

# STEWART

## OF PARDOVAN

**WALTER STEWART, 1<sup>ST</sup> OF PARDOVAN**, was a younger son of Sir Archibald Stewart of Blackhall. He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of heiress of Robert Stewart, Burgess of Linlithgow, (she *d.* in March of 1682), with whom he was infeft by her father in tenements in the Burgh of Linlithgow on 30 October 1669.<sup>1</sup> He *d.* by October of 1683 and was father of,

1. **ARCHIBALD STEWART, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF PARDOVAN**, succeeded his father, being served heir general to him on 6 March 1672 and *dsp* prior to May of 1676, when his brother, Walter, was served heir to him.
2. Walter Stewart, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Pardovan, (*see below*).
3. Annabella Stewart, *m.* Sir Robert Pollock of that Ilk.
4. Christian Stewart, *m.* John Marshall, Apothecary in Glasgow.
5. Elizabeth Stewart, *m.* John Stirling, Principal of the College of Glasgow.
6. Janet Stewart,
7. Mary Stewart, *m.* Sir Robert Cheisly, Provost of Edinburgh.

**WALTER STEWART, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF PARDOVAN**, was served heir general to his brother Archibald Stewart of Pardovan on 6 May 1676,<sup>2</sup> and was infeft in various tenements in Linlithgow as heir to his parents on 20 October 1683, being then styled as only son.<sup>3</sup> He was served heir to his mother in grounds in Linlithgow on 4 April 1701 and *m.* at Carriden on 15 September 1693, to Katherine, daughter of

James Cornwall of Bonhard. He *d.* at the home of his cousin Sir John Maxwell of Pollock on 8 March 1719, aged fifty-two years.<sup>1</sup>
