

# ROBERTSON

## OF CARRONVALE

**DR. DUNCAN ROBERTSON OF CARRONVALE**, of unknown ancestry,<sup>1</sup> was a Medical Practitioner and settled in Jamaica where he was appointed to the Legislative Council. He returned to Scotland in 1819 and purchased the lands of Broomage, near Falkirk, the name of which he changed to Carronvale. He *m.* at Dull on 22 November 1818, to Susan, daughter of Robert Stewart of Fincastle, *d.* in 1824 and was father of,

1. Duncan Stewart Robertson of Carronvale, (*see below*).
2. Robert Robertson, *d.* in infancy.
3. James Robertson of Roehill, *b.* 26 January 1822, and served in the 31<sup>st</sup> Regiment in India. He *dsp.*

**DUNCAN STEWART ROBERTSON OF CARRONVALE**, succeeded his father in the lands of Carronvale on his death in 1824. He *m.* on 18 September 1844, Harriet Anne Mary, daughter of Donald Ogilvy of Clova, *d.* at Lochmaben on 20 October 1856, following which his estate was sold in 1857 to John Bell Sheriff, with his will having stipulated that the proceeds should be split between his two children. He was father of,

1. Donald Ogilvy Morley Robertson, *b.* at Edinburgh on 21 June 1847. He *d.* without surviving issue on 8 October 1887.
2. Julia Cecilia Ogilvy Robertson, *b.* at Edinburgh on 20 October 1845, and *d.* at Weston-Super-Mare on 12 November 1911.

<sup>1</sup> He had a brother Mr. James Robertson who was ordained Minister of Callander, in Perthshire, on 22 September 1768, and *d.* on 19 May 1812, having *m.* on 14 August 1777, Isabella Graham by whom he left issue including a son Duncan who settled in Jamaica and like his uncle and namesake, Duncan Robertson of Carronvale, was elected to the Legislature there. He settled at Gilnock Hall where he *d.* on 9 May 1850, leaving numerous issue.
