

STEWART

OF BURRAY

WILLIAM STEWART OF MAINS, *m.* Barbara, daughter and heir of James Stewart of Burray, and had issue :

1. James Stewart, fiar of Mains, to whom his father granted a charter for the lands of Cuthilhill and Seafield, in the sheriffdom of Fife, on 26 April 1647. He *dsp* by 4 July 1662 when his brother, William, had a charter for these lands as his heir.
2. William Stewart of Mains, succeeded his father and had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Cuthilhill and Seafield dated 4 July 1662.¹ He was served heir to this same brother in the lands of Burray on 20 August 1661.²
3. Sir Archibald Stewart, 1st Baronet of Burray, (*see below*).
4. Jean Stewart, *m.* Sir James Sinclair of Murckle, (*c/m* in October of 1634).
5. Anna Stewart, *m.* Patrick Graham, 1st of Graemeshall, (*c/m* 26 January 1638. He survived her and *m.* secondly, to Margaret Sinclair ; and *d.* on 16 January 1675), and *d.* in March of 1657.

SIR ARCHIBALD STEWART, 1ST BARONET OF BURRAY, to whom his father granted a charter for the lands of Garth dated 24 July 1657, and succeeded to the lands of Burray. He was created a Baronet on 4 November 1687. He *m.* firstly, in 1657, to Isobel, daughter of William Moray, 10th of Abercairney, (she *d.* on 3 August 1683), and secondly, on 16 September 1683, to Catherine Rowsay, (she *d.* on 26 June 1684). He *d.* on 13 May 1689 and was father of :

1. Sir Archibald Stewart, 2nd Baronet of Burray, (*see below*).
2. James Stewart, *bap.* on 14 October 1663.

SIR ARCHIBALD STEWART, 2ND BARONET OF BURRAY, succeeded his father in his death and was served his heir in the barony of Burray on 11 June 1690.¹ He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Archibald Stewart, 1st of Dunern, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to David Leslie, 4th Lord Lindores ; and *d.* in October 1719), *d.* in 1704 and was father of :

1. Sir James Stewart. 3rd Baronet of Burray, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Stewart, who became a Merchant in Amsterdam and *dsp* in October 1743,² his sister Mary Stewart being served heir to him on 15 December 1743.
3. Mary Stewart, was served heir to her brother Alexander Stewart on 15 December 1743 and then as heir general to her eldest brother, Sir James Stewart, on 22 May 1753. She *m.* firstly, to Mr. George Aytoun, and secondly, on 30 May 1747, to Thomas Aytoun, younger son of John Aytoun of Kinnaldie.

SIR JAMES STEWART, 3RD BARONET OF BURRAY, succeeded his father and was served heir general to both his father, Sir Archibald, and his grandfather, Sir Archibald, on 13 March 1718. He *m.* on 11 February 1721, to Anne, daughter of David Carmichael of Balmedie, (she *dsp* at Edinburgh on 19 January 1779³), and being taken on suspicion of Jacobite sympathies and committed to prison, he *dsp* in Southward Gaol, London, on 31 August 1746.⁴
