

OGILVY

OF NEWGRANGE

FRANCES OGILVY, 1ST OF NEWGRANGE, was a younger son of James, 5th Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, and obtained the lands of Newgrange in the Lordship of Aberbrothock [Arbroath]. He *m.* firstly, Helen, only daughter and heir of David Gardyne of that Ilk, (*c/m* 14 May, 1591), from whom he was divorced ; and secondly, after December of 1596, to Elizabeth, daughter of William Adamson of Craigeruik, (she was widow of John Brown, fiar of Fordell, who had *d.* in December of 1596, and by whom she had issue), and *d.* prior to February of 1646. He was father of :

1. Sir James Ogilvy, 2nd of Newgrange, (*see below*).
2. Marjory Ogilvy, *m.* by 6 May, 1634, Thomas Tyrie of Drumkilbo,¹ and had issue.

SIR JAMES OGILVY, 2ND OF NEWGRANGE, who, with his father, had a charter from James Lord Ogilvy, for the lands of Mackrich, and others, on 23 December, 1629. He had succeeded his father by 4 February 1646, when he became bound by Parliament with William, Master of Gray, Sir John Carnegie of Craig and Sir Alexander Erskine of Dun and was a member of the Committee of War for the sheriffdom of Angus. He was retoured heir general to his father on 8 June 1647,² and then as his heir in the lands of Newgrange, within the lordship of Aberbrothock, on 18 August 1653,³ and sat in the Parliament of King Charles II., on 1 January 1661. He *m.* Margaret Guthrie, granddaughter and co-heir of Mr. Alexander Keith of Benholm, *d.* by July of 1667, when his eldest son Francis was served his heir, and was father of :

1. Sir Francis Ogilvy, 3rd of Newgrange, (*see below*).

2. John Ogilvy, is named with his brother Francis as one of the co-heirs of Mr. Alexander Keith of Benholm in an apprising by James Pearson of Balmadie of the lands of Pitnamoon and others, on 1 April 1647.¹
3. James Ogilvy, was appointed Clerk of the Regality of Arbroath, and *d.* prior to 2 September 1692.
4. Alexander Ogilvy, apprenticed to Andrew Ker, Merchant in Edinburgh, on 1 December, 1658.
5. Elizabeth Ogilvy, *m.* David Erskine of Kirkbuddo, (*c/m* 3 April, 1646), and had issue.

SIR FRANCIS OGILVY, 3RD OF NEWGRANGE, succeeded his father and was retoured heir general on 23 July, 1667,² and in the lands of Newgrange on 5 November 1684.³ He *m.* on 19 May 1653, to Anna, daughter of William Rait of Halgreen, whom he infeft in his lands of Pitnamoone on 15 April 1653,⁴ and was father of :

1. Francis Ogilvy, younger of Newgrange, (*see below*).
2. William Ogilvy, to whom his father assigned a Bond for 100 merks Scots on 4 February 1686.⁵
3. John Ogilvy, *c.* at Lunan on 24 January 1672.
4. Marie Ogilvy, *c.* at Lunan on 15 August 1659.
5. Janet Ogilvy, *c.* at Lunan on 8 November 1667.

FRANCIS OGILVY, YOUNGER OF NEWGRANGE, was appointed one of the Commissioners of Supply on 15 June 1686. He *m.* Jean, daughter of Scott of Benholm, *d.* prior to 7 May 1695, and was father of :

1. Jean Ogilvy, *m.* at Montrose on 15 June 1711, to David Grim, and had issue, a daughter Jean, *b.* in February 1713, to whom her father was served heir on 25 February 1758, and who is then styled as a granddaughter of Francis Ogilvy of Newgrange.⁶
