

# VALONIIS

## OF LOCHORE AND INCHGALL

**ADAM DE VALONIIS**, who, with other leading landholders from Fife, gave homage to Edward I. of England on 28 August 1296.<sup>1</sup> He appears to have been ancestor of :

**SIR ANDREW DE VALONIIS**, was witness to a charter by Duncan, Earl of Fife, to Sir Robert de Erskine for the lands of Quilts, in the Earldom of Fife, dated 1342x1352<sup>2</sup> and had a charter from John de Wemyss for the Mill of Lochore which was confirmed by King Robert II. on 5 November 1372. He was father of,

**SIR JAMES DE VALONIIS OF INCHGALL**, succeeded his father by 16 May 1385, when, as Steward of Robert, Earl of Fife, he infeft William of Spens and Isabel, his spouse, in the lands of Lathalland and Craigsanquhar.<sup>3</sup> He had a charter under the Great Seal for quarter of the lands of Crambeth on 19 July 1392, resigned in his favour by Sir Alan de Erskine of Inchmartin, and was father of,

**CHRISTIAN DE VALONIIS**, the ward of whom was granted to Sir Thomas Erskine. She *m.* first, Andrew Wardlaw of Wilton and had issue ; and secondly, by 23 July 1449, Sir John de Cockburn when they granted a discharge for the ward of the Templelands of Lochore to David Halkett of Pitfirrane.<sup>4</sup>
