

HALDANE

OF GLENEAGLES

1. **BERNARD DE HAUDEN**, possessed the lands of Hauden, or Haldane, and was witness to a charter by King Alexander II. confirming previous grants made to the monks of Kelso Abbey, dated 20 April a.r. 8 [1206].¹ He *dsp* soon after, being succeeded by his nephew and namesake.
2. **BRIEN**, a person of some note but of unknown parentage who is named in a grant by Bernard, his son, of ten acres of lands of Hauden to Kelso Abbey. He was father of :
 - 2a) Bernard de Hauden, (*see below*).

BERNARD DE HAUDEN, succeeded his uncle in the lands of Hauden and is styled as his nephew and heir when he confirmed charters made by this uncle to Kelso Abbey in 1207x1222.² He is styled as “filius Brien” when he granted a carucate of land in his town of Hauden to Kelso Abbey³ and granted ten acres of his lands of Hauden to the Monks of Kelso in perpetual alms for the welfare of himself and Margaret, his wife, and King William, dated circa 1220.⁴ He had issue :

ROGER DE HAUDEN, had a charter under the Great Seal of King William I. for the lands of Frandie, in Glendevon, granted between the years 1190x1199⁵ and is in all probability identical to the Roger who is styled as grandson to Bernard de

Hauden when witness to a charter by this Bernard to the Monks of Kelso Abbey dated circa 1220.¹ He stated to have been father of :

SIR AYMER DE HALDANE, 1ST OF GLENEAGLES, was witness to a grant by John, so of Hugh de Revenden, to the Monks of Kelso of parts of his lands of Loris and Revenden, dated 1257, and gave homage to King Edward I. of England at Berwick-on-Tweed on 28 August, 1296.² He is generally considered to have been father of :

1. Sir Simon de Haldane, 2nd of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. William de Haldane,
3. David de Haldane,
4. Gilbert de Haldane. He and his brothers, William and David, were substitute heirs to their elder brother Simon de Haldane in the lands of Bardrill in 1312.³

SIR SIMON DE HALDANE, 2ND OF GLENEAGLES, gave homage to King Edward I. at Berwick on 28 August 1296 and had a charter from Sir John de Logy for the lands of Bardrill in 1312. He *m.* Matilda de Arnot from whom he had a charter for her half of the quarter lands of Kepdowrie and Herdas, in the Earldom of Lennox, dated 1305x1310,⁴ and *d.* in around 1338. He father of :

SIR BERNARD DE HALDANE, 3RD OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded and exchanged the lands of Jackton, in the Sheriffdom of Lanark, for those of Bardrill with Sir John de Maxwell of Pollock, on 6 May 1388.⁵ He *d.* in 1401⁶ and was father of :

1. Sir John de Haldane, 4th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. Matilda de Haldane, *m.* Peter Mercer, (Dispensation dated 19 May 1410¹).

SIR JOHN DE HALDANE, 4TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded on his father's death in 1401 and was served heir to him in the lands of Kepdowrie and Ardas on 2 October 1425.² He *m.* Christian, daughter of Sir Thomas Erskine of that Ilk, by his second wife Janet, only child and heiress of Sir Edward Keith, Marischal of Scotland, by his wife Christian, daughter of Sir John de Menteith, Lord of Arran, Strathgartney and Knapdale, and *d.* on 20 November 1456.³ He was father of :

BERNARD DE HALDANE, 5TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded his father on his death in 1456 and was served heir to him in the lands of Gleneagles on 9 April 1457.⁴ He *m.* Katherine, daughter of Sir William Seaton of that Ilk, *d.* in 1472 and was father of :

1. Sir John Haldane, 6th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. Patrick Haldane, 1st of Wester Keilour, is styled as brother to Sir John Haldane of Gleneagles when he acted as bailie to a charter by this brother in favour of James Haldane his eldest son and heir for the lands of Bardrill on 20 December, 1481, and obtained the lands of Keilour. (*see Haldane of Keilour*).

SIR JOHN HALDANE, 6TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded his father and had a charter of confirmation under the Great Seal for the quarter-part of the Earldom of Lennox on 28 March 1473.⁵ He had a further charter under the Great Seal for his lands of Gleneagles, Bardrill-Haldane, in Strathearn, the north-part of the lands of Dysart, in the Earldom of Fife, and the lands of Knockhill, Ballarde, Balboure,

Kepdowry, Carbeth, Camquhell and Argess, in the sheriffdom of Stirling, on his own resignation into the King's hands for re-infetment and were then erected into the free barony of Gleneagles.¹ He *m.* by 6 October 1459, to Agnes, daughter and coheirress of Murdoch Menteith of Rusky, (she was sevred heir to her father in the lands of Ardeonaig on 27 April 1473 and *d.* in 1477), when they were infet in his lands of Cairnquarter,² and *d.* in July of 1493.³ He was father of :

1. Sir James Haldane, 7th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. George Haldane, was a witness to a charter by William Drummond of Auchrek for the lands of Auchrek, in the sheriffdom of Menteith, in favour of Sir James Haldane of Gleneagles on 16 January 1501, being then styled as brother to that Sir James.

SIR JAMES HALDANE, 7TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the barony of Gleneagles on 1 October 1493.⁴ He became one of the heirs to the Earldom of Lennox by right of his mother and was served heir to Duncan, Earl of Lennox, on 24 May 1490.⁵ This was disputed by the other heirs and at length a compromise was reached. On 29 July 1498, he had a charter confirming a grant made in his favour by Mathew, Earl of Lennox, of the lands of Culzemore, Rosmukrath, Lurglorne, Killedin, Drummakill, Kateris, Fenekintenand, Barquois, Blarenahill, Scheneglace, Ladrисbeg, Boturchis, in the Earldom of Lennox, in exchange for his quarter-part of the Earldom of Lennox.⁶ He *m.* firstly, Katherine, daughter of Colin Campbell, 1st Earl of Argyll, secondly by 20 December 1481, to Christian, daughter of William, 2nd Lord Graham, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, to Sir Thomas Maule of Panmure, who was then

widow of Elizabeth, daughter of David Rollo of Ballachie), when they had a charter from his father for the lands of Bardrill.¹ He *d.* in 1503² and had issue :

1. Sir John Haldane, 8th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. Gilbert Haldane, was appointed Tutor to his nephew, Sir James Haldane, on the death of his elder brother in 1513 and is styled as such in a Sasine in favour of his nephew John Haldane for the lands of Gleneagles on 12 January 1514.³ He is styled as Vicar of Dalry in 1518.
3. William Haldane, became a Burgess of Perth and was one of the Tutors to John Haldane of Gleneagles in 1518.
4. George Haldane of Kippen, mentioned as one of the joint Tutors to John Haldane of Gleneagles in 1518.

SIR JOHN HALDANE, 8TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded his father on his death in 1503, and was served heir to him in the lands of Gleneagles and half of Ardeonaig on 1 July 1505.⁴ He had a confirmation under the Great Seal for the lands of Calzemore, the Ross, Lurglorne, Killedene, the middle-part of Drummakill, Lateris with the Mill thereof, Fenykintenand, Barquhois, Barnahill, Scheneglas, Ladrисbeg with the Mill, Bothurches, Over and Nether Trenbeg, Knockoure, the Croft, Barlosky, Ladrismore, Auchinkerachis, the Isle of Ross, Durinch, Ylindearg and the quarter-part of the fishing rights on Loch Lomond, all lying in the Sheriffdom of Dunbarton, the lands of Ardeonaig, Sokkoch, Fynglen, the Hauch, Kerre, the Mill and Mill Lands of Ardeonaig, with the patronage of the church of Ardeonaig, and the fishing rights on Loch Tay, all in the Sheriffdom of Perth, to be held by himself of the Crown and the middle-part of the lands of Rusky with the Manor to himself and Marjorie Lawson, his spouse,

on 20 January 1509.¹ He *m.* Marjorie, daughter of Sir John Lawson of Humbie, (she survived him and *m.* secondly to Luke Stirling, younger son of Sir William Stirling, 1st of Keir, and thirdly, to Robert Menteith of Wester Kerse), and was *k.* at the battle of Flodden on 9 September 1513. He was father of :

1. Sir James Haldane, 9th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Haldane, was appointed constable of Edinburgh by 1 September 1565 when he had a charter from John, Earl of Mar, of an annualrent of 40 bolls of oats from the lands of Ferryton. He was father of,
 - 2a) Archibald Haldane, who, apparently, is identical to the person of that name who witnessed the marriage contract between, Helen Haldane and Alexander Lindsay, in 1613.²
 - 2a) Christian Haldane, who is included in a charter by John, Earl of Mar, granting to her father 40 bolls of oats from the lands of Ferryton dated 1 September 1565,³ and had *m.* by 26 May 1572 to Robert Haldane of Balwill when they are included in a reversion by her father over the lands of Mungwalls.⁴

SIR JAMES HALDANE, 9TH OF GLENEAGLES, was retoured heir to his father on 29 November, 1513,⁵ and had a grant of the lands of Portnellanmor and Ardoch under the Great Seal on 18 June, 1546. He *m.* Margaret, daughter of Robert, 3rd Lord Erskine (*c/m* at Alloa on 14 December 1518⁶), *d.* in February of 1547 and was father of :

1. John Haldane, 10th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. Richard Haldane, was appointed Constable of Stirling Castle and was a witness to his nephew, George Haldane's marriage contract in 1572.¹ He *d.* in November of 1606² and had issue :
 - 2a} Ninian Haldane,
 - 2a} Humphrey Haldane,
 - 2a} Agnes Haldane, *m.* William Lindsay.
3. Robert Haldane of Balwill, had acquired the lands of Balwill by 19 April 1573 when he witnessed his nephew, George Haldane's marriage contract.³ On 10 June 1580 he was witness to a charter by William, Commendator of Paisley, of certain lands in favour of David Erskine, Commendator of Dryburgh,⁴ and was a witness to the Sasine following marriage contract of his nephew, John Haldane of Gleneagles, and Isobel Home on 11 January 1574. He *m.* his cousin Christian, daughter of Archibald Haldane, Constable of Edinburgh Castle, and had issue,
 - 3a} John Haldane, was a witness with his father, to the above cited charter in favour of David Erskine in 1574. He *d.* prior to 2 October 1595 and was father of,
 - 3b} Thomas Haldane, was served heir to his grandfather, Robert Haldane of Balwill, in an annualrent of £20 from the lands of Boghall on 2 October 1595 and is then styled as eldest son of the deceased John Haldane, heir of Robert Haldane of Balwill.⁵
 - 3a} Margaret Haldane, *m.* at Stirling, on 27 January 1590, to Patrick Home, 3rd of Argaty,⁶ and had issue.

4. Margaret Haldane, *m.* Mr. Henry Foulis, son and apparent heir of Mr James Foulis of Colinton, and as his promised wife, he granted her a charter for his lands and barony of Colinton which was confirmed under the Great Seal on 22 June 1545.¹ She *d.* in 1578 having had issue.

JOHN HALDANE, 10TH OF GLENEAGLES, *b.* around 1524 and succeeded his father on his death in 1513, being served heir to him on 29 March 1547.² He *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Sir John Lundy of that Ilk, to whom he granted a charter for the liferent of the lands of the Mill of Rusky, the middle-part of the lands of Lanerkynniss with the turret and tortalice there, and the lands of Over and Nether Auchreg on 8 December 1563,³ *d.* in 1564⁴ and was father of :

1. **GEORGE HALDANE, 11TH OF GLENEAGLES**, succeeded his father, was retoured his heir in December of 1563, and had a charter of confirmation for the lands of Gleneagles with the turret and fortalice on 8 December, 1563.⁵ He *m.* Janet, daughter of William Cunningham, 6th Earl of Glencairn, (*c/m* at Stirling on 15 February 1572.⁶ She survived him and *m.* secondly, Thomas Kirkpatrick, son and heir of Roger Kirkpatrick of Closeburn, the marriage contract for which is dated 4 September 1577.⁷ She also survived that husband and *m.* thirdly, to John Fergusson of Craigdarroch), and *dsp* in 1574,⁸ being succeeded by his immediate younger brother John.

2. John Haldane, 12th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).

3. James Haldane, acted as bailie to his brother John Haldane of Gleneagles in his sasine following contract of marriage on 11 January 1574.¹
4. Joseph Haldane, had a charter from Thomas Anderson in Carnebo for the lands of Briglands, in Strathearn, on 13 March 1590² which he disposed to Mr. John Halliday of Tulliebole who had a confirmation on 8 March 1609.³ He was witness to a charter by James Haldane of Gleneagles granting the lands of Carwhin and others to James Campbell of Lawers dated 8 June 1609, and is then styled as uncle to the granter.⁴ He had a Tack of the parsonage of Aberfoyle assigned to him by Thomas Graham of Boquhapple on 28 June 1610 which he afterwards conveyed to William, Earl of Menteith, by contract dated 21 March 1613.⁵ He *m.* Euphemia Schaw.
5. David Haldane, who consented to a charter by James Haldane of Gleneagles by which he granted the lands of Ardronnen, Carwhin and others to James Campbell of Lawers on 8 June 1609, and is then styled as his uncle.⁶
6. Margaret Haldane, *m.* David Erskine, Commendator of Dryburgh Abbey and Prior of Inchmahome, (natural son of Robert, Master of Erskine, eldest son and heir of John, 4th Lord Erskine. David *d.* on 28 May 1611), and *d.* on 13 January 1619.⁷ They had issue.
7. Isabel Haldane, *m.* Sir Patrick Hepburn of Luffness, (*c/m* 31 March 1565⁸), and *d.* on 17 August 1597. They had issue.
8. Elizabeth Haldane, *m.* Philip Nisbet of that Ilk, (*c/m* at Lanark on 11 March 1582⁹), and had issue.

9. Beatrix Haldane, *m.* Robert Colville of Cleish, (*c/m* at Cleish on 10 October 1599. He *d.* in January of 1634), and had issue.
10. Jean Haldane, *m.* Sir George Home of Wedderburn, (*c/m* at Edinburgh 15 January 1577-8.¹ He *d.* in November of 1616), and had issue.
11. Helen Haldane, *m.* Henry Stirling, 2nd of Ardoch, (he *d.* in February of 1628), and had issue.

JOHN HALDANE, 12TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded his brother, George, in the lands of Gleneagles and was served heir to him on 8 November 1574.² He *m.* firstly, Isobel, daughter of David Home of Wedderburn, (*c/m* 12 December 1573), to whom he granted a charter for the lands of Mains of Gleneagles with the Manor and Mill there, Cairnquarter and Over and Nether Carseburn on 11 January 1574.³ He *m.* secondly, Barbara, daughter of James Johnstone of Elphinstone, (she survived him and *m.* secondly, by 22 May 1611, to David Home of Godscroft), and *d.* in 1591 having had issue :

1. Sir James Haldane, 13th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. Isobel Haldane, *m.* by 29 April 1609, to Sir William Edmonstone, 6th of Duntreath, when they granted a charter for the lands of Busbie in favour of James Edmonstone of Newton. They had issue.
3. Jean Haldane, *m.* James Colville, brother of John Colville, Commendator of Culross, (*c/m* 2 June 1611⁴).
4. Helen Haldane, *m.* Alexander Lindsay of Canterland, second son of Sir David Lindsay of Edzell, (*c/m* 6 May 1613.⁵ He was widow of Jean, daughter of James Murray of Pardewis, whom he had *m.* on 1 January 1610) . They had issue.

5. Margaret Haldane, *m.* Sir John Home of Blackadder, and had issue.
6. Lillias Haldane, was a child by her father's second wife and with her mother, Barbara Johnstone, and sister, Martha, she renounced the lands of Darnchester upon payment to them of redemption money, to Sir George Home of Wedderburn on 22 May 1611.¹
7. Martha Haldane, was a child by her father's second wife. She *m.* by 18 July 1627, to Colonel Henry Bruce, and *d.* on 7 June 1665, having had issue.

SIR JAMES HALDANE, 13TH OF GLENEAGLES, succeeded his father and was served heir to him in the lands of Gleneagles on 3 October 1592,² with Sasine being on 18 April 1583.³ He *m.* in 1600, Margaret, daughter of Sir John Moray, 1st Earl of Tullibardine, (she *d.* in December of 1617⁴), *d.* in 1624 and was father of :

1. Sir John Haldane, 14th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. James Haldane, was granted a commission by the Privy Council to travel abroad in 1620, and attained the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel in the army. He was *k.* at Bois-le-Duc in 1629.
3. William Haldane,
4. Robert Haldane, *d.* on 12 March 1670.
5. Mungo Haldane, served as a Lieutenant-Colonel in the army and *m.* Marjorie, daughter of William Edmonstone of Calentoyes.
6. David Haldane, *d.* on 4 March 1701, aged 86 years.
7. Agnes Haldane, *m.* Andrew Fraser, 2nd Lord Fraser, (*c/m* July of 1634⁵), *d.* on 24 June, 1640, and had issue.
8. Katherine Haldane, *m.* Robert Napier of Kilmahew, (*c/m* 25 April 1626), and had issue.

9. Margaret Haldane, *m.* on 1 April 1630, to James Stirling of Auchyle,¹ and had issue.
10. Annabella Haldane, *m.* James Wood of Balbegno, with whom she resigned the lands of Fettercairn, and others, in favour of James Scott of Logie, Provost of Montrose, on 4 July 1642.
11. Christian Haldane, *b.* on 21 January 1593 and *m.* Mr. John Murray, Minister of Strathmiglo, younger son of William Murray, 6th of Ochertyre, (he *d.* on 30 October 1653²). She *dsp* on 8 October 1653.

SIR JOHN HALDANE, 14TH OF GLENEAGLES, *b.* in 1601, succeeded his father on his death in 1624 and was served heir to him in the lands and barony of Gleneagles on 5 November 1625,³ with Sasine being on 17th following.⁴ He was *k.* at the battle of Dunbar in 1650, having *m.* firstly, Catherine, sister of John, 1st Earl of Wemyss, (*c/m* 18 August 1624), by whom he was father of :

1. **JOHN HALDANE, 15TH OF GLENEAGLES**, *b.* in 1625, succeeded his father on his death in 1650 and was served heir to him on 3 March 1653.⁵ He had Sasine for the lands of Gleneagles on 26 October 1653,⁶ and *d.* unmarried in 1667, being succeeded by his half-brother, Mungo, as heir male.
2. Jean Haldane, *m.* Colonel Robert Halkett and had issue.
3. Marie Haldane, *m.* at Edinburgh on 22 April 1658, to David Brodie of Pitgavenie.⁷
4. Isabel Haldane, *m.* Sir Henry Stirling, 1st Baronet of Ardoch, (he *d.* in February of 1669), by whom she had issue.

He *m.* secondly, Margaret, daughter of Simon Fraser, 7th Lord Lovat, (*c/m* 22 December 1634. She was widow of Sir Robert Arbuthnott of that Ilk), to whom he granted a liferent charter to herself and Mungo Haldane, their eldest son, of the lands of Lanrick and others, on 2 February 1637.¹ By her he was father of :

5. Mungo Haldane, 16th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
6. Patrick Haldane, 1st of Lanrick, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Lanrick, Rusky and others, on 11 December 1668² and had issue, (*see Haldane of Lanrick*).
7. Anna Haldane, *bap.* on 8 June 1637.

MUNGO HALDANE, 16TH OF GLENEAGLES, *bap.* at Kilmadock on 10 March 1636 and succeeded to the lands of Gleneagles on the death of his half brother, John, in 1667, in which he was infeft on 7 February 1668.³ He *d.* in May of 1685,⁴ having *m.* firstly, Anne, daughter of John Grant of Lurg, (*she d.* in June of 1662⁵), by whom he was father of :

1. John Haldane, 17th of Gleneagles, (*see below*).
2. James Haldane, *bap.* on 4 December 1658.
3. David Haldane of Aberuthven, *bap.* on 24 May 1662 and had a liferent of the lands of Aberuthven from his brother, John Haldane of Gleneagles. He *m.* in 1685 to Mary, daughter of Robert Graham, *d.* in December of 1738 and was father of :

3a} John Haldane, 2nd of Aberuthven, *b.* in 1687 and *m.* Anne, daughter of David Ross of Inverchasley, (*c/m* 29 October 1726¹). He *d.* in January of 1736² and had issue :

3b} Patrick Haldane,

3b} David Haldane, served as a Captain in the 42nd Regiment and was present at Ticonderago in 1758. He had a grant of 5,000 acres in the province of New York in 1765 and settled there.

3b} Peter Haldane, *bap.* on 27 June 1727.

3b} Elizabeth Haldane, who is mentioned with her brother, David, in their father's Testament.

3a} Patrick Haldane, *b.* in around 1685.

3a} Mungo Haldane, *b.* in around 1696 and *m.* a woman by the name of Elizabeth. He was buried at Bath Abbey on 11 October 1777, and was father of,

3b} Robert Haldane, *bap.* at London on 19 October 1748 and *d.* young.
