

ROBERTSON

OF TENNANDRIE

JOHN ROBERTSON, 1ST OF TENNANDRIE, was a son of Alexander Robertson, 1st of Faskally. He obtained the lands of Tennandrie by 5 July, 1606, when he was included in Letters of Slains for the murder of John Stewart of Bonskeid.¹ He was father of :

ALEXANDER ROBERTSON, 2ND OF TENNANDRIE, entered into a Contract with John Stewart of Pitfourie for the lands of Balnacraig on 18 January, 1620, and obtained the lands of Pitcastle from Duncan Robertson of Pitcastle, in which he was infeft on 8 May, 1628. He *m.* by 17 July, 1613, Isabell, daughter and heiress of John Robertson, Maltman and Burgess of Perth, (she *m.* secondly, Alexander Stewart, 2nd of Urquhillbeg, who was then widow of Beatrix Stewart), when she, with consent of Alexander, her husband, disposed her father's lands to Ewen Brown, Skinner Burgess of Perth,² *d.* by 28 January, 1631, and was father of :

1. John Robertson, 3rd of Tennandrie, (*see below*).
2. Donald Robertson, 1st of Balnacraig, styled as son of the deceased Alexander Robertson of Tennandrie, when he had an alienation from Fergus Fergusson of Baledmond, for the lands of Glenbrerachan and Keandnaglen on 11 May, 1631, and acquired the lands of Haughend of Dalschian from Thomas Butter of Calliemoulin in which he was infeft on 31 December, 1647.³ He acquired the lands of Balnacraig which had belonged to his father, *m.* by December of 1678, Margaret Stewart and *d.* by 1678. He was father of :

2a) John Robertson, 2nd of Balnacraig, whom his father infeft in the fee of the lands of Balnacraig on 8 April, 1668,⁴ and is then styled as his eldest son and heir. He *d.* by 1703 and had issue :

2b) Alexander Robertson, 3rd of Balnacraig, was infeft in the lands of Balnacraig as heir to his deceased father on 1 December, 1724.¹ He *m.* firstly, Janet, sister of Alexander Murray of Solziaries, (*c/m* at Kirkmichael 1 July, 1687²). He *m.* secondly, Ann, second daughter of John Stewart of Bonskeid, (*c/m* 23 March, 1703³), thirdly, on 19 February, 1708, Beatrix, daughter of Rev. Robert Stewart, 1st of Killiechassie, and *d.* prior to 1740. He was father of :

2c) John Robertson, who *dsp vita patris* in March of 1731.

2c) Donald Robertson, 4th of Balnacraig, succeeded his father and *m.* in around 1740, Isabel Stewart. He was father of :

2d) Alexander Robertson, 5th of Balnacraig, succeeded his father and sold the lands of Balnacraig to Henry Butter of Pitlochry who was thereafter infeft on 17 August, 1781.

2d) John Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 24 December, 1743.

2d) Donald Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 24 December, 1743.

2d) Patrick Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 11 March, 1760.

2d) James Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 13 March, 1747, and *d.* young.

2d) James Robertson, *c.* at Moulin in 1757.

2d) Elizabeth Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 21 June, 1742.

2d) Jean Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 14 December, 1748.

2d) Anne Robertson, *c.* at Moulin on 21 March, 1751.

2c) Thomas Robertson, who was father of :

2d) John Robertson, a natural son by Isabel Robertson in Derculich who was *c.* at Dull on 4 June, 1744.

2c) Patrick Robertson, a son by his father's third marriage who was *c.* at Dull on 18 April, 1734.

2c) Christian Robertson, *m.* at Blair Atholl on 6 August, 1747, John MacKenzie of Reinand, and had issue.

2c) Beatrix Robertson, *c.* at Dull on 6 July, 1731.

2b) Margaret Robertson, *m.* Donald Stewart of Duntaullich, (*c/m* 17 April, 1686⁴), and had issue.

2b) Beatrice Robertson, *m.* James Robertson, eldest son and heir of Donald Robertson of Kindrochit, (*c/m* 15 July, 1703¹), and had issue.

2a) Alexander Robertson, styled as brother of John Robertson, fiar of Balnacraig, in 1665.

2a) Donald Robertson, styled as son of Donald Robertson of Balnacraig in 1669.

3. Alexander Robertson, had a grant of the lands of Auchinrewie from Donald Robertson, son of the deceased Robert Robertson of Struan, on 12 March, 1642, and is then styled as son of the deceased Alexander Robertson of Tennandrie.²

4. James Robertson, witness to an Instrument of Sasine for the lands of Glengennet and Edraharvie in favour of his brother Donald Robertson on 30 June, 1649.³

5. Isabel Robertson, *m.* John Robertson, eldest son and heir of Robert Rioch Robertson, portioner of Cultalony, (*c/m* 10 July, 1630⁴).

6. Christian Robertson, *m.* John Stewart, son of Alexander Stewart of Urrardbeg, (*c/m* 28 January, 1631⁵).

JOHN ROBERTSON, 3RD OF TENNANDRIE, retoured heir to his father in the lands of Tennandrie and Balnacraig, on 26 February, 1635, and was a Royalist supporter during the civil war.⁶ He *m.* Marion, daughter of James Ogilvy of Newton of Glenisla, (*c/m* 14 January, 1632⁷), was *k.* at the battle of Tippermuir in 1644, and was father of :

1. Alexander Robertson, 4th of Tennandrie, (*see below*).

2. Donald Robertson, had a Discharge from John Scott of Glenalbert in implementation of a contract of marriage between the said John and Elspeth Scott, his sister, and for granting a Bond of Provision to the children of the marriage on 24 January, 1693, in which he is styled as brother to Alexander Robertson of Tennandrie. He *m.* the said Elspeth, daughter of John Scott, 4th of Glenalbert, and was father of :

2a) Agnes Robertson,

2a) Isabel Robertson, both of whom had a Bond of Provision from their maternal uncle John Scott of Glenalbert on 24 January, 1694, and are styled as only children of their father.¹

3. John Robertson of Cultalony, infeft in the lands of Easter Dunfallandies which he had acquired from John Butter on 12 April, 1675, and is then styled as brother to Alexander Robertson of Tennandrie,² and acquired the sixth-part of the lands of Cultalony from John Robertson of Cultalony, in which he was infeft on 15 March, 1688. He *m.* firstly to a woman whose name has not been ascertained, by whom he had issue ; and secondly, Elizabeth Robertson and *d.* prior to August of 1715. He was father of :

3a) Donald Robertson of Cultalony, to whom his father assigned his liferent right to the lands of Cultalony on 10 February, 1693.³ He *m.* Catherine, daughter of Thomas Menzies of Pittarock, (*c/m* 10 February, 1693,⁴) and in implementation of their contract of marriage he obtained the lands of Pittarock from his father-in-law in which he was infeft on 10 February, 1693. He was father of :

3b) John Robertson of Cultalony, *m.* at Kenmore on 1 December, 1729, Jean, daughter of Patrick Campbell of Easter Schian, and apparently *dsp.*

3b) Charles Robertson, who, with his brother Daniel, had a bond of £50 from their brother John Robertson, younger of Cultalony, on 11 February, 1730.

3b) Daniel Robertson,

3b) William Robertson, who *dsp* prior to 11 February, 1730.

3b) Elspeth Robertson, *b.* in 1697.

3a) Isobel Robertson, *m.* Patrick Butter of Kinnaird, and had issue.

3a) Janet Robertson,

3a) Jean Robertson, all of which daughters granted a renunciation dated 8 August, 1715, of all rights they may have to the wadset of the lands of Tennandrie in connection with a contract of wadset entered into by their now deceased father, John Robertson of Cultalony, Donald Robertson, now of Cultalony, and Alexander Robertson of Tennandrie.

ALEXANDER ROBERTSON, 4TH OF TENNANDRIE, succeeded his father and was infeft in the lands of Pitcastle as heir to his grandfather Alexander Robertson, of Tennandrie, on 7 January, 1666.⁵ He was a member of an assise for the retour of Margaret Fergusson, relict

of John Fergusson of Pitfourie, confirming her as lawful agnate on the mother's side to her children on 18 December, 1695, and *m.* Jean, daughter of John Henderson of Barbastardoran, (*c/m* dated at the Burn of Balmonth and Dunkeld on 26 September & 15 October, 1656,¹). He was father of,

1. **JOHN ROBERTSON, 5TH OF TENNANDRIE**, succeeded his father and *m.* first, Katherine, daughter of William Oliphant, 5th of Culteuchar, (*c/m* 3 February, 1687). He *m.* secondly, Lydia MacIntosh, who is styled as his relict in his Testament and *dsp* in April of 1692² being succeeded in the lands of Tennandrie by his brother Alexander.
2. Alexander Robertson, 6th of Tennandrie, (*see below*).
3. Thomas Robertson, *c.* at Logierait on 22 April, 1675.
4. James Robertson, *b.* in 1682.
5. Patrick Robertson, styled as "brother of Tenandry" when present at the Court of the lands of Dalcapon on 15 March, 1711.
6. Isabel Robertson, *m.* Alexander Fergusson of Ballyeokan, (*c/m* 7 June, 1678,³) and had issue.

ALEXANDER ROBERTSON, 6TH OF TENNANDRIE, acted as executor to his elder brother John Robertson in and succeeded to the lands of Tennandrie. He *m.* Isobel, third daughter of Patrick Inglis of Byres, (*c/m* 10 January, 1690,⁴) and *dsp* in March of 1723,⁵ with the lands of Tennandrie having become burdened and sold to John Stewart, eldest son of James Stewart of Urrard who was infeft therein on 28 April, 1715.
