

# ROBERTSON

## OF LETTOCH

**JOHN ROBERTSON, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF LETTOCH**, was a younger son of Alexander Robertson, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Faskally. He had an assignation of a Tack for the lands of Ledgrein from his brother Alexander Robertson, 5<sup>th</sup> of Faskally on 17 February, 1606,<sup>1</sup> which he obtained from his brother Robert Robertson on 18 February, 1614.<sup>2</sup> He obtained the lands of Lettoch from John Stewart of Pitfourie in which he was infeft in the liferent on 30 November, 1617,<sup>3</sup> and obtained the lands of Balliegowlane from William Moncreiff on 16 December, 1619.<sup>4</sup> He *m.* by February of 1614, Isobel Nasmyth and was father of,

1. John Robertson, 2<sup>nd</sup> of Lettoch, (*see below*).

2. James Robertson of Dunavour, infeft in the fee of the lands of Dunavour with his father John Robertson of Lettoch, in the liferent, on 6 June, 1627, and is then styled as a son of the said John Robertson of Lettoch by the deceased Isobel Nasmyth.<sup>5</sup> He *m.* firstly, Elizabeth Williamson, secondly, Jean, daughter of Mr. William Balneaves, Minister of Moulin, (*c/m* 20 June, 1649,<sup>6</sup>) and was father of,

2a} Anna Robertson, *m.* Patrick Small, 5<sup>th</sup> of Dirnanean, (*c/m* 15 August, 1685,<sup>7</sup>) and had issue.

2a} Janet Robertson,

3. Christian Robertson, *m.* Robert Moncreiff, portioner of Kinnaird, (*c/m* 9 February, 1636,<sup>8</sup>).

4. Isobel Robertson, who, with her sister Christian, disposed the lands of Ledgrein to their cousin William Robertson, son of their uncle Robert Robertson, on 11 November, 1648.<sup>9</sup>

**JOHN ROBERTSON, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF LETTOCH**, who, with his father, was infeft in the lands of Lettoch on 30 November, 1617, and *m.* Janet Moncur, (she was widow of George Bannerman of Middle Cardney, by whom she had issue,) with whom he was infeft in the lands of Belledrum of Pitlochry on 11 May, 1627.<sup>1</sup> He was father of,

**JOHN ROBERTSON, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF LETTOCH**, infeft in the fee of the lands of Lettoch upon his father's resignation on 15 February, 1640, and by which time he had *m.* Agnes, daughter of Alexander Robertson of Straloch.<sup>2</sup> He acted as cautioner to John Robertson, his eldest son, in his marriage contract with Margaret Butter in 1677 and was father of,

**JOHN ROBERTSON, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF LETTOCH**, *m.* Margaret, daughter of Archibald Butter of Pitlochry, (*c/m* 28 February, 1677,<sup>3</sup>). He was living in 1706 and was father of,

**JOHN ROBERTSON, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF LETTOCH**, succeeded his father and *m.* Isobel, daughter of Alexander Robertson of Kincaigie, (*c/m* 31 January, 1706.<sup>4</sup> She *d.* in September of 1759). He sold the lands of Lettoch in 1754, *d.* in December, 1758,<sup>5</sup> and was father of,

1. Margaret Robertson, *m.* at Dull 24 January, 1732, Malcolm Stewart, younger son of Donald Stewart of Sheirglass, and had issue.
2. Helen Robertson, *d.* unmarried in November of 1759.<sup>6</sup>
3. Janet Robertson, *m.* at Blair Atholl on 30 July, 1747, Thomas MacKenzie of Keinakeilich, and had issue.
4. Jean Robertson, *m.* Angus Robertson, in Dalchosnie, and with her sister Janet, acted as executor to her parents and her sister Helen.
