

MACLEAN

OF KINGAIRLOCH

DONALD MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, who is named in the patronymics of his son, Hector, and his grandson, Donald, in 1612. He was father of,

HECTOR MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, was living in December of 1612 and *d.* by May of 1617. He was father of,

DONALD MAC EACHAN VC DONNELL MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, had a charter under the Great Seal for the lands of Kingairloch and numerous others on 14 December 1612, and is then styled son and heir to Hector MacDonnell MacLean of Kingairloch.¹ He had succeeded his father by 30 May 1617, when he is included in a list of those who had not paid their portions of the tax levied to pay for the King's marriage,² and was father of,

HECTOR MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded his father and *m.* in 1654, to Sarah, daughter of Hector MacLean of Lochbuy. He *d.* by September of 1675, and was father of,

DONALD MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded to the lands of Kingairloch and was retoured heir to his grandfather in various lands on 9 September 1675. He subscribed to lawburrows on 30 June 1709, not to harm Donald MacDougal of Ardmore, and was father of,

1. Lachlan MacLean of Kingairloch, (*see below*).
2. Hector MacLean, was *k.* at the battle of Killiecrankie, in July 1689.

3. Alexander MacLean,

LACHLAN MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded his father and *m.* Mary, daughter of MacLean of Lochbuie, (she *d.* in 1722). He was father of,

DONALD MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded his father and *d.* in May of 1726. He was father of,

1. Lachlan MacLean of Kingairloch, (*see below*).
2. John MacLean, styled as brother to Lachlan MacLean of Kingairloch when he granted a Bond to Frances Russell, Cherurgeon in Edinburgh, on 14 January 1735.¹

LACHLAN MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded his father and was served heir to him on 1 April 1732.² He *d.* in 1756, and was father of,

1. Hugh MacLean of Kingairloch, (*see below*).
2. John MacLean, who entered the army but killing an officer, he was forced to quit. He served as an officer in the MacLean battallion of the Jacobite army in 1745/46 and was *ksp* at the battle of Culloden.
3. Lachlan MacLean, was active in the '45 and was forced to afterwards flee for his safety, later settling in Rochester. He *d.* there in 1756.

HUGH MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded his father and to whom he was served heir on 15 February 1757.³ He *m.* Mary Stewart, *d.* on 25 February 1784,⁴ and was father of,

1. **DONALD MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH**, succeeded his father and was served heir to him on 5 May 1785.¹ He *m.* Ann, daughter of Hugh MacLean of Ardgour, and *dsp* at Kingierloch, on 14 March 1799.²
2. Murdoch MacLean, served as a Captain in the 2nd West India regiment and was *ksp* at St. Vincent.
3. Colin MacLean, entered the 37th Regiment as an Ensign and was raised to Lieutenant in May of 1793. He was *ksp* the following year at the battle of Tournay.
4. James MacLean, became a Planter in Jamaica and was *ksp* there in the wars with the Caribs.
5. **HECTOR MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH**, (*see below*).
6. Mary MacLean, *m.* Mr. Donald Skinner, Minister at Ardnamurchan, and had issue.
7. Margaret MacLean, *m.* Hugh Cameron, and had issue.
8. Jane MacLean, *m.* John MacCormick.
9. A daughter, *m.* Hugh Dunoon in Pictou.

HECTOR MACLEAN OF KINGAIRLOCH, succeeded his brother and was served heir to him on 31 March 1801.³ The estate being burdened with debts, he was compelled to sell to James Forbes and emigrated to Pictou, Nova Scotia, where he set up as a shopkeeper. He *m.* Harriet Elizabeth, daughter of Captain John Fraser, 82nd Regiment, *d.* at Pictou, Nova Scotia, on 28 April 1810⁴ and was father of,

1. Murdoch MacLean, (*see below*).
2. Simon MacLean, was a sea Captain and *m.* Mary Noonan. He is said to have *d.* in Australia, and was father of,

MURDOCH MACLEAN, was sheriff of the county of Guysborough, Nova Scotia, for a number of years and *m.* Elizabeth, daughter of Robert M. Cutler. He *d.* in April of 1865, and was father of,

- 1. Kenneth-John MacLean, *d.* unmarried, in 1873.
- 2. Robert Culter MacLean, *b.* in 1846, and settle at Lyne, Massachusetts. He *m.* at Swamscott, Massachussets, on 8 March 1909, to Etta Winslow, daughter of Levi Fillmore.
- 3. William Murdoch MacLean. settled at Everett, Middlesex County, in Massachusets, where he *d.* on 13 May 1919.¹
