

TURNBULL

OF STRATHCATHRO

PETER TURNBULL OF STRATHCATHRO, resided firstly in Colieshaven and acquired the lands of Strathcathro and others in the Barony of Keathick, from Sir Robert Douglas of Tilliequhillie, by disposition dated 7 March 1656, confirmed under the Great Seal on 7 March 1659.¹ He entered into a contract of wadset with George, Lord Spynie, on 14 March 1649, for the hill and lands commonly called the wood of Finavon, which was confirmed by a charter under the Great Seal on 2 December 1662.² He was father of :

JOHN TURNBULL OF STRATHCATHRO, succeeded his father and to whom he was retoured heir general on 12 August 1669. He *d.* prior to July of 1698 and was father of :

1. John Turnbull of Strathcathro, (*see below*).
2. George Turnbull, *m.* at Arbroath on 8 December 1692, to Catherine, daughter of John Gardyne, 2nd of Lawton, (*c/m* 23 & 26 November 1692³), and was father of,
 - 2a) Robert Turnbull, *b.* at Edinburgh on 19 June 1696, and *d.* in infancy.
 - 2a) Robert Turnbull, *b.* at Edinburgh on 6 September 1697.
3. Alexander Turnbull. He and his brother James are styled as brothers to John Turnbull of Strathcathro in a Sasine dated 1710
4. James Turnbull,
5. Margaret Turnbull, *m.* James Guthrie, only son of John Guthrie of that Ilk, (*c/m* 13 May 1704⁴).

JOHN TURNBULL OF STRATHCATHRO, succeeded his father and was retoured his heir in the lands of Milnden and Strathcathro on 30 July 1698. He *m.* first, Elizabeth, daughter of Robert Young of Auldbar, and secondly, on 23 February 1705, to Agnes, daughter of Sir James Lumsdaine of Innergellie, and *d.* in November of 1718. He was father of :

JOHN TURNBULL OF STRATHCATHRO, served heir to his father in the lands of Dallydies on 28 February 1729, and *d.* at Strathcathro on 25 April 1760,¹ following which the lands of Strathcathro were were sold to Dr. John MacKenzie.
