

STEWART

OF DOUNE & MORAY

SIR JAMES STEWART, 1ST OF DOUNE, was fourth son of Andrew Stewart, 2nd Lord Avendale. He was appointed a gentleman in the King's House for the duration of his life in 1524¹ and had a gift under the Privy Seal on 31 May, 1529, of all the goods belonging to James Edmonstone who was at the horn for the slaughter of Patrick Ferguson and in which he is styled as brother german to Henry, Lord Methven.² He obtained the lands of Beith and Doune, *m.* Margaret, daughter of John, Lord Lindsay of the Byres, (she was widow of Richard Stewart, 3rd Lord Innermeath, by whom she had issue), and was murdered by Sir William Edmonston of Duntreath on Whitsunday, 1547. He was father of,

1. James Stewart, 2nd of Doune, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Stewart, *m.* Helen, daughter of Alexander Achesoun of Gossford, with whom he had Gift under the Privy Seal of the customs of Newhaven and Preston on 22 September, 1569, and is then styled as brother of Sir James Stewart of Doune.³ He was elected Lord Provost of Edinburgh in 1578 and is said to have *dsp.*
3. Henry Stewart of Buchlyvie, *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of John Robertson, portioner of Aberdour, (*c/m* 27 January, 1567), and had issue :
 - 3a) James Stewart of Burray, succeeded to these lands and *m.* Janet, daughter of Roderick MacLeod of Lewis. He *d.* on 1 May, 1632, and was father of :
 - 3b) Barbara Stewart of Burray, served heir to her father in the lands of Cuttlehill on 2 May, 1632, and by which time she had *m.* William Stewart, 1st of Mains, younger son of Sir Alexander Stewart, 6th of Garlies. They had issue.
 - 3a) William Stewart, *m.* in 1615, Agnes, daughter of William Schaw, and *d.* without apparent issue in 1652.
 - 3a) Bernard Stewart,

4. Margaret Stewart, *m.* Mr. James Ogilvy of Balfour, (*c/m* 6 February, 1554. He was widow of Elizabeth Stewart by whom he had issue ; and *m.* thirdly, to Margaret, daughter of Patrick, 5th Lord Gray, the then widow of Patrick, Master of Ruthven), and had issue.
5. Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* Robert Crichton of Cluny and Eliok, (he *m.* secondly, Agnes, daughter of John Mowbray of Barnbogle, by 20 May, 1575, and thirdly, Isobella, daughter of David Borthwick of Lochill, (she *m.* after his death to James Stirling, 1st of Feddall), with whom he had a charter for the middle-third part of the lands of Rossie-Ochill on 22 May, 1558,¹ and had issue.
6. Marjory Stewart, *m.* James Ross, brother of John Ross of Craigie, (*c/m* 29 September 1539²).

SIR JAMES STEWART, 2ND OF DOUNE, had a charter for the lands of Doune from Queen Mary on 6 March, 1563, which were erected into a Lordship by King James VI. on 24 November, 1581. He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Archibald Campbell, 4th Earl of Argyll, (*c/m* at Edinburgh on 11 November, 1562,) *d.* on 20 July, 1590, and was father of :

1. James Stewart, 2nd Earl of Moray, (*see below*).
2. Henry Stewart, Lord St-Colme, styled as second son of his father in a charter of confirmation by King James VI. for the lands of Mochaster, Portnellan, with Loch Venacher and Easter Dullater, on 24 November, 1579, following upon the forfeiture of Michael Balfour of Burleigh.³ He had a charter from his father for the Abbey of St. Colme with all its lands on 23 August, 1584, was created a Peer and Lord of Parliament on 7 March, 1611, and *m.* Jean, daughter of John Stewart, 5th Earl of Atholl, (*c/m* in December of 1603. She *m.* secondly, Nicol Bellenden of Standenflat, and *d.* on 19 July, 1623). He *d.* on 12 July, 1612, and had issue :
 - 2a) James Stewart, 2nd Lord St-Colme, served heir to his father on 27 October, 1642, and served as a Colonel in the army of Gustavus Adolphus. He *dsp* after which his estate reverted to the Earls of Moray as heirs male.
3. Alexander Stewart, granted a renunciation of the lands of Leuchat's Beath to James Spittall, of Leuchat, on 23 May, 1599, in which he is styled as third son of the deceased James Stewart of Doune.
4. Archibald Stewart, a provisional heir to his brother Henry in the lands of Mochaster on 24 November, 1579.
5. John Stewart, who murdered John Gibb in 1608 and for which he was sentenced to be beheaded in December of 1609.

6. Mary Stewart, *m.* Sir John Wemyss of that Ilk, (*c/m* in August of 1581. He was widow of Margaret, daughter of William Douglas, 6th Earl of Morton, whom he had *m.* in 1574), and had issue.
7. Jean Stewart, *m.* Simon Fraser, 7th Lord Lovat, (*c/m* 4 April, 1596. He was widow of Margaret, eldest daughter of Sir Colin MacKenzie of Kintail, and *d.* on 3 April, 1633), and had issue.

JAMES STEWART, 2ND EARL OF MORAY, the "*Bonnie Earl o' Moray*," *m.* Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of James Stewart, 1st Earl of Moray, (she *d.* on 18 November, 1591), in right of whom he succeeded to the honours of Moray and was *k.* by the Earl of Huntly at Donibristle on 7 February, 1592. He had issue :

1. James Stewart, 3rd Earl of Moray, (*see below*).
2. Sir Francis Stewart, was a substitute heir to his brother James Stewart in the Earldom of Moray on 17 April, 1611.
3. Margaret Stewart, *m.* firstly in September of 1603, Charles, 1st Earl of Nottingham, Lord High Admiral of England, (he *d.* on 14 December, 1624) ; and secondly, William, Viscount Monson. She *d.* on 4 August, 1639.
4. Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* in 1605, John Abernethy, 8th Lord Saltoun.
5. Grizel Stewart, *m.* Sir Robert Innes, of that Ilk, (*c/m* 18 December, 1611), and had issue.

JAMES STEWART, 3RD EARL OF MORAY, succeeded on the death of his father and, with the assistance of the King, was reconciled with his father's murderer the Earl of Huntly. He *m.* Ann, eldest daughter of George Gordon, 1st Marquess of Huntly, (*c/m* 2 October, 1607). He *d.* at Darnaway on 6 August, 1638, and was father of :

1. James Stewart, 4th Earl of Moray, (*see below*).
2. Margaret Stewart, *m.* on 24 April, 1640, Sir James Grant of Grant, (he was *b.* on 24 June, 1616, and was buried on 10 October, 1663), *d.* on 18 December, 1662, and had issue.

JAMES STEWART, 4TH EARL OF MORAY, succeeded his father and *m.* Margaret, eldest daughter of Alexander, 1st Earl of Home, (*c/m* 18 October, 1627). He *d.* on 4 March, 1653, and was father of :

1. James Stewart, Lord Doune, who *dsp vita patris*.
2. Alexander Stewart, 5th Earl of Moray, (*see below*).

3. Francis Stewart, of Cullelo, obtained these lands and *dsp*.
4. John Stewart, *c.* at Edinburgh on 31 January, 1639.
5. Archibald Stewart, 1st of Dunearn, *c.* at Edinburgh on 28 February, 1643, and obtained the lands of Dunearn. He had issue, (*See Stewart of Dunearn*).
6. Mary Stewart, *b.* on 21 July, 1629, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 13 May, 1650, Archibald Campbell, 9th Earl of Argyll, (he was *b.* on 26 February, 1629, and *m.* secondly on 28 January, 1670, Anne, daughter of Kenneth MacKenzie, 1st Earl of Seaforth, and was executed for his part in the Monmouth rising on 30 June, 1685). She *d.* in May of 1680 and had issue.
7. Margaret Stewart, *m.* Alexander Sutherland, Lord Duffus, (*c/m* 12 April, 1656), and *d.* in January of 1667.
8. Henrietta Stewart, *m.* Sir Hugh Campbell, 4th of Cawdor, (*c/m* dated at Darnaway on 28 January, 1662. He *d.* on 11 March, 1716), and had issue.
9. Anne Stewart, *c.* at Edinburgh on 7 June, 1644, and *d.* young.
10. Anne Stewart, *c.* at Edinburgh on 8 January, 1650, and *m.* in 1666, David Ross of Balnagowan.

ALEXANDER STEWART, 5TH EARL OF MORAY, *c.* at Edinburgh on 8 May, 1634, and succeeded his father. He *m.* Emelia, daughter of Sir William Balfour of Pitcullo and Lieutenant of the Tower of London, (she *d.* in January of 1683), *d.* on 1 November, 1700, and was father of :

1. James Stewart, Lord Doune, *m.* Katherine, daughter of Sir Lionel Talmash, by his wife Elizabeth, Countess of Dysart. He *d. vita patris* in 1685 and had issue :
 - 1a) Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* at London on 30 November, 1698, to Alexander Grant of Grant, (he *m.* secondly on 7 April, 1709, Anne, daughter of John Smith, Speaker of the House of Commons, and *dsp* on 19 August, 1719), and *dsp* on 22 April, 1708.
 - 1a) Emelia Stewart, *m.* firstly, Alexander Fraser, of Strichen, (he *d.* on 3 November, 1699), and secondly, John Lindsay, 19th Earl of Crawford, (he *d.* on 4 January, 1712). She *d.* on 18 February and was buried at Holyrood Abbey, Edinburgh, on 21 February, 1711.
2. **CHARLES STEWART, 6TH EARL OF MORAY**, was created a Baronet on 23 September, 1681, with remainder to the heirs male of his body and succeeded his father on his death in 1700. He *m.* Anne, daughter of Archibald Campbell, 9th Earl of Argyll, (she was widow of Richard Maitland, 4th Earl of Lauderdale, whom she had *m.* on 1 July, 1678, and who had *d.* at Paris in 1695 ; and *d.* on 18 September, 1734, aged 76 years). He *dsp* at Donibristle on 7 October, 1735.
3. John Stewart, who *dsp*.
4. Francis Stewart, 7th Earl of Moray, (*see below*).

5. Henry Stewart, *c.* at Dyke on 22 January, 1675.
6. Mary Stewart, *c.* at Dyke in July of 1665.

FRANCIS STEWART, 7TH EARL OF MORAY, succeeded his brother on his death in 1735 and *m.* firstly, Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Moray of Drumcairn. He *m.* secondly, Jean, daughter of John Elphinstone, 4th Lord Balmerino, (she *d.* at Donibristle on 13 May, 1739), and *d.* at Donibristle on 11 December, 1739, in his 66th year.¹ He was father of :

1. James Stewart, 8th Earl of Moray, (*see below*).
2. John Stewart of Pittendreich, had the command of a Company of the 54th Foot on 8 June, 1745, and was taken prisoner at the battle of Prestonpans in September of that year. He afterwards served with the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in Lord Drumlanrig's Regiment in service of the States of Holland and *d.* unmarried at Musselburgh on 13 August, 1796,² with his great-nephew, Francis, Earl of Moray, being served his heir in his lands of Pittendreich on 16 May 1815.
3. Francis Stewart of Pittendreich, and served as Lieutenant-Colonel in Honeywoods Dragoons. He *m.* on 4 January, 1745, Helen, daughter of Alexander Montgomery, 9th Earl of Eglinton,³ (she *d.* at Edinburgh on 14 January, 1747), *d.* in Germany in August of 1760⁴ and was father of :
 - 3a} Francis Stewart, *d.* at Rheims, in France, and was buried on 2 November 1768.⁵
 - 3a} Ann Stewart, *m.* in November of 1783, to Rev. O'Berne.
4. Archibald Stewart, attained the rank of Captain in the Royal Navy and *d.* unmarried at his house in Harley Street, London, on 20 February, 1795.⁶
5. Henry Stewart, served as a Major in a Regiment of Dragoons and *dsp* in Germany in 1761.
6. Anne Stewart, *m.* John Stewart of Blairhall, and *d.* at Edinburgh on 17 January, 1783.⁷
7. Amelia Stewart, *m.* Sir Peter Halket of Pitferran, (he was *k.* at Fort Du Quesne, America, on 9 July, 1755), and *d.* at Inveresk on 18 May, 1781. They had issue.

JAMES STEWART, 8TH EARL OF MORAY, succeeded his father on his death in 1739 and *m.* firstly in December of 1734, Grace, daughter of George Lockhart of Carnwath, (she

was widow of John Gordon, 3rd Earl of Aboyne, who had *d.* in 1732, and *d.* on 17 November, 1738). He *m.* secondly on 24 April, 1740, Margaret, second daughter of David, 3rd Earl of Wemyss, (she *d.* at Drylaw on 31 August, 1779), and *d.* at Donibristle on 5 July, 1767, in his 59th year.¹ He was father of :

1. Francis Stewart, 9th Earl of Moray, (*see below*).
3. James Stewart, *b.* on 17 April, 1741, and led a military life, being appointed Lieutenant-Governor of Fort George. He *d.* unmarried at Fort George on 4 May, 1808.²
4. David Stewart, attained the rank of Lieutenant in the Royal Navy and *d.* at Budley Salterton, Devonshire, on 11 June, 1784, in his 39th year.³ He *m.* Elizabeth Begg and had issue :
 - 4a) John Stewart, served as a Captain in the H.E.I.C.S., and *d.* at Nuggur, in India, on 26 June 1804, of a fever.⁴
 - 4a) Elizabeth Sutherland Stewart, *d.* at Edinburgh on 19 December 1840.⁵
5. A son, who was *b.* and *d.* at Edinburgh on 5 November, 1752.
6. Euphemia Stewart, *c.* at Edinburgh on 28 August, 1735, and *d.* unmarried at her house near Edinburgh on 3 October, 1770.⁶

FRANCIS STEWART, 9TH EARL OF MORAY, *b.* at Edinburgh on 31 December, 1736, succeeded his father and *m.* on 28 June, 1763, Jane, eldest daughter of John, 12th Lord Gray, (she *d.* on 19 February, 1786). He *d.* at his house at Drumsheugh on 28 August, 1810,⁷ and was father of :

1. James Stewart, Lord Doune, *b.* at Edinburgh on 2 March 1765, and *d.* at Bath in July of 1766.
2. John Stewart, Lord Doune, *b.* at Edinburgh on 11 February 1768, and *d.* at Drumsheugh on 6 July 1791.⁸
3. Francis Stewart, Lord Doune, (*see below*).

4. Archibald Stewart, was a twin with his brother Francis and was *b.* at Edinburgh on 2 February 1771, and led a military life. He *m.* on 7 March 1793, to Cornelia, youngest daughter of Edmund Morton Pleydell of Milbourn,¹ (she *d.* at Blandford on 1 March 1830²), *d.* at Blandford on 30 October 1832, “of a lingering illness,”³ and was father of :

4a) Francis Archibald Stewart of Balmerino, *b.* on 5 December 1793, and *d.* unmarried at Blandford, Dorset, on 14 July 1875.⁴

4a) John Morton Stewart, *b.* on 20th and *c.* on 21 April 1795, and served as a Captain in the 7th Royal Fusiliers. He *d.* unmarried at Bath on 7 July 1840.⁵

4a) James William Stewart, *b.* on 21 February 1797, and *d.* unmarried at Eagle House, Blandford, on 22 December 1850.⁶

4a) Edmund Luttrell Stewart, *b.* on 21 February 1798, and *c.* at Winterbourne on 27th May following. He was appointed Rector of Houghton but relinquished his charge in 1852 on account of the weather there being too humid for an asthmatic condition, and afterwards returned to Blandford. He *m.* at Knowle on 2 September 1834, to Elizabeth, daughter of Rev. J. L. Jackson, Rector of Knowle,⁷ (she *d.* at Blandford on 28 March 1885⁸), *d.* on Friday 5 November 1869,⁹ and was father of :

4b) **EDMUND ARCHIBALD STEWART, 15TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 5 November 1840, and succeeded to the Gray estates in 1878 upon which he assumed the additional name of Gray although he discontinued this upon succeeding his cousin George in Earldom of Moray on his death without issue in 1895. He *m.* on 6 September 1877, to Anna Mary, daughter of Rev. George Collinson, vicar of St. James, Clapham, (she *d.* at Ainslie Place, Edinburgh, on 29 January 1915¹⁰), and *dsp* on 11 June 1901, being succeeded by his brother Francis.

4b) **FRANCIS JAMES STEWART, 16TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 24 November 1842, and succeeding his brother Edmund in the Gray estates on his succession as Earl of Moray in 1895, he assumed the surname of Gray although reassume that of

Stuart/Stewart upon succeeding as Earl of Moray in 1901. He *m.* on 24 June 1879, to Gertrude Floyer, daughter of Rev. Francis Smith, rector of Tarrant Rushton, and *d.* at Edinburgh on Saturday 20 November 1909.¹

4b) **MORTON GRAY STEWART, 17TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 16 April and *c.* on 26 May 1855, and succeeded his brother Francis as Earl on his death without issue in 1909. He *m.* on 17 December 1890, to Edith Douglas, daughter of Captain George Palmer R.N., (she *d.* at Doune Lodge on 17 April 1945²), *d.* at Darnaway Castle on Saturday 19 April 1930,³ and was father of :

4c) **FRANCIS DOUGLAS STEWART, 18TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 10 July 1892, and succeeded his father on his death in 1930. He *m.* on 21 June 1924, to Barbara, daughter of John Archibald Murray, and *d.* without male issue at Darnaway Castle on Friday 9 July 1943.⁴ He was father of :

4d) Mary Anne Stewart, *b.* on 23 June 1926.

4d) Sarah Gray Stewart, *b.* on 23 September 1928.

4d) Arabella Stewart, *b.* on 11 July 1934.

4c) **ARCHIBALD JOHN MORTON STEWART, 19TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 14 November 1894, and succeeded his brother Francis as Earl on his death in 1943. He *m.* on 28 January 1922, to Mabel Helen Maud, daughter of Benjamin Wilson, *d.* on 27 March 1974, and was father of :

4d) **DOUGLAS JOHN MORAY STEWART, 20TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 13 February 1928, and succeeded his father on his death in 1974.

4d) Charles Rodney Standford Stewart, *b.* on 30 May 1933.

4d) James Wallace Wilson Stewart, *b.* on 30 May 1933.

4d) Hermione Mary Morton Stewart, *b.* on 2 March 1927.

4c) James Gray Stewart, 1st Viscount Findhorn, *b.* on 9 February 1897, and was raised to the peerage as Viscount Stuart of Findhorn on 20 November 1959. He *m.* at Edensor on Saturday 4 August 1923, to Rachel, daughter of Victor Cavendish, 9th Duke of Devonshire, (she *d.* on 2 October 1977), and *d.* on 20 February 1971, having had issue.

4c) Hermione Moray Stewart, *b.* on 13 October 1899, and *m.* Admiral Sir Henry Buller.

4b) Cornelia Stewart, *c.* on 2 September 1845, and *m.* on 29 July 1873, to Rev. William Henry Augustus Truell, of Clonmannan.

4a) Douglas Wynne Stewart, *b.* on 8 May and *c.* on 20 April 1802. He *m.* at St. Swithin's, Kingsgate, Winchester, on 4 February 1842, to Marcia, youngest daughter of Francis Fownes Luttrell, Chairman of the Board of Customs,¹ (she *d.* at Bournemouth on 14 February 1870²), *d.* at Brighton on 10 December 1855,³ and was father of :

4b) Douglas Moray Stuart, *b.* on 22 January 1843, and *d.* unmarried at Godalming, Surrey, on Thursday 26 November 1863.⁴

4a) George Gray Stewart, *b.* on 20 April 1805, took Holy Orders and *d.* unmarried on 11 June 1835, of a "rapid consumption."⁵

5. Charles Stewart, *d.* unmarried.

4. Grisel Margaret Stewart, *b.* on 29 July 1766.

5. Grace Stewart, *b.* on 10 February 1770, and *m.* on 10 July 1789, to George Douglas of Cavers.⁶

6. Ann Stewart, *b.* on 14 April 1782, and *d.* on 18 April 1837.⁷

FRANCIS STEWART, 10TH EARL OF MORAY, *b.* on 2 February 1771, and being the elder of twins, he succeeded his father on his death and was served his heir in the Earldom of Moray on 26 January 1811. He *d.* at Darnaway on 12 January 1848,⁸ *m.* firstly, at Bellevue on Monday 19 January 1795, to Lucy, second daughter of Major-General John Scott of Balcomie,⁹ (she *d.* at Edinburgh on 3 August 1798), and by her he was father of :

1. **FRANCIS STEWART, 11TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 7 November 1795, succeeded his father and was served his heir on 1 February 1849. He *d.* unmarried at Hayes Park, Middlesex, on 6 May 1859,¹⁰ being succeeded by his brother John.

2. **JOHN STEWART, 12TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 25 January 1797, and succeeded his brother Francis as Earl on his death in 1859. He *d.* unmarried at Doune Lodge on 8 November 1867.¹

He *m.* secondly, at Edinburgh on 8 January 1801, to Margaret Jane, daughter of Sir Philip Ainslie of Pilton, Baronet,² (she *d.* at Willoughby House, Cheltenham, on Monday 3 April 1837³), and by her he had further issue :

3. James Stuart, *b.* on 17 January 1804, and served as a Captain in the 85th Regiment of Light Infantry. He *d.* unmarried at St. Alban's Hotel, London, on 12 December 1840.⁴
4. A son, who was *b.* and *d.* on 1 April 1805.
5. **ARCHIBALD GEORGE STEWART, 13TH EARL OF MORAY**, *b.* on 3 March 1810, and succeeded his half-brother John on his death in 1867. He *d.* unmarried at Darnaway Castle on 12 February 1872.⁵
6. Charles Stewart, *b.* on 23 April 1812, and served as an officer in the 72nd Highlanders. He *d.* unmarried at London on 21 January 1847, having gone to bed in a condition of apparently reasonable health only to be found by his servant in the morning face down on the floor of his bedroom. An inquest delivered the verdict of apoplexy brought about by natural causes.⁶
7. **GEORGE PHILIP STEWART, 14TH EARL OF MORAY & LORD GRAY**, *b.* on 4 August 1814, and succeeded his brother Archibald on his death in 1872. He also succeeded as Lord Gray on the death of his cousin, Margaret, Baroness Gray, and *d.* unmarried at York Street, London, on Saturday 16 March 1895,⁷ being succeeded by his cousin and heir male, Edmund Archibald Stewart, great-grandson of Francis, 6th Earl of Moray.
8. Elizabeth Stuart, *b.* on 19 November 1801.
9. Jane Stewart, *b.* on 30 November 1802, and *m.* firstly, at Donibristle Park on 19 January 1832, to Sir John Archibald Drummond Stewart of Grantully,⁸ (he *dsp* at Paris on 20 May 1838⁹). She

10. Margaret Grace Stewart, *b.* on 17 September 1807, and *d.* unmarried at Eastbourne on 16 September 1863.¹
11. Anne Grace Stewart, *b.* on 6 March 1809, and *d.* unmarried at Edinburgh on 11 September 1873.²
12. Louisa Stewart, *b.* in May of 1813, and *d.* unmarried at London on 14 February 1864.³
