

# MURRAY

## OF CRINGLETIE

**ALEXANDER MURRAY, 2<sup>ND</sup> OF CRINGLETIE**, was a younger son of Sir Alexander Murray, 2<sup>nd</sup> Baronet of Blackbarony, and succeeded his immediate elder brother, John, in the lands of Cringletie on his death without issue. He *m.* at Edinburgh, on 23 December 1684, Susan, daughter of John Douglas of Mains,<sup>1</sup> and by her he was father of :

1. Alexander Murray, 3<sup>rd</sup> of Cringletie, (*see below*).
2. Archibald Murray, 1<sup>st</sup> of Murrayfield, was apprenticed to Robert Campbell W.S., on 21 January 1712, acquired the lands of Nisbet the name of which he changed to Murrayfield. He had issue. (*see Murray of Murrayfield*).
3. John Murray, *b.* on 17 August 1698.
4. William Murray, *b.* on 8 July 1705 and to whom his father granted a Bond of Provision on 23 February 1711.<sup>2</sup>
5. Margaret Murray, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 15 July 1702 and *m.* James Justice, eldest son of James Justice of Justice Hall.
6. Christian Murray, *bap.* at Edinburgh on 30 August 1703.

**ALEXANDER MURRAY, 3<sup>RD</sup> OF CRINGLETIE**, succeeded his father and *m.* on 3 April 1718, to Catherine, daughter of Sir Robert Stewart, 1<sup>st</sup> Baronet of

**ALEXANDER MURRAY, 4<sup>TH</sup> OF CRINGLETIE**, served as Lieutenant-Colonel and served with General Wolfe in America during which he had the command of the Grenadiers at the sieges of Louisbourg and Quebec. He succeeded his father in the lands of Cringletie on his death in 1755 and was served heir to him on 9 February 1757.<sup>10</sup> He *m.* Marion, daughter of Sir James Stewart of Goodtrees, (c/m

at Halifax, Nova Scotia, on 30 December 1756<sup>1</sup>), *d.* at Marintico in March of 1762 and was father of :

1. **ALEXANDER MURRAY, 5<sup>TH</sup> OF CRINGLETIE**, succeeded his father and was served heir to him on 25 November 1763.<sup>2</sup> He *dsp* at Cringletie, on Saturday 22 June 1822<sup>3</sup> and was succeeded by his brother, James.

**JAMES WOLFE MURRAY, 6<sup>TH</sup> OF CRINGLETIE**, *b.* on 5 January 1759, succeeded his brother, Alexander, in the lands of Cringletie on his death in 1822 and was appointed a Lord of Session under the title of Lord Cringletie. He *m.* at East Acton, Middlesex, on 7 April 1807, to Isabella, daughter of James Charles Edward Stuart Strange, H.E.I.C.S.,<sup>4</sup> (she *d.* at Paris, on 25 December 1847<sup>5</sup>), *d.* at his house in Charlotte Square, Edinburgh, on 29 May 1836<sup>6</sup> and was father of :

1. James Wolfe Murray of Cringletie, (*see below*).
2. Alexander Murray, *b.* on 27 July 1817, entered the army and was raised to Colonel of the 87<sup>th</sup> regiment. He *m.* at Monkstown, on 18 August 1853, to Eugenia Grace, eldest daughter of Lieutenant-Colonel Curtis,<sup>7</sup> and *dsp* at Brompton Crescent, London, on 24 December 1865.<sup>8</sup>
3. Thomas Andrew Lumsden Murray, *b.* on 1 March 1825 and entered the Royal Engineers in January of 1843. He was promoted to Lieutant-Colonel in July of 1867, and afterwards held various staff appointments, being raised to Major-

**JAMES WOLFE MURRAY OF CRINGLETIE**, *b.* on 11 May 1814, succeeded his father and was served heir to him on 26 June 1837<sup>8</sup>. He *d.* on 20 June 1890,<sup>9</sup> having *m.* firstly, at Mount Melville, on 25 May 1852, to Elizabeth, daughter of John White Melville of Strathkinness,<sup>10</sup> (she *d.* on 4 October 1857<sup>11</sup>), by whom he was father of :

*carrying went off and killed her. Lady Murray left her cottage, which is about 23 miles from Oban, on Friday evening, her intention apparently being to frighten off a herd of goats which had been damaging the garden. Within a few minutes of her departure a shot was heard, but no particular notice was taken of it. Later maids at the cottage, alarmed by the non-return of Lady Murray, went in search of her, and found her lying dead about 100 yards from the house with a gunshot wound in the head.*<sup>1</sup>

**SIR JAMES WOLFE MURRAY OF CRINGLETIE**, *b.* on 13 March 1853 and entered the Royal Artillery in 1872. He was appointed Colonel in 1899 and served in Ashanti in 1895, and in Natal in 1899-1900. He was Quartermaster-General in India 1903-04, Master-General of the Ordnance in 1904-07 and in command on the 9<sup>th</sup> (Secunderabad) Division in 1907-11. He *m.* on 14 May 1875, to Arabella, daughter of W. Bray, (she *d.* in 1900), *d.* at Cringletie, on Friday 17 October 1919<sup>2</sup> and was father of,

1. George Wolfe Murray, (*see below*).
2. James Wolfe Murray, *b.* on 9 June 1880, entered the Royal Navy and was raised to Captain. He was awarded the D.S.O., in 1919 for having *between the 16<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> August, 1918, at which time he was a Commander, displayed great resource in bringing the 12-pounder guns of H.M.S. Suffolk rapidly into action and showed an excellent example of coolness and bravery under fire during the battles in the Ussuri district.*<sup>3</sup> He *d.* at Mentone, on 16 November 1930.<sup>4</sup>

4. Grace Catherine Murray, *b.* on 9 March 1879 and *m.* at St. James's Church, Piccadilly, London, on Saturday 9 February 1901, to Captain Sholto W. Douglas, Royal Artillery.<sup>3</sup> She *d.* on 8 March 1942.

**GEORGE WOLFE MURRAY, OF MELDONFOOT**, *b.* on 27 June 1876 and became engaged in January of 1908, to marry Margaret, fourth daughter of Major Thorburn of Craigrne, but this does not appear to have been completed. He *m.* at Llanbedr, on 21 December 1910, to Katherine, daughter of Rev. Thomas Jones, of Llanbedr House, Crick Lowell,<sup>5</sup> *d.* on 31 January 1955 and was father of,
