

STEWART

OF BINNIE

JOHN STEWART OF SHAWOOD, of uncertain ancestry, *m.* firstly, Margaret Cathcart, by whom he was father of,

1. William Stewart of Shawood, succeeded his father.
2. **ROBERT STEWART, 1ST OF EAST BINNIE**, was admitted an Advocate and acquired the lands of Easter Binnie which he afterwards disposed to his half-brother, John Stewart.
3. Janet Stewart, *m.* Hugh Crawford of Smeddiehall, (*c/m* 22 January 1662).
4. Jane Stewart, *m.* on 26 May 1669, to John Wallace of Holmston.
5. Marion Stewart, *m.* John Ritchie of Sandiford, (*c/m* 19 April 1671).

He *m.* secondly, on 14 June 1679, to Liliast, daughter of Borthwick of Halerind,¹ and had issue;

6. John Stewart, 2nd of Easter Binnie, (*see below*).
7. Anne Stewart, *m.* firstly, at Edinburgh on 29 August 1708, to Alexander Bruce of Gartlet,² (he was widow of Grisel, daughter of James Laffrie, whom he had *m.* on 2 April 1700. He *d.* on 22 September 1715), and secondly, on 2 December 1716, to Mr. Archibald Campbell, Minister of Weem, and had issue.

JOHN STEWART, 2ND OF EAST BINNIE, to whom his half-brother Robert Stewart conveyed his lands of East Binnie. He *m.* on 4 June 1710, to Jean, daughter of Muirhead of Lachop,¹ *d.* at Binnie on 24 May 1760² and was father of,

1. Robert Stewart, 3rd of Binnie, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Stewart, *b.* on 26 August 1721.
3. John Stewart of East Craigs, acquired the lands of Easter Craigs and was appointed deputy Governor of Edinburgh Castle. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 29 December 1765, to Janet McVey,³ (she survived him and *d.* at Charlotte Square, Edinburgh, on 19 November 1813⁴), and was father of

4. James Stewart, served as Surgeon in Queen’s Own Dragoons and *m.* at Edinburgh on 11 June 1779, to Elizabeth, daughter of George Dunbar of Leuchold.⁶
5. Margaret Stewart, *b.* on 8 May 1711.
6. Jean Stewart, *b.* on 12 September 1713.
7. Elizabeth Stewart, *b.* on 17 April 1715.
8. Robina Stewart, *b.* on 27 April 1717.

10. Liliastewart, *b.* on 20 April 1729 and *m.* on 29 January 1764, Henry Moir of Auchterloch. They had issue.

ROBERT STEWART, 3RD OF BINNIE, *b.* on 27 February 1719 and succeeded his father on his death in 1760. He *m.* at Binns on 11 December 1766, to Magdalen, sister of Sir Robert Dalrymple of Binns,¹ *d.* at Binnie on 7 April 1786² and was father of,

1. **ROBERT STEWART, 4TH OF BINNIE**, *b.* on 15 July 1769 and succeeded his father on his death in 1786. He *dsp* at Binnie on Saturday 4 September 1802,³ and was succeeded by his only surviving brother, John.

2. James Stewart, *b.* on 8 March 1775.

3. John Stewart, 5th of Binnie, (*see below*).

4. Helen Stewart, *b.* on 19 August 1768 and *d.* unmarried at Maitland Street, Edinburgh, on 27 July 1849.⁴

5. Jean Stewart, *b.* on 2 November 1770 and *m.* at Binnie on 27 December 1795, to David Falconer of Carlowrie,⁵ (he *d.* on 14 June 1842). She *d.* in 1837, having had issue which succeeded to the lands of Binnie;

5a) George Falconer of Carlowrie, *b.* on 27 January 1800 and was served heir to his father on 1 November 1842. He *m.* firstly, in 1827, Isabella Christian, daughter of John Taubman of the Nunnery, Isle of Man, (she *dsp* in 1831). He *m.* secondly, on 14 March 1842, Frances Georgina, daughter of George Mercer of Gorthy, *d.* on 20 August 1870, and was father of,

- 5b) **GEORGE MERCER FALCONER STEWART OF BINNIE**, *b.* on 10 June 1844, and succeeded to the lands of Binnie. He *m.* on 8 September 1881, Louise, daughter of Vincenzo Bartoleuai, Rome, *d.* in 1921 and had issue;
- 5c) Ronald Dundas Falconer, *b.* on 4 July 1882.
- 5c) Cyril Falconer, *b.* on 14 May 1884.
- 5c) Percy George Falconer, *b.* on 24 November 1886.
- 5b) William David Falconer, *b.* on 15 July 1845, and *dsp* in Ceylon.

JOHN STEWART, 5TH OF BINNIE, *b.* on 4 March 1776 and succeeded his brother, Robert, in the lands of Binnie on his death without issue in 1802. He *m.* at Edinburgh on 9 February 1809, to Janet Johnstone Houston, daughter of James Dundas, H.E.I.C.S., son of Dundas of Philipston, (she *d.* on 22 December 1879), and *dsp* at Binnie House on 7 June 1850.
