

# PATULLO

## OF BALHOUFFIE

**MR. GEORGE PATULLO**, of common ancestry with Patullo of Kinnochtree, was appointed Minister of Newtyle, and was father of :

**DR GEORGE PATULLO**, served as assistant to his father in his pastoral duties and was appointed by the General Assembly to attend the General of Artillery's Regiment in 1649. He was taken prisoner at Alyth with certain other ministers and was incarcerated in the Tower of London for twenty weeks until being released. He was admitted Minister of Newtyle on 19 June 1652, was transferred from there to Kingsbarns on 24 September 1663, and was appointed Provost of the Old College St. Andrews on 4 April 1677. He *m.* on 22 November 1644, to Marjory, sister of David Aytoun of Kinnaldie, *d.* in November of 1679 aged about sixty-nine years, and was father of :

**GEORGE PATULLO OF BALHOUFFIE**, practiced as a physician and obtained the lands of Balhouffie in 1677. He *d.* in October of 1698, having *m.* first, on 24 April, 1674, Katherine, daughter of Sir Robert Balfour of Denmiln,<sup>1</sup> by whom he was father of :

1. Katherine Patullo, *bap.* at Kingsbarns on 23 July 1675, and *dsp* with her nephew James Patullo of Balhouffie being served her heir on 18 November 1742.

He *m.* secondly, on 23 April 1681, to Ann, daughter of John Gibson of Durie,<sup>2</sup> (*c/m* 22 April 1681), and was father of, :

2. John Patullo of Balhouffie, (*see below*).

3. George Patullo,

4. Elizabeth Patullo,

5. Alison Patullo, *bap.* at Carnbee on 24 June 1694.

**JOHN PATULLO OF BALHOUFFIE**, succeeded his father and was served heir-general to him on 4 April 1699. He *m.* Rachel, only child of David Campbell of Keithock, (*c/m* 28 November 1710. She *m.* secondly, to Patrick Crichton, 11<sup>th</sup> of Ruthven, and *d.* at Dundee on 8 November 1772<sup>1</sup>), and *d.* in 1722. He was father of :

1. James Patullo of Balhouffie, (*see below*).
2. John Patullo, apprenticed to Thomas Fenton, Bailie of Edinburgh, on 9 February 1737,<sup>2</sup> and was admitted Burgess there by right of his master on 23 June 1742.<sup>3</sup> He became a Merchant in Edinburgh and *m.* there on 20 November 1743, Janet, daughter of Robert Simson, baker in Edinburgh.<sup>4</sup>
3. David Patullo, apprenticed to James Hunter, Deacon of the Wrights in Edinburgh, on 4 February, 1730.<sup>5</sup>
4. Elizabeth Patullo, *d.* at Edinburgh on 22 October 1768.<sup>6</sup>

**JAMES PATULLO OF BALHOUFFIE**, was apprenticed to James Blair, Merchant in Edinburgh on 30 July, 1729,<sup>7</sup> and succeeded his father to whom he was served heir-male, firstly, on 13 January 1735, and again on 3 July 1750, and then as heir general to his aunt, Katherine Patullo, on 18 November 1742. He *m.* at Bo'ness on 21 October, 1754, Elizabeth, daughter of John Erskine of Balgounie,<sup>8</sup> (she *d.* at Edinburgh on 17 January 1773<sup>9</sup>), *d.* at Edinburgh on 27 January 1773,<sup>10</sup> and was father of :

1. John Patullo, *bap.* at Bo'ness on 16 February, 1759, and *dsp.*

2. **JANET HALKET PATULLO OF BALHOUFFIE**, *c.* at Bo'ness on 8 December, 1755, and was served heir to her father in the lands of Balhouffie on 4 May 1773. She *m.* at Edinburgh on 13 June 1773, to her cousin John Patullo, the heir male of Patullo of Kinnochtree, and *d.* at Anstruther on 4 August 1802,<sup>1</sup> having had issue :

2a) **ROBERT PATULLO OF BALHOUFFIE**, *b.* in 1776. He was served heir general to his father on 23 April 1800, and to his grandaunt Jean Patullo, daughter of John Patullo of Kinnochtree, on 8 December 1819, and sold his estate thereafter settling in Edinburgh. He *m.* on 10 July, 1799, Charlotte, natural daughter of Charles Stewart, Writer, son of James Stewart of Ballado, (she *d.* at Edinburgh on 14 January 1854<sup>2</sup>), *d.* at Musselburgh on 16 July 1852,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

2b) John Patullo, *b.* on 19 January, 1801.

2b) Charles Stewart Patullo, *b.* on 12 April, 1802.

2b) Robert Patullo, *b.* on 27 September, 1803, and *d.* in 1854.

2b) Thomas Erskine Patullo, *b.* on 27 June, 1805, and *d.* in 1824.

2b) George Blair Patullo, *b.* on 5 May, 1813.

2b) Stewart Erskine Patullo, *b.* on 23 May 1820, and *d.* at Sanghai, China, on 25 March 1858.<sup>4</sup>

2b) Anstruther Patullo, *b.* on 5 August, 1823.

2b) Mary Stewart Patullo, *b.* on 14 March, 1807, and *d.* at St. Andrews on 2 November 1827.<sup>5</sup>

2b) Jane Halket Patullo, *b.* on 13 July, 1811, and *m.* at Bombay on 16 August 1842, to Rev. George Cook, Chaplain in the H.E.I.C.S.<sup>6</sup> They had issue.

2b) Emily Guthrie Patullo, *b.* on 4 September, 1815.

2b) Elizabeth Agnes Patullo, *b.* on 29 December, 1825.

3. Rachel Patullo, *m.* at Edinburgh on 10 February 1789, to Alexander Thomson, late of Jamaica and son of Alexander Thomson of Nut Hill.<sup>7</sup>
