

OGILVY

OF PITMOWES

DAVID OGILVY OF PITMOWES, third son of James, 5th Lord Ogilvy of Airlie, *m.* firstly, Martha, daughter of Patrick MacCalzeane of Cliftonhall, (*c/m* in 1588/9¹), and secondly, Nicholas, daughter of Patrick Guthrie of Pitmowes, (*c/m* 12 August 1599), with whom he had a charter for the lands of Easter and Wester Pitmowes from his father-in-law on 14 August 1599. He had issue :

1. Euphemia Ogilvy. She and her sister, Jean, were served heir to Martha MacCalzeane, their mother, on 6 May 1600.
2. Jean Ogilvy,
3. Euphemia Ogilvy. She and her sister, Anna, were served heir to Martha MacCalzean, their mother on 20 March, 1620.
4. Anna Ogilvy,
5. Patrick Ogilvy, had a charter for the lands of Pitmowes on the resignation of his parents and his maternal grandparents on 11 January 1603.
6. John Ogilvy of Pitmowes, (*see below*).
7. William Ogilvy, who was apprenticed to Patrick Trotter, Tailor in Edinburgh, on 17 December 1635.²
8. James Ogilvy,

JOHN OGILVY OF PITMOWES, to whom his brother, Patrick, assigned the lands of Pitmowes on 28 August 1624. He *d.* by March of 1650 and was father of,

1. John Ogilvy of Pitmowes, (*see below*).

2. Jean Ogilvy, *m.* David Drummond, fiar of Hollhill, (*c/m* 16 April 1658.¹ He *d.* in August of 1688), and had issue.

JOHN OGILVY OF PITMOWES, in favour of whom a precept of clare constat was issued for his infeftment in the lands of Pitmowes as heir to his father, dated 30 March 1650. He *d.* by December of 1669 and had issue.
