue), and had issue.
3. Sir David Ogilvy of Clova, who, with his parents, obtained the lands of Cullow from James Auchinleck of Cullow and Eupham Ogilvy, his spouse, on 26 March, 1640, in which he is styled as the third son.⁶ He obtained the lands of Clova, *m.* firstly, Margaret, daughter of John Hamilton, 1st Lord Bargeny, (*c/m* 27 May, 1667. JOHN, 4TH EARL OF AIRLIE, was *b.* in about 1699, and succeeded his brother on his death in 1731.
