

STEWART

OF URRARD

JOHN STEWART, the founder of this stirpes, is generally accepted to have been second son of Robert Stewart, 1st of Fincastle, although there is no evidence to prove this. He is said to have *m.* a daughter of MacGregor of Glenstrae and was father of :

ROBERT STEWART, who, although illusive in documents, is confirmed by the patronymics of his sons. He is said to have *m.* a daughter of Alexander Robertson, 1st of Faskally, and was father of :

1. Alexander Stewart, 1st of Urrard, (*see below*).
2. Neil Stewart of Urrardbeg, *m.* Christine Stewart and with whom he was infest in the lands of Urrardbeg on 4 March, 1621, and is then styled as Neil Stewart MacRobert.¹ He *m.* firstly, a whom whose name has not been ascertained ; and secondly, Christian Stewart. He was father of,
 - 2a) Donald Stewart, infest by his father in the lands of Croftcrombie on 7 January, 1621, and is then styled as his second son.²
 - 2a) John Stewart, *m.* Margaret, eldest daughter of Thomas MacDuff of Craigillo, (*c/m* in July of 1647³), and is then styled as eldest son of his father's second marriage to Christian Stewart.
 - 2a) Neil Stewart, acted as bailie to his brother John Stewart in his contract of marriage in 1647.

ALEXANDER STEWART, 1ST OF URRARD, *m.* in around 1590, Christina, only daughter and heiress of George Leslie of Rinrorie, (she *d.* in around 1628⁴), with whom he obtained these lands and had a charter from William Moray, Master of Tulliebardine, for the lands of Urrardbeg, with the croft called *Stoddartscroft*, the eastern middle-part of the

lands of Ballievoane, and the lands of Easter and Middle Clunie on 21 January, 1613. He *d.* in 1641¹ and was father of :

1. Robert Stewart, 2nd of Urrard, (*see below*).
2. Neil Stewart, *m.* Isobel, eldest sister of Alexander Robertson of Easter Straloch, (*c/m* 7 July, 1629²).
3. John Stewart, had a Tack of the lands of Dundavie from John Stewart, brother of James Stewart, of Fincastle, for the term of five years on 8 June, 1642,³ and *m.* Christian, daughter of Alexander Robertson of Tennandrie, (*c/m* 28 January, 1631⁴).
4. George Stewart, styled as brother of Robert Stewart of Urrard, when witness to the contract of marriage between John Robertson, fiar of Pitagown, and Grissell, daughter of Alexander Robertson of Wester Straloch, on 7 January, 1647.⁵

ROBERT STEWART, 2ND OF URRARD, witness to a contract of alienation by Fergus Fergusson of Balledmond on 20 May, 1631, and succeeded his father on his death in 1641. He *m.* Christine, daughter of Charles Robertson of Auchleeks, (*c/m* 10 May, 1620⁶), and was father of :

1. John Stewart, 3rd of Urrard, (*see below*).
2. Neil Stewart, *m.* Janet, eldest daughter of John Robertson, in Dalcairnich, (*c/m* 2 March, 1658⁷).
3. William Stewart, said to a younger son of Robert Stewart of Urrard. He *m.* Grissel, daughter of Fergusson of Pitfourie, and had issue, (*see Stewart of St. Fort*).
4. Elspeth Stewart, *m.* Alexander Stewart, youngest son of Alexander Stewart of Bonskeid, (*c/m* 20 June, 1642⁸).
5. Christian Stewart, *m.* James Robertson, brother of John Robertson of Easter Straloch, (*c/m* 17 July, 1649⁹).

6. Margaret Stewart, *m.* Charles Robertson, brother of Leonard Robertson of Wester Straloch, (*c/m* 6 February, 1655¹), and had issue.

JOHN STEWART, 3RD OF URRARD, succeeded his father and *m.* firstly, Barbara, eldest daughter of Alexander Menzies, 1st of Rotmell, (*c/m* 3 January 1652²), and had issue. He *m.* secondly Jean, daughter to James Stewart, 5th of Fincastle, (*c/m* 1 November 1678.³ She was widow of Mr. Colin Campbell by whom she had issue), *d.* by November of 1695 and was father of :

1. James Stewart, 4th of Urrard, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Stewart, had a Tack of the lands of Balnagrew from John Robertson of Lude for three years on 7 February, 1702,⁴ and had a Tack for the lands of Mill of Kindrochit from John Robertson of Lude on 16 December, 1704. He was appointed Clerk to the Regality of Atholl and was father of :
 - 2a) Robert Stewart, *m.* Isobel Lamont and was father of,
 - 2b) Duncan Stewart of Baloan, *m.* at Logierait on 10 February, 1750, Janet Stewart, (she *d.* on 19 March 1795), and *d.* on 20 May 1789. He was father of,
 - 2c) Robert Stewart, *b.* on 17 March, 1755, and *d.* at Edinburgh on 24 June, 1835.⁵
 - 2c) Samuel Stewart, *bap.* at Logierait on 12 January, 1766.
 - 2c) Alexander Stewart, *b.* in 1776 and *d.* at Edinburgh in 1857.
 - 2c) Ann Stewart, *bap.* at Logierait on 12 June, 1763.
3. Charles Stewart, was apprenticed to John Glas, Dean of Guild of Perth, on 19 February, 1680, and became a successful Merchant in Perth. He *m.* Elizabeth Craigie and had issue :
 - 3a) Barbara Stewart, *m.* at Perth on 30 October, 1719, Robert Craigie, 1st of Glendoick and Lord Advocate,⁶ (he *d.* on 10 March, 1760) and *d.* on 25 March, 1766. They had issue.
4. Samuel Stewart, became a Surgeon Apothecary in Dundee, *m.* at Dundee on 26 April, 1699, Catherine, second daughter of John Scrimgeour of Kirkton,⁷ (*c/m* 6 April, 1699), and had issue,
 - 4a) John Stewart, *bap.* at Dundee on 3 February, 1700.

- 4a) Charles Stewart, *bap.* at Dundee on 18 June, 1704.
- 4a) Samuel Stewart, *bap.* at Dundee on 18 June, 1704.
- 4a) James Stewart, *bap.* at Dundee on 25 September, 1715.
- 4a) Alexander Stewart, served as a Captain in the Marines and *d.* at Newfoundland in 1777.¹
- 4a) Jean Stewart, *bap.* at Dundee on 31 March, 1702.
- 4a) Katherine Stewart, *bap.* at Dundee on 16 September, 1708.

JAMES STEWART, 4TH OF URRARD, witness to the Testament of Alexander Stewart of Orchillbeg on 25 November, 1695, and succeeded his father. He *m.* at Coupar Angus on 27 February, 1685, Anne, eldest daughter of Alexander Campbell, 3rd of Balgirsho, (*c/m* 11 February, 1685²), as living in 1724, when he was party to his son John Stewart, younger of Urrard's contract of marriage with Susanna Campbell and *d.* soon afterwards. He was father of :

1. Alexander Stewart, *bap.* at Coupar Angus on 20 January, 1686, and *d.* young.
2. John Stewart, 5th of Urrard, (*see below*).
3. Samuel Stewart, became a Merchant in Perth and purchased the lands of Over Culteuchar. He *m.* at Perth on 29 July, 1727, Cecilia, daughter of John Tenant,³ (she *d.* at Perth on 17 August 1789⁴), and was father of :
 - 3a) John Stewart, *bap.* at Perth on 13 March, 1732, and *dsp.*
 - 3a) Samuel Stewart of Over Culteuchar, *b.* on 7 January, 1741, and was infeft in the lands of Over Culteuchar as heir to his father on 25 May 1789. He *dsp* at Perth on Friday 26 March 1790,⁵ with his second cousins Christina Craigie Stewart and Elizabeth Stewart, daughters of James Stewart of Urrard, being retoured his heirs on 7 December 1819.
 - 3a) Janet Stewart, *bap.* at Perth on 3 September, 1728, and *dsp.*
4. Christian Stewart, *m.* Mungo Campbell of Cluniemor and afterwards of Monzie, (*c/m* 31 March, 1719⁶), and *d.* on Thursday 11 July 1771, in the 80th year of her age,⁷ having had issue.

5. Barbara Stewart, *m.* Mr. John Hamilton, Minister of Kenmore, (he *d.* in January of 1742), and had issue.
6. Agnes Stewart, *m.* William Small, younger of Kindrogan, only son of William Small of Kindrogan, (*c/m* 24 February, 1732¹), and had issue.
7. Margaret Stewart, *m.* Alexander Stewart of Clochfoldich, (*c/m* 23 July, 1724), and had issue.
8. Jean Stewart, *m.* Neil MacGlashan of Clune.

JOHN STEWART, 5TH OF URRARD, succeeded his father and *m.* Susannah, youngest daughter of Lord Neil Campbell, younger son to Archibald Campbell, 1st Marquis of Argyll, (*c/m* 24 October, 1724.² She *d.* in 1740 aged 30 years). He was father of :

1. James Stewart, 6th of Urrard, (*see below*).
2. Neil Stewart, *bap.* at Moulin on 5 April, 1727, and *d.* unmarried.
3. Robert Stewart, *bap.* at Moulin on 8 July, 1728. He went to Tobago where he held the office of Commissioner for those lands ceded by the French and *d.* there in 1778. He had a natural daughter by Jean Menzies, servant at Urrard;
3a) Christian Stewart, *bap.* at Logierait on 12 March, 1747.

JAMES STEWART, 6TH OF URRARD, succeeded his father and served as a Captain in the army during the first American Wars during which he was wounded at Ticonderoga on 8 July, 1758. He *m.* firstly, at Moulin on 13 January, 1752, Ann, second daughter of Alexander Robertson of Faskally,³ (she *d.* by 8 April, 1755⁴), by whom he had no issue. He *m.* secondly, at Moulin on 6 February, 1766, Elizabeth, daughter of John Robertson of Tullybelton,⁵ (*c/m* 10 February, 1766), and *d.* at Urrard on 2 September 1781, being father of :

1. **JOHN STEWART, 7TH OF URRARD**, *b.* on 18 November, 1768, and had Sasine as heir to his father in the lands of Reinaculloch on 21 May, 1783. He *dsp* at Urrard on 16 September 1818,¹ with his three surviving sisters becoming his heirs.
2. Robert Stewart, *b.* on 20 June, 1770, and served as a Lieutenant in the 61st Regiment. He *d.* unmarried at Martinique on 23 June, 1795.²
3. James MacKenzie Stewart, *b.* on 25 May, 1772, and served for a time with the H.E.I.C.S. He returned to Scotland and *m.* at St. Peter's Church, Liverpool, on 12 April, 1800, Anne, daughter of Captain George Leckie, Lancaster.³ He *d.* on 1 March 1803.⁴
4. Neil Stewart, *bap.* at Moulin on 12 March, 1774, and *dsp* at Tobago on 13 June 1808.⁵
5. Elizabeth Stewart, *bap.* at 14 February, 1767, *m.* at Perth on 20 February, 1787, to James Richardson of Pitfour, (he *d.* on 26 July 1823), and had issue which succeeded to the lands of Tullybelton.
6. Susan Stewart, *bap.* at Moulin on 15 January. 1776, and *dsp* at Perth on 2 March 1799.⁶
7. Christian Craigie Stewart, *bap.* at Moulin on 10 July, 1777, and was served heir portioner to her father on 22 April 1825. She *m.* at Pitfour on 21 April, 1821, James Hay of Seggieden,⁷ (he was widow of Margaret, daughter of John Richardson of Pitfour, whom he had *m.* on 10 August, 1801, and who had *d.* on 14 March, 1819, and by whom he had issue), and *dsp.*
8. Charlotte Stewart, (*see below*).

CHARLOTTE STEWART, *bap.* at Moulin on 12 August, 1780, and was served heir portioner to her father on 22 April, 1825. She *m.* at Urrard on 11 November, 1803, to James Alston of Auchinard,⁸ (he *d.* at Urrard on 8 October 1833,⁹ aged 70 years), who assumed the additional surname of Stewart. He *d.* at Urrard on 28 September 1837,¹⁰ and had issue :

1. William Alston Stewart, *bap.* on 8 November 1804, served as a Captain in the 68th Bengal Native Infantry and *d.* on board the Amherst off the coast of Arracan, East Indies, on 27 January 1844.¹
2. James Stewart Alston, *bap.* on 4 June 1810, served as a Captain in the 27th Regiment Bengal Native Infantry, and *d.* at Green Park, Park Lane, London, on 3 November 1848.²
3. Andrew David Alston Stewart, *bap.* on 21 September 1813, served as a Captain in the 61st Regiment of Foot and *d.* suddenly, at Mirzapore, Bengal, on 17 May 1848.³
4. Dumfries Crawford Alston, *bap.* on 20 October 1817, entered as an Ensign in the 26th Regiment Native Bengal Infantry and *d.* at Murat on 28 July 1838.⁴
5. Charles Rowland Alston Stewart, *b.* on 12 November 1818, and *d.* at Gibraltar on 5 September 1852.⁵
6. Elizabeth Alston Stewart, *m.* at Edinburgh on 11 July 1826, to Captain James William Bouverie.
7. Janet Alston Stewart, *bap.* on 11 March 1808.
8. Susan Alston Stewart, *bap.* on 24 December 1811, *m.* at Urrard on 17 February 1836, to Sir William Dick, younger of Prestonfield,⁶ and had issue.
9. Anne Balcarres Alston Stewart, *m.* at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Edinburgh, on 10 June 1846, to Sir Robert Menzies, 7th Baronet of Weem,⁷ and had issue.
