

WARDLAW

OF KILBABERTON

JOHN WARDLAW OF RICcarton, had Sasine for the lands of Riccarton in 1444,¹ *d.* in 1474, and was father of :

1. James Wardlaw of Riccarton, succeeded his father and was retoured his heir in the lands of Kilbaberton on 16 May 1477. He had issue, (*see Wardlaw of Riccarton*).
2. John Wardlaw, 1st of Kilbaberton, (*see below*).

JOHN WARDLAW, 1ST OF KILBABERTON, obtained the lands of lands of Kilbaberton on 10 February 1493, and is then styled as brother to James Wardlaw of Riccarton. On 28 April 1500, he was a member of the inquest at the retour of John, Lord Somerville, as heir to his father William, Lord Somerville, in the lands of Gilmerton,² and *m.* Margaret Cockburn, (she was widow of Gavin Crichton, brother of William, Lord Crichton), with whom he was infeft in eight acres of the lands of Nether Libberton on 6 May 1512.³ He was *k.* at the battle of Flodden in September of 1513,⁴ and was father of :

HENRY WARDLAW, 2ND OF KILBABERTON, succeeded his father on his death in 1513, and had Sasine for the lands of Kilbaberton on 23 May 1515.⁵ He *m.* Isobella Callander with whom he was infeft in the lands of Nether Libberton and Wester Craigs by Alexander Forrester of Corstorphine, the superior, on 8 April 1527.⁶ He was living in 1549, *d.* by January of 1555, and had issue :

1. Alexander Wardlaw, 3rd of Kilbaberton, (*see below*).

2. James Wardlaw, portioner of Currie, styled as brother to Alexander Wardlaw of Kilbaberton when he entered into an obligation with this brother for 500 merks on 9 January 1590.

ALEXANDER WARDLAW, 3RD OF KILBABERTON, in whose favour his father resigned the lands of Nether Libberton into the hands of the superior James, Lord Forrester of Corstorphine, and in which he was infeft on 15 November 1549.¹ He *d.* in January of 1590, having *m.* firstly, to Mariot Forrest by whom he had issue;

1. Robert Wardlaw, (*see below*).
2. Laurence Wardlaw, *m.* Elizabeth Douglas to whom his nephew Henry Wardlaw granted a charter for the lands of Nether Libberton on 3 August 1597, which he disposed to Thomas Hamilton of Priestfield on 17 April 1599.
3. Katherine Wardlaw, *m.* Mr. William Pennicuik, Minister of Pennicuik, (*c/m* 27 February 1570).

He *m.* secondly, Margaret, daughter of Henry Stewart, 7th of Rosyth, (*c/m* 14 March, 1570.² She survived him and *m.* secondly, by 4 March 1592, to Robert Dury of that Ilk), by whom he had no apparent issue.

ROBERT WARDLAW, YOUNGER OF KILBABERTON, who as heir apparent of his father, gave his consent to the granting of an annualrent to be uplifted from their lands of Nether Libberton to John Robertson, Cutler in Edinburgh, on 8 March 1576. He *m.* Margaret Carmichael who is styled as his spouse in an obligation with Helen Johnstone, daughter to the deceased John Johnstone of Powdene, dated 20 August 1590,³ and was father of,

1. **HENRY WARDLAW, 4TH OF KILBABERTON**, was infeft in the lands of Nether Libberton on on 9 June 1590, on his grandfather, Alexander Wardlaw of Kilbaberton's resignation⁴ and was retoured his heir in the lands of Kilbaberton with the tower, masion etc., and Nether Libberton on 14 June 1593. He *m.* Elizabeth Fairlie, to whom a liferent was reserved in June of 1598, and *dsp* by 27 June 1621, when his brother John is styled as his heir.

2. John Wardlaw, styled as brother and heir to the late Henry Wardlaw of Kilbaberton in a process raised by Sir William Oliphant of Newton on 27 June 1621.¹
