DAVID DE WINTON OF ANDATE, *m.* Janet Keith with whom he had a charter from John Stewart, Earl of Buchan, for the lands of Andate, in the sheriffdom of Aberdeen, which was confirmed under the Great Seal on 1434.¹ He *d.* by 1456, and was father of :

JOHN WINTON OF ANDATE, succeeded his father and had Sasine for the lands of Andate and Drummonderinloch in 1456.² He *d.* in about 1464 and was father of,

RANALD WINTON OF ANDATE, succeeded his father and had Sasine for the lands of Andate, Drummonderinloch and others in 1464.³ He was witness to a charter by George Gordon, Earl of Huntly, of the lands of Balmure, and others, in the Sheriffdom of Aberdeen, to Sir Alexander Dunbar of Westfield, dated 16 July 1472,⁴ and was father of,

ALEXANDER WINTON OF ANDATE, succeeded his father and sold part of his lands of Tulliechettill to James Reidheugh, personal Household Servant to King James IV. on 28 January, 1502. He disposed the remainder of his lands of Tulliechettill and those of Malaranach to this James Reidheugh on 10 May, 1507, and which James also acquired his lands of Culiny and Andate, in the Sheriffdom of Aberdeen, by way of apprisement for which he had a charter of confirmation under the Great Seal on 21 July, 1509, and had his shadow-half lands apprised by Malcolm Drummond of Meggar on 9 November, 1503. He *d.* by 6 February, 1516, and was father of,

1. Elizabeth Winton, the gift of the ward of whom, with her sister Margaret, and the lands of Cochlachrie, Andate and Drummonderinloch previously pertaining to their deceased father was granted by under the Privy Seal of King James V. to James Stewart of Ryland, on 6 February,
