

# WARDLAW

## OF PITREAVIE

**NICHOLAS WARDLAW**, was a younger son of John Wardlaw of Torrie, and was father of,

**CUTHBERT WARDLAW OF BALMULE**, obtained the lands of Balmule and *m.* Katherine Dalgleish, (she *d.* on 18 February 1621). He was father of,

1b) James Wardlaw, portioner of Wester Luscar, *bap.* on 23 April, 1647, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the lands of West Luscar on 21 May, 1669.<sup>1</sup>

1c) Henry Wardlaw, portioner of Wester Luscar, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the lands of West Luscar on 19 November 1675.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* Christian Hutton, *d.* in May 1726 and was father of :

1d) James Wardlaw, portioner of Wester Luscar, *b.* 1673, and was admitted Minister of Dunfermline in November of 1718. He *m.* Jean Morris, (she *d.* at Old Cumnock on 3 May 1758), *d.* on 2 May 1742. and was father of :

1e) Henry Wardlaw, *b.* on 5 October, 1723, and *d.* prior to December of 1742.

1e) Christian Wardlaw, *b.* on 13 July, 1715, and with her sisters Isobel, Jean and Mary, she was served heir to her grandfather Henry Wardlaw in the lands of Wester Luscar on 10 December 1742. She *m.* on 10 February 1737, to Mr. Thomas Charteris, Minister of Invekeithing, and had issue.

**SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 1<sup>ST</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, was *bap.* at Dunfermline on 16 May 1565, succeeded his father in the lands of Balmule in which he was infeft on 27 February 1597, and purchased those of Pitreavie in 1608. He was created a Baronet of Nova Scotia on 5 March 1631, with remainder to his heirs male and assignees whatsoever. He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Lucas Wilson, Merchant in Edinburgh, was entered a Burgess of Edinburgh by right of his father-in-law,<sup>3</sup> and *d.* on 5 April 1637, having had issue :

1. **SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 2<sup>ND</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, succeeded his father on his death in 1637, and was served heir to him on 28 June 1637. He *m.* Margaret, daughter of David Bethune of Balfour, (*c/m* 24 March 1617<sup>4</sup>), *d.* on 2 March 1653,<sup>5</sup> and was father of :
  - 1a) **SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 3<sup>RD</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 24 March, 1618, succeeded his father on his death in 1653, and was served heir to him on 31 January

1654.<sup>1</sup> He *m.* on 9 June 1653, to Margaret, daughter of Sir John Henderson of Fordell, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, in July of 1655, to Peter Hay, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Naughton,<sup>2</sup> by whom she had issue), and *dsp* prior to 1654.

1a) Elizabeth Wardlaw, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 23 February 1627, and *m.* on 29 March 1646, her cousin and heir-male of the Baronetcy, Henry Wardlaw, son of William Wardlaw of Balmule.

2. William Wardlaw of Balmule, who, with his brother John Wardlaw of Abden, were witnesses to a charter by James Sibbald of Over Rankeilour to David Sibbald, his eldest son and heir on 28 November 1625, and in which they are styled as sons of Sir Henry Wardlaw of Pitreavie.<sup>3</sup> He *m.* at Edinburgh on 27 April 1620, to Christian, daughter of James Foulis of Colinton,<sup>4</sup> and was father of,

2a) **Sir Henry Wardlaw, 4<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Pitreavie**, (*see below*).

2a) George Wardlaw, raised and action inhibiting the marriage of Margaret Wardlaw, daughter of Henry Wardlaw of Pitlochrie, to John Murray, fiar of Bonytoun, on 12 June 1662, until they had made satisfaction of a Bond, and is then styled as brother of the Laird of Pitreavie.<sup>5</sup>

- 3a) John Wardlaw of Abden, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the lands of Binnend, in the parish of Burntisland, on 25 May 1665. He *m.* Christian Dewar, *d.* on 4 January 1716, and was father of,
- 3b) John Wardlaw, younger of Abden, succeeded his father and *m.* on 1 June 1704, to Katherine Pringle.<sup>1</sup> He *d. vita patris* in August 1705 and was father of,
- 3c) Christian Wardlaw, *b.* on 24 November 1705, and was served heir to his father in the lands of Abden of Kinghorn on 26 July 1711.
- 3b) William Wardlaw of Abden, *bap.* at Auchterderran on 4 February 1686, succeeded his brother and *m.* at Kinghorn on 25 November 1712, to Elizabeth Hay.<sup>2</sup> He was father of,
- 3c) William Wardlaw of Abden, *m.* in January of 1742 Janet, only child of Robert Marshall, Merchant and Burgess of Edinburgh, and was father of,
- 3d) William Wardlaw, *bap.* at Kinghorn on 8 August, 1745, and *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Robert Balfour-Ramsay of Balbirnie and Whitehill. He was father of,
- 3e) Robert Wardlaw, was served heir to his uncles Andrew Balfour or Ramsay of Whitehill and George Balfour in the lands of Gourmont and others, on 12 May 1823. He *m.* on 16 April, 1811, to Anne, daughter of Alexander Lindsay, 6<sup>th</sup> Earl of Balcarres, *d.* on 11 April 1837, and had issue,
- 3f) Robert Balfour Wardlaw-Ramsay of Whitehill, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the lands of Powguild, and others, on 8 March 1842.
- 3d) Robert Wardlaw, *bap.* at Kinghorn on 29 December 1751.
- 3d) Elizabeth Wardlaw, *bap.* at Kinghorn on 3 May 1744.
- 3d) Janet Wardlaw, *bap.* at Kinghorn on 6 March 1747.

**SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 4<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, in whose favour a Precept for his infeftment in the lands and barony of Pitreavie as heir to Henry Wardlaw of Pitreavie, “his father brother son,” was issued on 16 May 1655.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* on 29 March, 1646, his cousin Elizabeth, daughter and heiress of Sir Henry Wardlaw, 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet of Pitreavie, and whom he succeeded as heir-male. They had a charter from his father for the lands of Balmule, and others, on 14 June, 1647. He *d.* on 4 March 1680,<sup>3</sup> and was father of :

1. Sir Henry Wardlaw, 5<sup>th</sup> Baronet of Pitreavie, (*see below*).
2. Margaret Wardlaw, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 26 March, 1647, and *m.* at Dunfermline on 6 March, 1663, James Kinninmont of that Ilk.<sup>4</sup> They had issue.
3. Christian Wardlaw, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 11 July, 1650.
4. Elizabeth Wardlaw, *bap.* on 25 June, 1658, and *m.* at Edinburgh on 4 March, 1681, Sir Alexander Lindsay of Evelick.<sup>5</sup> They had issue.

**SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF PITREAVIE**, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 19 October 1648, and is styled as only son to Sir Henry Wardlaw of Pitreavie in an assignation in his favour by his father, dated 14 April 1674, of a Bond for 2000 merks Scots which had previously been granted by Sir George Preston of Valleyfield, to John Wardlaw of

Abden, who thereafter assigned it to Sir Henry, senior.<sup>1</sup> He succeeded his father on his death in 1680 and was retoured his heir on 30 April, 1680.<sup>2</sup> He *m.* at Dunfermline on 24 April, 1673, Elizabeth, daughter of John Skene of Halyards,<sup>3</sup> *d.* prior to February of 1698, when his eldest son Henry, was served his heir, and was father of :

1. **SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 6<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 15 February, 1674, and was retoured heir to his father in the barony of Pitreavie on 24 February, 1698,<sup>4</sup> and to his grandfather, Sir Henry Wardlaw, in those of Balmule and others, on 23 May 1701. He *m.* on 13 June, 1696, Elizabeth, daughter of Sir Charles Halkett of Pitfirrane,<sup>5</sup> and *d.* in August of 1712. He was father of :

1a) **SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 7<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *b.* on 30 April 1705, succeeded his father on his death in 1712, and *dsp* at his lodgings in Dunfermline in November of 1730. Reports of the time put the cause of his early demise down to “an Indisposition, which ‘tis thought he contracted at Gibraltar Anno 1728, when the Spaniards laid close siege to that Place ; he having undergone all the Hardships of that Siege. After the Treaty of Seville he returned to London, where not meeting with the Encouragement due to a youth of his exceeding Merit, he came north to his Native Country, and remained here till June last ; when he set out for a second time, with his cousin Collonel Anstruther, for Gibraltar ; but turn’d so bad on the Wy to London, that he was obliged to return to Scotland.”<sup>6</sup>

2. **SIR GEORGE WARDLAW, 8<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 3 June, 1675, was retoured heir to his brother Sir Henry in the lands of Balmule on 2 June, 1732, and succeeded his nephew in the Baronetcy. He *m.* on 12 September, 1706, to Alison, daughter of Mr. Robert Bennet, Minister of Jedburgh,<sup>1</sup> and was father of :

2a) **SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 9<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *bap.* on 29 June, 1708, succeed his father and *dsp* in 1739.

3. John Wardlaw, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 12 July, 1677, and concerning whom an advertisement was published on 30<sup>th</sup> July 1728, that he “has been abroad above these 30 years, hath died in some of the Plantations, and he has four Brethren and one Sister alive ; these are desiring any who knows the Place where the said John hath died, and to what Effects he has left, may give Information of the same to William Black, Clerk to the Regality of Dunfermline, within the County of Fife, Scotland.”<sup>2</sup>

4. **SIR DAVID WARDLAW OF CRAIGHOUSE AND 10<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 18 August, 1678, and succeeded his nephew. He *m.* firstly, Jean, daughter of James Rolland of Craighouse, by whom he had issue. He *m.* secondly at Dunfermline on 8 August, 1737, to Jean, eldest daughter of Mr. James Mercer of Hillhead,<sup>3</sup> (*c/m* 18 August, 1737), and was father of :

4a) **SIR HENRY WARDLAW, 11<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, had a dispositon from Jean Rolland, his mother, to him and David Wardlaw, his son, on 17 August 1730, and *m.* Janet Taylor. He *d.* in February of 1782 and was father of,

4b) **SIR DAVID WARDLAW, 12<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, succeeded his father and *m.* Margaret, daughter of Andrew Simpson of Broomhead. He *d.* on 13 April 1793, and was father of :

4c) **SIR JOHN WARDLAW, 13<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, *b.* in 1757, succeeded his father and *m.* on 17 December 1787, to Jean, daughter of Charles Mitchell of Piteadie.<sup>4</sup> He *d.* at Dunfermline on 1 January 1823, aged 66 years,<sup>5</sup> and was father of,

4d) Margaret Forbes Wardlaw, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 29 September 1788.

4d) Jane Wardlaw, *b.* on 9 November 1793, and was served heir to her grandfather Sir David Wardlaw on 19 March 1823. She *m.* at Culross

on 1 July, 1827, Andrew Clerk Wellwood of Comrie, and *d.* on 23 May, 1855.

4c) Henry Wardlaw, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 5 January 1743.

He went abroad some years ago in the navy.”<sup>4</sup>

their nephew Robert Wardlaw, son of their deceased bother Patrick, should make contact with them. She *d.* at Edinburgh on 7 May 1770.<sup>1</sup>

**MR. WILLIAM WARDLAW**, *bap.* at Dunfermline on 21 November 1680, and was apprenticed to James Wardlaw, Stationer in Edinburgh, on 19 July 1698.<sup>2</sup> He afterwards settled in Dollar and with his sister, Lady Woodend, is named in connection with the settling of their deceased brother, Patrick's estate following his death in December 1748. He *m.* Mary Bisset and was father of :

**ALEXANDER WARDLAW**, *m.* Margaret Campbell and was father of :

1. **SIR WILLIAM WARDLAW, 14<sup>TH</sup> BARONET OF PITREAVIE**, succeeded to the Baronetcy as heir male to his "remote cousin," Sir John Wardlaw, and to whom he was retoured heir on 22 September 1823.
