

RATTRAY

OF KINVEAD

THOMAS RATTRAY OF LEICHILL AND KINVEAD, was a younger son of Silvester Rattray of that Ilk, and to whom the ward of the lands of Leichill was gifted on 9 December, 1506, upon the death of John Rattray of Leichill and the minority of Margaret Rattray, niece and heiress of the said John. He *m.* Marjory Johnstone, niece of George Brown, Bishop of Dunkeld, and one of the heiresses of their mother's lands of Kinvead, Moneydie and Kinnaird and as a consequence of which Bishop George granted to them a tack of these lands of 15 April, 1506.¹ He was father of :

JOHN RATTRAY OF KINVEAD, in whose favour a Precept of Clare Constat was issue for infeftment as heir to his father in the lands of Kinvead, Moneydie and Lowston on 17 May, 1536.² He was father of :

PATRICK RATTRAY OF KINVEAD, had a charter from his father for the lands of Kinvead on 12 August 1589, and in which he was infeft on 4 February 1609.³ He *m.* Katherine, daughter of Humphrey Murray, 3rd of Buchanty, (*c/m* 8 December 1574), and had issue :

1. John Rattray, is styled as eldest son and heir of his father when he and his parents resigned their rights to their share of the lands of Pittindynie to Mr. Alexander Ireland, Minister of Kinclaven, on 18 August, 1614. He *d. vita patris* prior to 11 April, 1623, when his brother Patrick Rattray was infeft in the lands of Kinvead as their father's heir.
2. Patrick Rattray of Kinvead, (*see below*).

PATRICK RATTRAY OF KINVEAD, was infeft in the lands of Kinvead as heir to his father on 11 April, 1623.⁴ He was father of :

JOHN RATTRAY, YOUNGER OF KINVEAD, who, with his father, disposed their lands of Kinvead to John Crichton, son of Sir John Crichton of Innernytie on 6 May, 1623.¹ He is described as “having gone beyond seas to the wars” in a horning raised against him by Hew Campbell of Seat dated 6 August 1630, for the fulfilling of a previous bond.²
