

OGILVY

OF AUCHTERHOUSE

PATRICK DE OGILVY OF WESTER POWRIE, obtained the lands of Wester Powrie from his nephew Sir Patrick de Ogilvy of that Ilk, and *m.* Marjory, daughter and eventual heiress of Robert Ramsay of Auchterhouse. He was father of :

WALTER DE OGILVY OF WESTER POWRIE, succeeded and was father of :

WALTER DE OGILVY OF WESTER POWRIE AND AUCHTERHOUSE, had a Charter for the lands of Wester Powrie from the superior, Alexander de Ogilvy of that Ilk, and is then styled as son of the deceased Walter de Ogilvy, son of the deceased Patrick de Ogilvy dated 1348x1366.¹ He *m.* Isabel, daughter and heiress of Sir Malcolm de Ramsay, and is said to have been *k.* in a conflict with Duncan Stewart in 1391. He was father of :

1. Sir Alexander de Ogilvy of Auchterhouse, (*see below*).
2. Sir Walter de Ogilvy of Lintrathen, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Easter Keilour resigned in his favour by James Barclay of Kippo, on 26 November, 1404, and obtained the Barony of Lintrathen from Archibald, Earl of Douglas, for which he had a Charter of Confirmation on 15 June, 1414. He was appointed Lord High Treasurer to King James I. and founded a chaplainry for two chaplains in the parish church of St. Mary's of Auchterhouse for the salvation of the King and his predecessors, for Sir Walter himself and for those who fell at the battle of Harlaw on 3 February 1427.² He *m.* Isabel, daughter and coheiress of Sir John Glen of Inchmartin and Balmutto, *d.* in 1440 and had issue, (*see Ogilvy of Airlie*).
3. John de Ogilvy, 1st of Inverquarity, obtained the lands of Inverquarity from his brother Sir Walter de Ogilvy of Lintrathen, in 1420 and had issue, (*see Ogilvy of Inverquarity*).

SIR ALEXANDER DE OGILVY OF AUCHTERHOUSE, succeeded his father and was witness to a confirmation by Robert, Duke of Albany, of a charter by David Lindsay, Earl of

Crawford, granting an annualrent to be uplifted from his lands of Kirkton of Haltoun to the parish church of Dundee in pure and perpetual alms, dated 24 February 1406.¹ He was witness to a donation by Sir John de Erskine of Dun, granting annualrents to the Bishop of Brechin for masses to be conducted annually in memory of Robert de Erskine, his grandfather, and Thomas de Erskine, his father, dated 9 November 1409,² and *k.* at the battle of Harlaw in 1411. He was father of :

1. George de Ogilvy, who was *ksp* with his father at the battle of Harlaw in 1411.
2. Sir Patrick de Ogilvy of Auchterhouse, (*see below*).
3. Sir Andrew Ogilvy of Inchmartin, (*see Ogilvy of Inchmartin*).
4. David de Ogilvy of Kinneff, *m.* Christian, daughter and coheiress of Sir John Glen of Inchmartin, (she *m.* secondly, by February of 1445, David de Aberkirdour, Burgess of Dundee, and thirdly, David Stewart), with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Inchmartin, Strathardle, Kinnaird, Elcho and Ardargie, in the sheriffdom of Perth, thopse of Glen, in the sheriffdom of Peebles, and those of Balmutto and Petconndochy, in the sheriffdom of Fife, dated 1 June 1437, which belonged heritably to the said Christian and had been resigned by her, in her virginity, for joint-infeftment, to be held by them and their heirs, which failing, by David's heirs.³ He *d.* by 26 February 1445-46, when Christian, his relict, revoked all grants made by her as they had been under duress of her late husband, David de Ogilvy,⁴ and was father of :

4a) Alexander de Ogilvy of Kinneff and Inchmartin, had a charter from David de Aberchirder and Christian de Ogilvy, his spouse, for the half of the lands of Inchmartin on 20 December, 1440,⁵ and was a provisional heir to the Temple lands of Kinnaird in a charter dated 4 September 1441. He was contracted to marry a daughter of John de Wemyss on 31 August 1445, as part of an agreement by his uncle Sir Andrew Ogilvy and John de Wemyss for the exchange of lands desired by John and in which Alexander had been invested in the fee but it is not clear if this was ever fulfilled.⁶ On 31 July 1449, he entered into an agreement with this same uncle for the marriage of his three sisters, Margaret, Christian and Marion whereby Andrew would ensure that they were suitably married and

provided for “as thai war his awne dochteris”¹ and had *m.* by 13 April, 1464, Margaret de Strathauchin when she had a Notarial Instrument that she had disponed her lands of Kingenny to Marjory de Strathauchin, her sister, and Malcolm de Guthrie, Burgess of Dundee.² He *dsp* prior to May of 1485.

4a) Margaret de Ogilvy, *m.* Silvester de Rattray of that Ilk, and had issue.

4a) Christian de Ogilvy, *m.* _____ Lindsay and had issue,

4b) John Lindsay, who gave his consent to his mother’s grant of the lands of Duntroon and one-sixth of the lands of Inchmartin to David de Ogilvy of Inchmartin on 13 May, 1485.

4a) Marion Ogilvy, *m.* Walter Tulloch of that Ilk, and had issue.

5. Marjory de Ogilvy, *m.* David Lindsay, 3rd Earl of Crawford.

SIR PATRICK DE OGILVY OF AUCHTERHOUSE, succeeded his father and *m.* Cristine, daughter and heiress of Sir Alexander de Keith of Grandoun, with whom he had a charter for the lands and Barony of Downe and Grandoun from his father-in-law on 14 October, 1413, in which he is styled as son and heir of the deceased Alexander de Ogilvy, Sheriff of Angus.³ He had a charter for the lands of Midmar from John Brown of Midmar on 31 May 1422,⁴ was one of the Commanders of the Scottish army in France during the wars with England and was present at the battle of Pate. He *d.* by 10 March, 1438, and was father of :

1. Alexander de Ogilvy of Auchterhouse, (*see below*).

2. Walter de Ogilvy of Owres, *m.* Margaret, eldest daughter and coheiress of Walter de Fentoun of Beaufort, from whom he had a charters for the ¼ part of the lands of Ard, in the Sheriffdom of Inverness, the lands of Baky, the quarter-part of the lands of Collace and Buttergask, Cocklaw, Balmure and Drumbate, Collace, in the Sheriffdom of Aberdeen, on 10 March, 1438, in which he is styled as son of the deceased Sir Patrick de Ogilvy, Sheriff of Angus and Lord of Auchterhouse.⁵ He was father of :

2a) Isabel Ogilvy, *m.* Sir John Oliphant of Aberdalgie, (he was *k.* at the battle of Arbroath in 1445), and had issue.

2a) Walter Ogilvy, a natural son who was witness with his father to a confirmation by Hugh, Lord Fraser of Lovat, of a charter by John Stirling of Breky, to his son Mr. George Stirling for the lands of Easterbreky, on 10 December, 1476.¹

ALEXANDER DE OGILVY OF AUCHTERHOUSE, succeeded his father and resigned his lands and barony of Strathalwa and Downe, with the castle of Banff and fishing on the Dovern, in the sheriffdom of Banff, and the Lordship of Grandoune, Fodirletter and Alachane, in the sheriffdom of Aberdeen, to Margaret Ogilvy, his daughter and Sir James Stewart, her husband, which was confirmed under the Great Seal on 1 March 1467.² He is styled as deceased in a charter under the Great Seal confirming a grant by his daughter Margaret Ogilvy and James Stewart, Earl of Buchan, her husband, for the lands of Queich, Achnagray, Inchewin and Easter Auchluchry, in the barony of Kinalty, to Walter Ogilvy of Owers³ and was father of :

MARGARET DE OGILVY OF AUCHTERHOUSE, *m.* by 19 October, 1466, James Stewart, 1st Earl of Buchan, when David, Earl of Crawford, had a confirmation under the Great Seal for the office of Sheriff of Forfar which Margaret and James Stewart, Earl of Buchan, the King's uncle, had resigned in his favour.⁴ She resigned her lands and barony of Auchterhouse with the castle there, and the lands of Nevay, the baronies of Essie, Kinalty and Kettins into the King's hands for a new infeftment in favour of her husband and for which he had a charter under the Great Seal dated 22 September 1478.⁵ They had issue.
