

STEWART

OF INNERDUNNING

This family are apparently descended from the Stewarts of Innermeath and Lorn. John Stewart, 2nd Lord of Lorn, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Innerdunning and Balgowan, in the Earldom of Strathearn, which were incorporated into the barony of Innermeath on 20 June 1452. The first for whom there is evidence is :

WILLIAM STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, of unknown parentage, was settled at Innerdunning by November of 1575 and *m.* Margaret Bonar with whom and with their eldest son, Walter and Margaret Rollo, his spouse, he granted an Obligation to Thomas Cook, Merchant and Burgess of Perth, on 29 October 1585.¹ He *d.* by 31 March 1596, when his eldest son, Walter, was in full possession of the lands of Innerdunning, and was father of :

1. Walter Stewart of Innerdunning, (*see below*).
2. William Stewart, who is styled as son to William Stewart of Edindunning in an Obligation by Humphrey Rollo, natural son of Andrew Rollo of Duncrub to David David Rollo of Powis, dated 16 May 1583.²
3. Margaret Stewart, *m.* Thomas Miller, eldest son of Alexander Miller at the Mill of Aberdalgie, (*c/m* dated 19 November 1575³).

WALTER STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, succeeded his father and was witness to a charter by John Stewart, Earl of Atholl, granting the lands of Kildoning to Mr.

William Oliphant on 31 March 1596.¹ He *m.* by 29 October 1585, to Margaret Rollo and was father of,

1. Ninian Stewart of Innerdunning, (*see below*).
2. Robert Stewart, was appointed Tutor to his nephew, William Stewart of Innerdunning, on 12 May 1621.

NINIAN STEWART, FIAR OF INNERDUNNING, *m.* Elizabeth Home and was killed by Thomas Drummond of Pitcairns on 25 May 1620.² He was father of,

1. William Stewart of Innerdunning, (*see below*).
2. David Stewart, acted as Bailie to a Sasine for he lands of Garvock in favour of his brother William Stewart of Innerdunning, dated in 1648.³

WILLIAM STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, who was under age at his father's death in 1620 and had his uncle, Robert Stewart, appointed his Tutor on 12 May 1621.⁴ He *m.* firstly, to Dorothy, daughter of Robert Graham of Cairney, (*c/m* 20 June 1638⁵), and secondly, Janet Stewart, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, by 12 May 1663, to Henry Davidson, Tailor in Edinburgh). He *d.* by 1663 and was father of,

ROBERT STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, succeeded his father and was served heir to his great-grandfather, Walter Stewart of Innerdunning, in the sunny half of the lands of Innerdunning with the mill on 11 December 1663.⁶ He was father of,

1. Robert Stewart of Innerdunning, (*see below*).

2. David Stewart, settled in South Queensferry and was executor to his brother, Robert, in 1728.

ROBERT STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, succeeded his father and *m.* Grisel, daughter of James Graham, 9th of Garvock, (she *d.* in 1741). He *d.* in 1728 and appears to have been father of :

WILLIAM STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, who succeeded to or acquired the lands of Innerdunning. He *m.* on 30 October 1730, to Janet Henderson¹ and was father of,

1. John Stewart of Innerdunning, (*see below*).
2. David Stewart, *bap.* at Auchterarder on 22 June 1735.
3. William Stewart, *bap.* at Auchterarder on 25 November 1739.
4. Janet Stewart, *bap.* at Auchterarder on 22 May 1737.

JOHN STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, *bap.* at Auchterarder on 8 August 1731, and succeeded his father in the lands of Innerdunning. He *m.* on 30 July 1762, to Margaret Chalmers, (she *d.* on 12 December 1832), *d.* on 18 September 1818² and was father of,

1. Alexander Stewart of Innerdunning, (*see below*).
2. William Stewart, *bap.* at Auchterarder on 19 June 1763.

ALEXANDER STEWART OF INNERDUNNING, succeeded his father and had the lands of Innerdunning sequestrated and sold by public roup on 16 July 1841.
