

WINRAM

OF RATHO

JAMES WIRNAM IN RATHO, is styled as one of the portioners of the lands of Ratho in a Precept for a charter of confirmation of a grant by Sir John Stirling of Keir to Gilert Lauder, Burgess of Edinburgh, and Isobel Mauchane, his spouse, of six bovats of land in Ratho, dated 12 October 1535.¹ It is probable that he was father of;

1. Mr. Robert Winram of Ratho, named in his brother John's charter for the lands of Craigton and Lumbo, in 1572. He was father of,
 - 1a) An eldest son who identity has not yet been established.
 - 1a) John Winram of Craigton, named in the remainder of a charter by his uncle John Winram for the lands of Craigton and Lumbo, in the regality of St. Andrews, on 16 April 1572, and for which he had a charter of confirmation Robert, Commendator of St. Andrews, on 4 October 1582.² He had the gift of a pension from the fruits of St. Andrews from Robert, Commendator of St. Andrews, on 13 June 1583, and is then styled as "brother son" to John Winram, Superintendent of Fife.³ He disposed these lands to John Wemyss of Cuthillhill on 26 April 1602⁴
2. Mr. John Winram, was Prior of Portmoak and Superintendent of Fife and Strathearn and on 16 April 1572, he had a charter on his own resignation for the lands of Craigton and Lumbo to himself and Margaret Stewart, his wife, in liferent, and to Mr. Robert Winram, third son of James Winram in Gogarmylne, and his heirs heritably, which failing, by John Winram, second son of Mr. Robert Winram of Ratho.⁵ He *m.* Margaret, natural daughter of Alexander Stewart, Bishop of Moray, (she was widow of John Aytoun, 2nd of Kinnaldie, by whom she had issue).
3. James Winram in Gogarmylne, *m.* Margaret Lauder and had their escheat goods gifted to their son George on 27 July 1569, for not having completed a contract of marriage between themselves

and their son James on the one part, and Robert Hamilton of Briggis, and Helen Hamilton on the other.¹ He was father of,

3a) James Winram, resided at the Dene, in Edinburgh, *m.* Helen, daughter of sister of Robert Hamilton of Briggis, (she *m.* secondly, by 27 July 1569, John Moubray, and thirdly, by 1 December 1572, to Robert Bruce of Binning), and *d.* by 27 July 1569, having had issue :

3b) Elizabeth Winram,

3b) Margaret Winram,

3b) Cristine Winram, all of whom entered into a contract with their mother dated 1 December 1572.²

3a) George Winram, styled as brother to the deceased James Winram in the Dene when he had a gift of the escheat goods of his parents on 27 July 1569. He was put to the horn on 12 November 1582, and his escheat gifted to James Bellenden, son of James Bellenden of Pendreich, the following day.³

3a) Mr. Robert Winram, was a Notary Public and is styled as third son of James Winram in Gogarmylne when included in the charter by his uncle Mr. John Winram, Superintendent of Fife and Strathearn, for the lands of Craigton and Lumbo, in Fife, dated 16 April 1572. He *dsp* with his brother George being his heir.
