

STEWART

OF GRANTULLY

ALEXANDER STEWART, 1ST OF GRANTULLY, was younger son of Sir John Stewart of Innermeath and Lorn, and had a charter for the lands of Grantully and Aberfeldy from his father on 30 March 1414.¹ He *m.* Margaret, daughter of John Hay of Tulliebody, with whom he obtained a charter for the lands of Banchory from her brother John Hay of Tulliebody, in contemplation of their marriage on 15 July 1416 and *d.* before 10 July 1449. He was father of:

THOMAS STEWART, 2ND OF GRANTULLY, who entered into an agreement with William, Abbot of Coupar Angus, concerning the marches of Murthly on 19 July 1449, and had a grant of part of the lands of Comrie in 1452. He was included in the remainder of an entail for in the Lordship of Lorn in the same year and *d.* in 1453 having had issue:

ALEXANDER STEWART, 3RD OF GRANTULLY, succeeded his father on his death in 1453 and was served heir to him in the lands of Grantully and Banochy on 13 May 1462.² He *m.* by 16 May 1466, to Matilda, daughter of Sir James Stewart, natural son of Murdoch Stewart, 2nd Duke of Albany, when they had a charter of confirmation, on his own resignation, for the lands of Kiltuly and Aberfeldy.³ He *d.* in around 1488 and was father of,

1. John Stewart, 4th of Grantully, (*see below*).
2. Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* Neil Stewart of Garth, and had issue.

JOHN STEWART, 4TH OF GRANTULLY, to whom his father conveyed the lands of Grantully, Aberfeldy, and others by instrument dated 5 July 1470.¹ He *d.* by 13 March 1488 and was father of,

1. **THOMAS STEWART, 5TH OF GRANTULLY**, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the lands of Banchory on 13 March 1488.² He *m.* in 1481, to Agnes, daughter of Sir William Moray, 8th of Tullibardine, *d.* prior to 22 August 1494 and was father of,

1a) Elizabeth Stewart, succeeded her father and was infeft in the lands of Grantully on 12 January 1494.³ She *m.* Archibald Campbell of Skipnish with whom she resigned the lands of Grantully to her uncle and heir-male of her father, Alexander Stewart.

2. Alexander Stewart, 6th of Grantully, (*see below*).

ALEXANDER STEWART, 6TH OF GRANTULLY, succeeded his brother Thomas and was infeft as his heir firstly, in the lands of Grantully on 22 August 1494⁴ and then in the lands of Aberfeldy on 5 July 1525.⁵ He *m.* Margaret, apparently daughter of Michael Murray, 1st of Coig, (Dispensation dated 23 June 1507⁶), and was father of :

1. Sir Thomas Stewart, 7th of Grantully, (*see below*).

2. Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* John Stewart, 1st of Dalguise, (he *d.* in 1576), and had issue.

SIR THOMAS STEWART, 7TH OF GRANTULLY, in favour of whom his father made a resignation of the lands of Grantully on 14 March 1538.¹ He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Sir William Moray of Castleton, (*c/m* 23 June 1507), and was father of :

1. William Stewart, 8^h of Grantully, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Stewart, 1st of Carse, acquired the lands of Carse, Carsemuly and Petwasse, on 20 January 1566 and is then styled as brother of William Stewart of Grantully. He *m.* firstly, by 13 March 1562, to Isabel Gourlay,² secondly, to Jean, daughter of Maurice Drummond of Auchtermuthill, (she was widow of William Pitcairn of Pitlour, by whom she had issue), to whom he granted a liferent of his lands of Carse on 17 July 1584,³ and *d.* prior to 26 January 1600. He was father of,
 - 2a) John Stewart, 2nd of Carse, who, with Elizabeth, sister of Alexander Blair of Balgray, his future spouse, had a charter from his father for the lands Carse on 22 January 1594.⁴ He *dsp* prior to July of 1609.
 - 2b) Margaret Stewart, *m.* John Stewart, 4th of Bonskeid, (*c/m* 11 October, 1572), and had issue.
3. John Stewart, 1st of Findynate, had Sasine for the lands of Easter and Wester Findoyne and the Easter and Wester parts of the lands of Tulliepowries from John Stewart, Earl of Atholl, on 7 August 1575⁵ and had issue, (*see Stewart of Findoyne*).
4. Janet Stewart, *m.* George Robertson, 2nd of Faskally, (he survived her and *m.* secondly, to Christine, daughter of George Oliphant of Ardchalzie, who *m.* after his death to John Robertson, 1st of Monzie. George *d.* by 30 December,

1567, when his eldest son Alexander Robertson reserved a liferent of certain lands to Christine Oliphant), and had a charter from her husband of the liferent of the lands of Calvine, Pitgowan, and others, all lying within the Barony of Struan, on 29 March, 1557, and in which she is styled as daughter to Thomas Stewart of Grantully.¹ They had issue.

WILLIAM STEWART, 8^H OF GRANTULLY, succeeded his father and *m.* firstly, Margaret, daughter of Alexander Abercromby of Murthly, with whom, on his father's resignation, he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Aberfeldy on 2 January 1545.² He *m.* secondly by 22 April 1552, to Elizabeth, daughter of John Stewart, 3rd Earl of Atholl, when they had a charter of the lands of Aberfeldy,³ and *d.* at Grantully on 4 March 1574.⁴ He was father of :

1. **SIR THOMAS STEWART, 9TH OF GRANTULLY**, succeeded his father on his death in 1574, and was served heir to him on 14 May 1575.⁵ He *m.* Grizel, daughter of Sir Laurence Mercer of Meikleour, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, by 1619, to James Ogilvy of Clova), to whom, in her virginity, he granted a charter for his lands of Duoreskin and Cultully on 21 March 1569, in which she is styled as his future spouse, and *d.* between 13 June 1610 and 28 December 1611. He was father of :

1a) John Stewart, younger of Grantully, witnessed a charter by his father for the lands of Banchrie in favour of William Stewart, his brother, on 22 October 1595 in which he is styled as apparent of Grantully. He *dsp* prior to 4 July 1609.

2. Sir William Stewart, 10th of Grantully, (*see below*).

3. Margaret Stewart, *m.* George Stewart, 5th of Arntully and Cardney, (*c/m* 29 April 1566. He survived her and *m.* secondly, by 20 May 1588, to Janet, daughter of Alexander Robertson, 1st of Faskally, who was then widow of John Stewart, 1st of Findynate), and had issue.
4. Grizel Stewart, whose hand was offered in marriage to Peter Scott, younger of Monzie.¹ She *d.* unmarried in November 1579.

He was also father of a natural son :

5. William Stewart, in whose favour a Precept for letters of legitimation passed the Privy Seal on 10 May 1584.

SIR WILLIAM STEWART, 10TH OF GRANTULLY, had a charter for the lands of Banchrie, in the barony of Tulliebody and Sheriffdom of Clackmannan, from his brother Sir Thomas Stewart on 22 October 1595 in which he is styled as one of the gentlemen of the King's chamber, and to whom his brother conveyed the lands and barony of Grantully by charter dated 4 July 1609. He *m.* Agnes, eldest daughter of Sir John Moncrieff of Easter Moncrieff, (*c/m* at Perth on 30 August 1605²), *d.* in 1646 and was father of :

1. **THOMAS STEWART, 11TH OF GRANTULLY**, to whom his father conveyed the lands and barony of Grantully on 27 February 1623.³ He had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands and barony of Strathbraan on 31 July 1638 and *m.* Grizel, second daughter of Sir Alexander Menzies of Weem, (*c/m* 25 May 1627 & 8 February 1628⁴), with whom he had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands and barony of Carcock in which she is styled as second daughter of Sir Alexander Menzies of Weem. He *d.* on 10 August 1688 and was father of :

- 1a} **JOHN STEWART, 12TH OF GRANTULLY**, succeeded his father on his death in 1688 and executed an extensive entail of the family estates on 31 March 1717. He *d.* unmarried at Dundee in February of 1720.
- 1a} Jean Stewart, *m.* Sir James Mercer of Meikleour and Aldie, (*c/m* 1 February 1648.¹ He *d.* at London on 19 February 1671), and had issue.
- 1a} Marjory Stewart, *m.* David Fotheringham of Powrie, (*c/m* 20 November 1656. He survived her and *m.* secondly, to Rachel, daughter of David Aytoun of Kinnaldie, who was then widow of James Alexander of Finglassie), *d.* by May of 1696 and had issue whom in 1900, succeeded to the Grantully estate as heirs of entail, (*see Fotheringham of Powrie*).
- 1a} Grisel Stewart, *m.* Sir John Drummond, 1st of Logiealmond, (*c/m* 18 August 1664), and had issue.
- 1a} Anne Stewart, *m.* James Seaton of Touch, (*c/m* 20 April 1664. He was widow of Elizabeth, daughter of Henry Maule, Keeper of the Signet, and following Anne Stewart's death in 1668, he *m.* thirdly, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Archibald Stirling of Keir, by whom he had issue), and *dsp* in December of 1668.
- 2a} Cecil Stewart, *m.* John Stewart, 8th of Arntully and Cardney, (he survived her and *m.* secondly, Agnes, daughter of Patrick Rattray, 18th of Craighall, by whom he had issue), and had no apparent issue.
- 2a} Helen Stewart, *m.* James Crichton, 9th of Ruthven, (*c/m* 20 May 1669), and had issue.
- 2a} Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* on 26 May 1670, to David Leslie, 2nd Lord Newark, (he *d.* on 15 May 1694), and had issue.
2. Sir William Stewart, 1st of Innernytie, was a provisional heir to his elder brother Thomas Stewart in the lands of Grantully on 27 February 1623 and is then styled as second son of Sir William Stewart of Grantully. He *m.* by 5 July

1643, to Mary, daughter and coheirress of Sir John Crichton of Innernytie and Airliewright, and had issue, (*see Stewart of Innernytie*).

3. James Stewart, was a provisional heir to his elder brother Thomas Stewart in the lands of Grantully on 27 February, 1623, and is then styled as third son of Sir William Stewart of Grantully. There is no evidence that he married or left issue and is considered to have *dsp*.
4. **HENRY STEWART**, was a provisional heir to his elder brother Thomas Stewart in the lands of Grantully on 27 February 1623 and is then styled as third son of Sir William Stewart [10th] of Grantully. He had issue which carried on the succession, (*see below*).
5. John Stewart, 1st of Fungorth, was a provisional heir to his elder brother Thomas Stewart in the lands of Grantully on 27 February 1623 and is then styled as youngest son of Sir William Stewart of Grantully. He acquired the lands of Fungorth and *m*. Isobel, daughter of James Stewart, 1st of Ladywell, (*c/m* 11 September 1638.¹ She survived him and *m*. secondly, on 14 January 1655, to John Blair of Ardblair,² and had issue). He *d*. by 1655 and had issue, (*see Stewart of Fungorth*).
6. Grizel Stewart, *d*. in 1613 and was buried in the Chapel at Moncrieff.

HENRY STEWART, was a provisional heir to his elder brother Thomas Stewart in the lands of Grantully on 27 February, 1623, and is then styled as third son of Sir William Stewart [10th] of Grantully. He was admitted Advocate, *m*. Mary, daughter of Sir Colin Campbell, 3rd of Aberuchill, and *d*. in November of 1680 being father of :

1. Sir Thomas Stewart, 1st Baronet, of Blair, (*see below*).
2. James Stewart, is styled as second son in his father's Testament. He was apprenticed to Thomas Kincaid, Apothecary in Edinburgh, on 16 December,

1658, is then styled as son to Harry Stewart, brother to the Laird of Grantully.¹ He became a physician, *m.* at Edinburgh on 26 July 1678, Mary, daughter of his Master, Thomas Kincaird, Apothecary in Edinburgh,² and was father of :

2a) Thomas Stewart, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 12 September 1681.

2a) Elizabeth Stewart, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 10 September 1680, *m.* Colonel Thomas Hamilton, of the Scots Regiment of Foot Guards, (*c/m* 28 April 1703³), and had issue.

3. Marjory Stewart, *m.* William Borthwick, 1st of Pilmuir, son and heir of Alexander Borthwick, in Johnstonburn, second son of William Borthwick of Soltray, and had issue.
4. Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* on 24 September 1656, to James Drummond, 1st of Cultmalundy.⁴
5. Helen Stewart, *m.* Dr. David Carnegie, son of Charles Carnegie, Dean of Brechin, younger son of Sir Alexander Carnegie of Pittarow, and is styled as daughter of Henry Stewart, brother to Sir Thomas Stewart of Grantully, in a Bond dated 1668.

SIR THOMAS STEWART, 1ST BARONET, OF BLAIR, was appointed Tutor-at-law to John, William and Anna, children to the deceased John Stewart, 1st of Innernytie, was given on 19 February 1681. He was created a Baronet on 2 June 1683, with remainder to himself and the heirs male of his body, was admitted an Ordinary Lord of Session in place of Sir David Nevay on 7 November 1683, and succeeded Lord Hardcarse as Lord of Justiciary on 28 July 1688, although he was deprived of this office at the Revolution in 1690. He *m.* Jean, daughter of George MacKenzie, 1st Earl of Cromarty, and was father of :

1. Thomas Stewart, *b.* in July of 1685 and *d.* young.
2. **SIR GEORGE STEWART, 13TH OF GRANTULLY**, *b.* on 12 October 1686 and succeeded his cousin, John Stewart, 13th of Grantully, in the lands of Grantully on his death in 1720, and to whom he was served heir on 25 January 1721. He *m.* Anne, daughter of Sir Archibald Cockburn of Langton, (she *d.* at Dundee on 20 August 1757), and *dsp* at Edinburgh on 3 November 1759,¹ being succeeded by his brother, John.
3. Sir John Stewart, 14th of Grantully, (*see below*).
4. Kenneth Stewart, *d.* unmarried before 20 January 1721 when his brother John Stewart was served heir to him.
5. Margaret Stewart, *b.* in July of 1685.

SIR JOHN STEWART, 14TH OF GRANTULLY, *b.* on 29 September, 1687, and was served heir to his brother Kenneth on 20 January 1721. He succeeded his brother, Sir George Stewart, and his cousin, Sir John Stewart, in the lands of Grantully and was served heir to both of them on 20 May 1760. He *d.* at Murthly on Thursday 14 June 1764,² having *m.* firstly on 13 January 1725, to Elizabeth, daughter of Sir James MacKenzie, Lord Royston, by whom he was father of :

1. George Stewart, who *d.* young.
2. Sir John Stewart, 15th of Grantully, (*see below*).
He *m.* secondly on 4 August, 1746, Jane, only sister of Archibald, Duke of Douglas, (she was *b.* at Douglas on 17 March 1698 and *d.* at Edinburgh on 22 November 1753), and by her he had further issue :
3. Archibald Stewart, 1st Lord Douglas of Castle Douglas, *b.* at Aix-la-Chapelle on 10 July 1748. He was served heir to his uncle, Archibald, Duke of Douglas, on 10 September 1761, and was created Lord Douglas of Douglas Castle on 9 July 1790. He *m.* firstly, at London, on 13 June 1771, to Lucy, daughter of

William Graham, 2nd Marquis of Montrose, (she was *b.* in July of 1751 and *d.* on 13 February 1780), and secondly on 13 May 1783, to Frances, daughter of Francis Scott, Earl of Dalkeith, and sister of Henry Scott, 3rd Duke of Buccleuch, (she was a posthumous child and was *b.* on 6 August, 1750). He *d.* at Bothwell Castle on 26 December 1827¹ and was father of :

3a) Archibald Douglas, 2nd Lord Douglas, *b.* on 25 March 1773 and was served heir general to his father on 16 February 1828. He *d.* unmarried at Bothwell Castle on 27 January 1844.²

3a) Charles Douglas, 3rd Lord Douglas, *b.* on 26 October 1775, was served heir to his brother Archibald in the Dukedom of Douglas on 12 July 1844, and *d.* unmarried at St. George's Place, Hyde Park, on 10 September 1848,³ being succeeded by his brother, James.

3a) William Douglas, *b.* on 31 October 1777 and *d.* young.

3a) Jane Douglas, *b.* on 21 December 1779 and was served heir to her half-brother, Lord James Douglas, on 25 May 1857. She *m.* at Dalkeith on 22 November 1804, to Henry James Scott, Lord Montagu of Broughton, second son of Henry Scott, 3rd Duke of Buccleuch, (he was *b.* at London on 16 December 1776), and had issue.

3a) Sholto Scott Douglas, *b.* on 17 September 1785 and served as a Captain in the Enniskillen Dragoons. He *d.* without issue at Tullamore on 30 October 1821.⁴

3a) James Douglas, 4th Lord Douglas, *b.* on 9 July, 1787, and succeeded his half-brother Charles Douglas upon his death in 1848 to whom he was served heir of entail on 11 January 1849. He *m.* on 18 May, 1813, Wilhelmina, daughter of General James Murray, and *d.* without issue at

Bothwell Castle on 6 April, 1857,¹ when the title became extinct. He was succeeded in his estate by his sister Jane.

3a} George Douglas, *b.* on 2 August 1788 and served as a Captain in the Royal Navy. He *d.* unmarried in September of 1838.²

3a} Henry Douglas, *d.* young.

3a} John Douglas, *d.* young.

3a} Caroline Lucy Douglas, *b.* on 16 February 1784 and *m.* at Bothwell Castle on 27 October 1810, to Admiral Sir George Scott of Gala.³ She *d.* on 20 April 1857.

3a} Frances Elizabeth Douglas, *b.* on 9 December 1790 and *m.* at Bothwell on 18 October 1826, to William Moray-Stirling, 17th of Abercairney and Ardoch,⁴ (he was *b.* on 1 June 1785 and *d.* on 9 February 1850). She *dsp* at Granton on 14 September 1854 having had no issue.

3a} Mary Sidney Douglas, *b.* on 16 July 1796 and *m.* at Bothwell Castle on 29 May 1821, to Robert Douglas of Strathenny.⁵

4. Sholto Stewart, was a twin with Archibald and was *b.* at St. Germain on 10 July 1748. He *d.* at Edinburgh in May of 1753.

He *m.* thirdly at Edinburgh on 12 September 1761, to Helen, daughter of Alexander Murray, 4th Lord Elibank,⁶ (she *d.* at Ormiston on 29 December 1810, in her 94th year⁷), by whom he had no apparent issue.

SIR JOHN STEWART, 15TH OF GRANTULLY, was served heir to his uncle, George MacKenzie of Farnese, on 16 August 1748, and to his uncle, Sir George Stewart,

in the lands of Grantully, Murthly, Strathbraan and others, on 30 September 1765. He *m.* at Ballechin on 10 August 1749, Clementina, daughter of Charles Stewart of Ballechin,¹ (she *d.* at Murthly on 10 February 1789²), *d.* at Pyrton, Oxfordshire, on Friday 6 October 1797, in his 71st year,³ and was father of :

1. Sir George Stewart, 16th of Grantully, (*see below*).
2. John Stewart, *bap.* at Dunkeld on 25 January, 1761, and *m.* Ann Rattray. He *d.* at Perth on 22 July 1810,⁴ and was father of :
 - 2a) John Stewart, *d.* unmarried on 30 January 1865.
 - 2a) Robert Stewart, *b.* on 26 September 1789, and *dsp.*
3. Dougal Stewart, *bap.* at Dunkeld on 28 October 1763, and *dsp.*
4. Archibald Stewart, *d.* in infancy.
5. Grizel Stewart, *m.* at Murthly on 20 May 1788, to William Buckle, Student in Christ Church in Reading University.⁵ She *d.* at Banstead Vicarage House on 12 November 1826.⁶
6. Clementina Stewart, *m.* firstly, at Murthly on 6 November 1782, to Alexander Moray, 14th of Abercairney,⁷ (he was *b.* in 1743 and *d.* in 1784), and had no issue. She *m.* secondly, in 1786, to George Seton, son of James Seton, Governor of the Island of St. Vincent.

SIR GEORGE STEWART, 16TH OF GRANTULLY, *b.* at Ballechin on 17 October 1750, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 16 April, 1792, Catherine, eldest daughter and heiress of John Drummond, 3rd of Logiealmond,⁸ (she was *bap.* at Moneydie on

11 February 1762, and *d.* at Logiealmond House on 8 March 1833¹). He *d.* at Murthly Castle on 9 December 1827² and was father of :

1. **SIR JOHN ARCHIBALD STEWART, 17TH OF GRANTULLY**, *b.* at Murthly on 25 October 1794 and, on his mother's death in 1833, he succeeded to the estate of Logiealmond following which he assumed the name and arms of Drummond. He *m.* at Donibristle Park on 19 January 1832, to Jane, eldest daughter of Francis Stewart, Earl of Moray,³ (she survived him and *m.* secondly on 24 August 1839, to Lonsdale Pouden M.D. ; and *d.* on 14 March 1880), and *dsp* at Paris on 20 May 1838, having been of a weak constitution for some years.⁴

2. **SIR WILLIAM DRUMMOND STEWART, 18TH OF GRANTULLY**, *b.* at Murthly on 26 December 1795 and was served heir to his brother, Sir John, in the lands of Grantully, and others, on 7 May 1839. He sold the lands of Logiealmond to the Earl of Mansfield in 1842 and also disposed of a good deal of his other properties, and on his death there widespread rumours of his having been poisoned. Because of this two autopsies were conducted and a temporary burial instructed before the matters were settled and he was finally properly laid to rest. He *m.* in May of 1830 to Christian Stewart, (she *d.* at Grantully Castle on 1 October in 1856⁵), *d.* on 28 April 1871⁶ and was father of :

2a) William George Drummond Stewart, *b.* in February of 1831 and *dsp* at Hythe on Monday 19 October 1868.⁷

3. George Drummond Stewart of Braco Castle, *b.* at Murthly on 3 November 1798 and to whom his maternal aunt Frances Maria, daughter of John Drummond, 3rd of Logiealmond, conveyed her lands of Braco with the castle

He *m.* in 1875, to Hesther Mary, eldest daughter of John Fraser of Bunchrew, (she *d.* at Grantully Castle on 6 October 1916³), and *dsp* at Murthly Castle on 20 September 1890,⁴ being succeeded by Walter T. G. Fotheringham of Powrie as heir of entail.
6. Catherine Stewart, *b.* on 26 August 1797, and *m.* in 1833, Monsieur Des Ondes.
7. Clementina Stewart, *b.* on 9 September 1800, and *d.* at Murthly Castle on 19 September 1827.⁵
